Hospitality, Door to God's Grace

I feel so welcome by my people that I am encouraged to do more things for the parish. I believe you too feel welcome in the parish and that encourages you to come together to things like this parish day. Hospitality that leads to wonderful friendship is much more precious and rewarding than the best pay pack you can get. Friendship is much more satisfying than the highest promotion we can aspire to in our job. Without offering hospitality to others and willingness to receive hospitality when it is offered, there is no friendship. Our human endeavour of hospitality is the start of our friendship with God.

Abraham was a wandering man who pitched his tent with his wife Sarah in a desert. When he saw a group of three travellers he invited them to his tent and offered a feast. Little did he know that these travellers were messengers of God. But his hospitality to them paid off. The messengers announced God's favour for him. His hospitality earned him Isaac, a son, even though he and his wife Sarah were well advanced in age. (Ref Genesis 18:1-10)

According to the Gospel of Luke, Jesus taught about the different dimensions of hospitality. In the story of the Good Samaritan who cared for the victim of violence, it was a call to offer hospitality to those who are in need. (Luke 10:25-37) When Luke wrote about Martha and Mary welcoming Jesus into their home in Bethany, it was about another dimension of hospitality. (Ref Luke 10:38-42)

Martha was no different to you and me in our best. A good friend always wants to put on a great spread for his guests. That is what Martha was doing. But Jesus pointed out to her that her sister Mary has chosen a nobler expression of hospitality, personal interaction and relationships. All our efforts of hospitality are to be directed towards greater personal relationships. This is true not just with our friends on earth, but also with God.

We can be very good with our charity and friendship works. But that is not enough. We can and we should make a personal relationship with God. Our personal prayers are ways of communicating with God. But the Holy Communion with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament of Eucharist is still better. This is a special privilege Jesus Christ has established for us. With such great intimacy with God we are enabled to call God our daddy (Abu). Luke asserts this by placing the teaching about the Lord's prayer immediately after telling us about the hospitality of Martha and Mary.

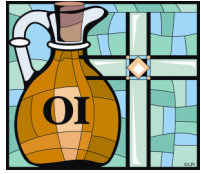
The training for hospitality starts at home. The bigger the family, the greater are the opportunities. A family with many children learn how to be hospitable to each other. Children depend on their parents and other adults in the family for the basic needs of food, shelter, and sense of security. The offering of these to them is also an exercise of hospitality. Similarly the elderly are looked after in their families, another form of hospitality. But in this age of smaller families and aged care facilities, the concept of hospitality within families is thinning down. Whilst the modern society takes better care of material welfare, it could be at the expense of family bonding.

The ministries and programs the parish offers are to help greater bonding between parishioners. Therefore the more you participate in the ministries and working groups the greater is the benefit for you and for the parish. The more we come together to celebrate, the closer we come to one another and to God. Our hospitality is our door to God's grace.

Invitation from CFC - Handmaids of the Lord, Christian Life Program

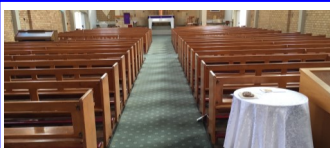

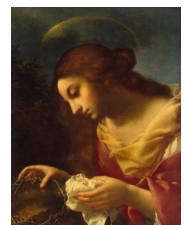
