First Reading

Dt 6:2-6

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

Second Reading

Heb 7:23-28

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the

heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel

Mk 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.'

Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

Love Neighbour, Glorify God



Jewish Bible is the first part of our Bible which we call Old Testament (or first testament). Jesus approved the teachings of the Jewish Bible (Torah) and said, “Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength”. The second is this: “You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these”. Living in Jerusalem I could see that the Jews of today also take this commandment seriously. But the question they find hard to grapple is how to practically express our love for God. It is not an easy one. There has been constant tension and conflict in Israel between Jews and Muslims because of their strong desire to honour and glorify God. Both these religions believe in God’s love which requires a human response of love in return. Yet the outcome does not reflect this aspect of Scriptural teaching.

It is not just in Israel we come with this kind of conflict. Perhaps in a different manner, many in our society too find struggle to find the best way of honouring God and reflecting his love for humanity. We know that trying to manufacture a sentiment of love for God is not the answer. Upholding human dignity in all our responses to political and social issues and context is the beginning of it. We should empathise with the paining refugees, struggling underclass of people around us, and the aimless brothers and sisters who require guidance and empowering. Next step is to work on an intimacy with God through our use of Scriptures and Sacraments, especially Eucharist. Let us glorify God and delight our fellow human beings. Thus let us make our own lives live to the fullest.

REFLECTIONS ON MARK 12:28-34

Historical context. Sacrifice

We know from the Old Testament that sacrifice was an important religious practice dating back to the foundations of Jewish faith. After the construction of the Temple in Jerusalem, sacrifice of birds and animals was practised there as the highest form of worship. With the destruction of the Temple in 70CE—about the time Mark’s gospel was written - temple worship and sacrifice came to an abrupt end. The entire nature of Judaism changed from a Temple- centred faith to a much more decentralised faith. In this week’s gospel, the gospel writer is projecting the reality of his time back into the scribe’s encounter with Jesus.

Living the Gospel. Love.

Jesus reminds us ‘You must love your neighbour as yourself’. There’s an unspoken, underlying idea here that is absolutely crucial. Before you can love your neighbour, you must first love yourself. To say that you love yourself today can imply a level of boastfulness or ego. However, what is required is a genuine love of self - an acceptance; a respect; a true valuing of self. Only then can we know how to treat others. When we ask ourselves how we would want to be treated it points us towards how we should treat others. What is summed up so simply by Jesus is a very tough ask!

Gospel Focus. First of all.

Jesus is asked which commandment is first and he provides two commandments as his answer. However, he doesn’t bundle them together as one overarching commandment - he very distinctly identifies them as first and second. Sometimes we can feel the way to express love for God is through demonstrating our love for other people in charitable or justice-focused actions. However, Jesus makes clear that the first commandment of all is the love of God with all our being - that God is worthy of love in God’s own right. Our love of God may inspire us to action for others but the first step is loving God for who God is.

Candlelight Mass for All Souls

On the last Friday of November (30th) there will be a candlelight Mass for all souls. At the Mass, all names of November Mass intentions will be read and prayed for.

You will be able to light a candle for your dear departed souls during the Mass. The candles sold for this occasion are electronic and will cost \$2 each. Since it is a candle light Mass, it will commence at 8.00 PM.

This year the Mass will be celebrated at St Peter Chanel Church, Berala.

A letter to the Corinthians by Pope St Clement I

Let us fix our gaze on the Father and Creator of the whole world, and let us hold on to his peace and blessings, his splendid and surpassing gifts. Let us contemplate him in our thoughts and with our mind's eye reflect upon the peaceful and restrained unfolding of his plan; let us consider the care with which he provides for the whole of his creation.

By his direction the heavens are in motion, and they are subject to him in peace. Day and night fulfil the course he has established without interfering with each other. The sun, the moon and the choirs of stars revolve in harmony at his command in their appointed paths without deviation. By his will the earth blossoms in the proper seasons and produces abundant food for men and animals and all the living things on it without reluctance and without any violation of what he has arranged.

Yet unexplored regions of the abysses and inexpressible realms of the deep are subject to his laws. The mass of the boundless sea, joined together by his ordinance in a single expanse, does not overflow its prescribed limits but flows as he commanded it. For he said: Thus far shall you come, and your waves will be halted here. The ocean, impassable for men, and the worlds beyond it are governed by the same edicts of the Lord.

The seasons, spring, summer, autumn and winter, follow one another in harmony. The quarters from which the winds blow function in due season without the least deviation. And the ever-flowing springs, created for our health as well as our enjoyment, unfailingly offer their breasts to sustain human life. The tiniest of living creatures meet together in harmony and peace. The great Creator and Lord of the universe commanded all these things to be established in peace and harmony, in his goodness to all, and in overflowing measure to us who seek refuge in his mercies through our Lord Jesus Christ; to him be glory and majesty for ever and ever. Amen.

Friday, 9 November - The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (Feast)



The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica The Lateran Basilica, the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, was dedicated to Christ the Saviour in the fourth century. The anniversary has been celebrated as a feast of the Latin Church on this date since the twelfth century. It honours the local Church of Rome as a link with earliest Christian tradition and as a sign of our communion in Christ.

Saturday, 10 November – St Leo the Great (Memorial)



Died in Rome on this day in 461. Elected pope in 440. Tried to protect the city from the devastation of barbarian invasion. His surviving letters illustrate the leadership and guidance he exercised as bishop of Rome toward other Churches in the West. Remembered for the clarity of his thought on the two natures of Christ, affirmed at the Council of Chalcedon, for his eloquent sermons, and for the prayers he composed for the Roman liturgy.

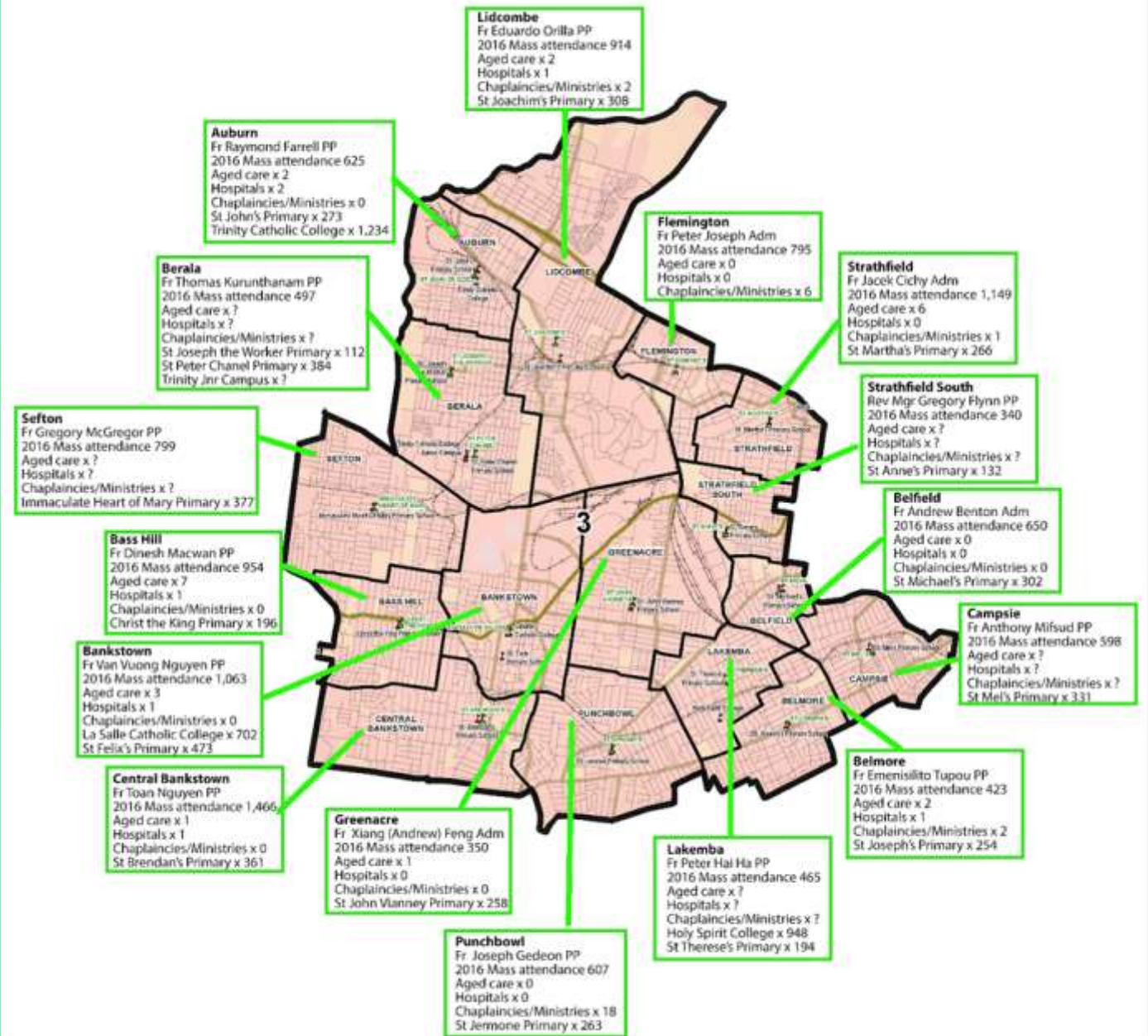

Parish 2020, a major pastoral planning project in the archdiocese, was launched in December 2016. Very recently I received the above picture of parishes from Parish 2020 Office. Why this project? It emerged from the conviction that Catholics must become missionary in their outlook, dying – figuratively speaking – to tell the people around them about the love of God. “The goal is to expand and reinvigorate what we’re doing,” Fr Gleeson, our Vicar General, said. “But that involves, on the one hand, a new sense of missionary motivation, and on the other hand a consolidation which strengthens the parishes.” It means the renewal of every parish. Small parishes are also increasingly subject to greater financial burdens and government reporting demands. And that too points to the need to do think afresh. Therefore it is important for us in Berala parish to work on realising the full potential as a Parish. Being a Missionary Parish requires motivation and involvement in the parish life by majority of parishioners. We may have a fair distance to go in this respect.

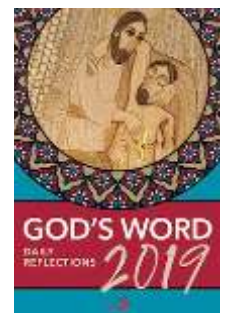
