Be Grateful for God given talents



My cousins Suja and Modesty, Sisters of Destitute, presented me

the above Christmas picture as a gift five years ago when I was celebrating the Jubilee of my Ordination. There is more to this picture. It is craft work done by Jilu who was born without any arms at all. She lives in one of the destitute homes run by the Sisters. In spite of her handicap, she is thankful to God for the gifts she has and does wonderful things with her legs like

the pictured craft work. Even with two hands most people are unable to produce anything like it. Yes she is talented. But more than that, she is prepared to use her talents rather than blame God or anyone else for being harsh with her and depriving her of faculties which we take for granted. Jilu's determination and attitude to life challenges us to look at life differently and put into good use the talents we are blessed with rather than crying over spilled milk. This is the message of the Gospel today where Jesus tells the story of three people entrusted with different measures of talents. The ones who were industrious with their talents won the Masters favour and more talents, while the whinging one lost even the little he had.

Not just in the material world do we need to be vigilant with our talents, our spiritual world also should reflect a sense of gratitude leading us to be proactive. Instead of whinging about the CHURCH treating "ME" badly, we should be examining the opportunities and capabilities presented to us and use them for our spiritual growth. Only such an approach will bring happiness and peace. No use complaining to God that he has not answered our prayers as we wanted them to be. God's ways are better than ours and sometimes mysterious. Therefore instead of playing God, let us submit ourselves to His will and use our talents to achieve more grace from God.



All Communion Ministers taking the Blessed Sacrament to the Sick for their Communion are invited to a meeting at 7 PM on Thursday, 20 November, in the Donovan Room.

Correct practice of receiving Holy Communion

Following the example and command of Our Lord, we use Bread and Wine in the Eucharistic Liturgy (Mass). In the Liturgy the bread and wine transforms into the Body and Blood of Christ in the act of communion. It is by taking and sharing the Eucharistic bread and chalice that we obey the Lord's command and grow in the likeness of the Lord. In fact the gathering to do Eucharist and Communicating with Christ in Mass is the definition of CHURCH. Jesus assured us "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:54-55). Therefore we should express reverence and have appropriate attitude when we approach the Blessed Sacrament for Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). The act of

Communion is an act of faith. When you approach the Sacrament, bow your head with hands in prayer posture before receiving the Blessed Sacrament. The communicant may choose whether to receive the Body of Christ in the hand or on the tongue. When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: "When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost." In a Mass with a smaller congregation, Holy Communion is offered in both kinds. That means the Chalice with the precious Blood of Christ is also offered to the communicant with the words "The Blood of Christ," to which the communicant responds, "Amen." The communicant receives the chalice from the Minister and sips from it. But the communicant is allowed to dip the Host in the Chalice by himself/ herself. Should you wish to have the Host dipped in the chalice, allow the Minister to do it for you and you receive the Communion on the tongue.

Feasts of the Week.



17 November - St Elizabeth of Hungary Born in Bratislava (Slovakia) in 1207. Married at the age of fourteen, widowed at twenty, and died at twenty-four in Marburg (Germany) on this day in 1231. Mother of three children, happily married to Ludwig of Thuringia. When Ludwig died of the plague while on crusade, she continued to protect the poor and founded orphanages and hospitals, living this life of service as a Franciscan tertiary despite the hostility of her relatives and the harshness of her confessor. Remembered for her good-humoured resilience in adversity and for her humility in menial service of the needy.

21 November - Presentation of Blessed Virgin Mary This memorial originally marked the dedication of a sixth century church of the Virgin Mary near the Temple of Jerusalem. The East took it up as a celebration of Mary's presentation to God in the Temple at the age of three, a non-biblical story from the apocryphal gospel of James. Established in the West late in the Middle Ages, the feast was universally observed by the sixteenth century. It celebrates Mary in her grace-filled life, wholly given over to the Holy Spirit from the time of her conception.





22 November - St Cecilia Though a late fourth century church in Rome was named after her, nothing is known of her life or death. Popular legends were written about her in the late fifth century, and in the sixteenth century she was named the patron of music. Remembered in tradition as a virgin, martyred for the faith. Her name is included in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon)
