The Father's Mercy

A reformed alcoholic once told me that he was prepared to help other alcoholics if they needed it. Taking his offer I told him about a man whose personal and family life were a misery due to his addiction to alcohol. After listening to the details, my friend said, we need to wait for this miserable man to hit rock bottom before we can help him. It is so true that in many cases people do not seek help until they hit rock bottom. Till then they are in self-denial. There are plenty

There are plenty of cases where losing everything was the best wake-up call they had in their lives. The younger son in the story Jesus told of two sons and their father is one such example.

The younger son in the story breaks all rules and traditions of the Jewish life. Unlike a good Jew, he demanded his portion of his inheritance before his father died. Going to live with non-Jewish people in alien territory is also against their expectation of a law observing, religious Jew. Herding pigs is the lowest a Jew could go. But when he hit rock bottom, he woke up to self-realisation. When he returned home with a very contrite heart, he saw his father waiting for him, forgiving him, and celebrating his return. Our Father in Heaven is like that. He is merciful and is waiting for the lost soul to return to him. Once we are open to the mercy of God he is lavish in his love for us. This understanding is comforting.


But the real punch line of the story of the two sons and the merciful father is in the second half. To understand the meaning of the message, we need to read the story in its context. Jesus was telling this parable to an audience of Pharisees and Scribes who meticulously followed the law and tradition of Jews. Such well respected 'religious Jews' were not amused to see tax collectors and sinners seeking the company of Jesus. To them Jesus said, the elder son was like them. He did not disobey his father in anything. He worked hard and looked after his father's property. Yet he had one big problem, he could not forgive his younger brother. He was too self-righteous to do so. Therefore he did not enter into the father's joy. This is one of the pitfalls many can easily fall into. We may be very religious in observing rules and traditions. But if we are too self-righteous to forgive others and open our hearts to them, then we too can miss out on the grace of God.

If you think you have lost everything, know that you haven't. Seek the mercy of God because He is waiting for you. He will help you make a new start in your life. God's mercy surpasses all human judgements. Secondly, if you are too comfortable with your religious practices, examine your conscience to see how forgiving you are to others and how open you are to God's call into his Joy. In spite of religious observations, if we are harbouring anger, frustration, and disappointments, we too could be in the same pit as the Pharisees and the Scribes – self-righteousness. The Father's mercy was open to both sons. Therefore we shall not be stubborn. Let us enter in His mercy and let this Lent help us do so.


Holy week Reflection with Fr John Sullivan



Project Compassion: Evangeline's story - Australia

When Evangeline left high school she had a limited vision for her future. But the training she's received while working at the Djilpin Arts Ghunmarn Culture Centre, supported by Caritas Australia, has helped her develop new skills and ignited her passion for the maintenance and preservation of her Aboriginal culture.

Evangeline is a proud young Ramingining woman living in the small community of Beswick (Wugularr) in the Northern Territory. Like many remote First Australian communities, Beswick faces a range of complex ongoing challenges, and many people in the town feel disempowered by poorly conceived policies and decisions.



When Evangeline left high school after Year 11 she tried a few career options without success and soon felt dispirited. "But by the time I was 22, I really started to think about doing something positive with my life," she says.

So when she was offered a position as an Artsworker at the Djilpin Arts Ghunmarn Culture Centre in Beswick, Evangeline recognised a path to a new future.

The community-owned venture is supported by Caritas Australia's Development of Cultural Enterprise program. It brings together Elders and young people, like Evangeline, so new generations can learn traditional skills and understand cultural knowledge through sharing art, storytelling, dance and song – practices that are central to traditional culture.

In the three years since joining the Centre, Evangeline has truly flourished. "This opportunity has helped me turn my life into something more positive," she says.

Now a Senior Artsworker, Evangeline is committed to helping her community stay connected to its culture. "Culture is our identity and how we understand ourselves," she explains. "It's important for us young people to be able to learn these skills and then we can pass them on when we are old."
