

The Big Catch

When Peter followed the instruction of the Risen Christ to cast the net, he caught 153 fish in one net. Did Peter actually sit down and count the fish he caught? I do not think so. In referring to the massive catch, John the Gospel writer, has included this number to make a point. At the time of Jesus the known number of species of fish were 153. Another point to remember is that Jesus told the Apostles earlier that he will make them fishers of men. Now this miraculous catch of fish following the instruction of the Risen Christ is a sign of the Apostles netting people from all races and cultures to the net that is the Church. John taught this promise to his Church at a time when the world around was very hostile to Christians. The number of followers were very small and it was basically in a few roman territories. Yet John remembered the promise of Christ that the work of the Apostles will bear miraculous results. The prophecy of netting people of all sorts has come true, as since then our Church is truly universal. No human force can stop the advancement of the Good News of the Risen Christ. Therefore we should not be alarmed by ISIS or any other such forces trying to kill off the Church.

John always used Jesus' actions as signs of His Kingdom being realised among us. Therefore when he tells us that Jesus grilled some fish on the shore using some of the fish the disciples caught and shared a breakfast with them, it is indicative of the hospitality the Risen Christ is offering to us Christians. As a good disciple of Christ we do not want to miss out on his hospitality. There are two dimension to this hospitality. First of all it is an invitation to share in the Eucharistic Communion with Christ in Mass. That way we become part of the Body of Christ. Secondly it is also an invitation to foster the fellowship amongst the disciples of Christ.

Living in urbanised and multicultural situation like ours, we should be well aware of the individualism in our society and the greater need of working for stronger fellowship in our parish. Stronger fellowship in the Parish will be one of the topics of discussion in the next Pastoral Planning meeting coming up in May. We should also take a lot of comfort in the fact that the Risen Christ is offering his hospitality to us. That is the mercy of God. Therefore make use of the Sacrament of Penance to reconcile with God and worthily share in the hospitality of Christ in the Eucharist.
