Let us Love as Jesus Loved

A family had both adults working seven days a week to provide a good life for their children and for themselves. In this rat race, it became nearly impossible for them to find time to pick up children from school, take them to sports, clean and look after the house, and so on. It is then they came across a vulnerable refugee who did not have a visa, nor any permit to work. This family found it very convenient to ask the refugee to do the chores for them. So they told the refugee that in doing the work for them, she would pick up the language and she could kill her boredom. Since the government paid the refugee sustenance money, the family did not think that they owed the refugee anything in return. Now what you think of this family?


You might say that this family is doing an injustice to the refugee and there is no love or compassion in their dealings. But the family can argue back and saying that they are doing all this out of their love for their spouse, and children. They are even showing some compassion to the refugee by allowing her to work for them. But you know how wrong they are.

Love is a virtue. Virtue is a disposition to promote life in its beauty. It takes into account all people, especially the vulnerable who need the support of others. Virtuous love does not violate the right of one for the welfare of some small number of people, like a family or a lobby group.

You know this principle applies to other situations like same sex marriage issues and abortion of the unborn. The children in same sex marriages also have a right to be brought up lovingly by their natural parents, a mother and a father. No amount of argument for the welfare of a lobby group can supersede the right of the vulnerable children.

Similar is the case of unborn babies, who are totally dependant on their mother for their life. Abortion of the unborn for the welfare of the parent does not have any element of virtuous love. But Pope Francis has made allowances for the women who have done abortions to make a fresh start in their spiritual life easy. He has allowed the priests to absolve the sins of abortion, which formerly was reserved to the Holy See. There may be women wanting make use of this opportunity in this year of mercy. To them I am available to hear their confessions.

Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you must love one another." (Jn 13:34). The way Jesus loved us is a self-sacrificing love. Even when Judas had betrayed him, Jesus did not seek his welfare. He did not run away from the situation nor did he fight back for his own benefits. Jesus sacrificed his life on the cross out of his love for us. The Apostle Paul also said, "We all have to experience many hardships before we enter the Kingdom of God" (Acts 14:22). It is not the personal comfort we Christians use as a benchmark for the norm of life. As true Christians we are prepared to undergo hardships for the sake of love especially the vulnerable among us. We are mindful of the unborn babies and the children among the vulnerable. Let us try to love others as Jesus loved us.

Feasts of the Week



April 26 - St Mark Died about the year 74. Usually identified with the John Mark whose mother's house in Jerusalem was a meeting place for the apostles, and with the young man who followed Christ after his arrest (Mark 14:51). A cousin of Saint Barnabas (11 June). Accompanied Saint Paul (29 June) on his first missionary journey and later followed him to Rome. A companion of Saint Peter (29 June) and traditionally credited with the gospel which reflects Peter's teaching and memoirs. Honoured as the founder of the Church in Alexandria.

April 28 - St Peter Chanel

The protomartyr of the South Seas, St. Peter Chanel was born in 1803 at Clet in the diocese of Belley, France. His intelligence and simple piety brought him to the attention of the local priest, Father Trompier, who saw to his elementary education. Entering the diocesan Seminary, Peter won the affection and the esteem of both students and professors. After his ordination he found himself in a rundown country parish and completely revitalized it in the three year span that he remained there. However, his mind was set on missionary work; so, in 1831, he joined the newly formed Society of Mary (Marists) which concentrated on missionary work at home and abroad. To his dismay, he was appointed to teach at the seminary at Belley and remained there for the next five years, diligently performing his duties.



Saint Peter Chanel

In 1836, the Society was given the New Hebrides in the Pacific as a field for evangelization, and the jubilant Peter was appointed Superior of a little band of missionaries sent to proclaim the Faith to its inhabitants. On reaching their destination after an arduous ten month journey, the band split up and St. Peter went to the Island of Futuna accompanied by a lay brother and an English layman, Thomas Boog. They were at first well received by the pagans and their king Niuliki who had only recently forbidden cannibalism. However, the kings jealousy and fear were aroused when the missionaries learned the language and gained the people's confidence; he realized the adoption of the Christian Faith would lead to the abolition of some of the prerogatives he enjoyed as both high priest and sovereign.

Finally, when his own son expressed a desire to be baptized, the king's hatred erupted and he dispatched a group of his warriors to set upon the saintly head of the missionaries. Thus, on April 28, 1841, three years after his arrival, St. Peter was seized and clubbed to death by those he had come to save. And his death brought his work to completion - within five months the entire island was converted to Christianity



April 29 St Catherine of Siena Born at Siena (Italy) in 1347. Died at Rome on this day in 1380. Committed to the practice of prayer and penance from an early age, she entered the Dominican Third Order while still an adolescent. Became an influential spiritual leader and made strenuous efforts to reconcile Church and state and to reform the Roman papacy. Remembered for her holiness and determination and, though she never learned to write, for the quality of her teachings. Remembered also as a mystic and a reformer of religious life.
