Tenth Sunday Ordinary Time Year C 5 June 2016

Our God is the Lord of Life and Death.

Hearing me announcing the 'death' of a parishioner, someone from the congregation corrected me later. "To say that someone died is awful. Say that he passed away or passed on." I have also had the experience of some of the children of a dying mother who did not want to visit her in her dying moments. The reason I was given was that these particular children would like to remember her in her good health, enjoying life with them only. Th



remember her in her good health, enjoying life with them only. Therefore these ones waited until the funeral of the mother and they did not mind looking at the box with the body in it.

Yes, our culture has a problem with death and normally we avoid speaking about it. Our life is dependent on the support of other people alive and active. Loosing that support is losing part of our lives. Therefore we do not like our dear ones and those who support us to die. Our culture also spends so much money on techniques and procedures that claim to help us live longer. The fear of death is great in our midst.

The first book of Kings chapter seven, speaks of a widow's fear of losing her only son to death. Her life was shattered to know that he died. This is the same woman who fed prophet Elijah when he was starving and begged for a share of the little food the woman had. Elijah took the body of the boy to his room and prayed to God. And the God of life gave him breath of life and he was returned to the grieving mother. The prophet was teaching the woman that death is not the end of life. Our God is the lord of life and death and he will look after us even in our death. To prove that our God is the Lord of life and death, Elijah's prayers resuscitated the son of the widow.

In the Gospel of Luke today, we read about Jesus bringing the dead son of a widow in Nain back to life. In this case, it is not just the mother of the dead who is shattered, but the whole village is weighed down by the grief that the death of this young man is the end of life for him and disaster for his mother. In this instance also, Jesus gave life back to the dead body of the young man. This brings not just joy, but also hope in the crowd. Once again the scripture teaches us that death is not the end of life. The Lord of Life is looking after us at our death too. Not everyone's dead body is given life again to live longer on earth. But every dead faithful is called to live in the presence of God. This is why Jesus could say to one who was crucified with him, "you will be with me in paradise today." Our God is the Lord of life and death.

Whether we live on this side of the grave or on the other, we live in one communion. Therefore we can pray for the those dear ones who have departed our world and transformed into celestial beings. Due to human weakness, if there is anything lacking in their life to be pure enough to see God face to face, we, the dear ones left behind on earth, can help our dear departed ones with prayers and our witness to faith. Once our dear ones are able to be in the presence of God, they too can pray for us. In fact they, being in a privileged position with God, pray for us in a more effective way.

Our God is the Lord of life and death. He will not abandon us at the moment of our earthly death. He will transform our bodies and make us fitting to live thereafter in the presence of God in heaven. The raising of the dead boy to life though the prayer of prophet Elijah and the raising of the dead son of the widow in Nain by Jesus are proof that Our God is the Lord of life and death. 11 June - St Barnabas It is not known when he died, but according to Eastern and Western tradition his remains were discovered on this day sometime in the fifth century. A Jew from Cyprus and one of the first converts in Jerusalem, a leading member of the Church there, though not one of the twelve.
