Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Sunday & the Year of Mercy

The Jubilee Year of Mercy is an opportunity to experience and, importantly, encounter God's Grace on many levels. By encountering God's Mercy on an individual level we avail ourselves of the warmth and nourishment of God's love. The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council believes that these blessings can be amplified and shared when we open our hearts to the concept of Mercy amongst our friends, loved ones, communities and most importantly, those of which we have previously found conflict.

The act of 'black and white' people praying together for mercy, forgiveness and justice is a powerful symbol of all that the Year of Mercy represents. By placing an emphasis on opening our hearts to God and seeking his everlasting forgiveness and strength to forgive, we allow ourselves to become unburdened by the weight that many of us have carried on our shoulders and in our hearts for generations.



Missionary in Cultural Diversity

At one of the clergy conferences I happened to introduce myself as a missionary from India. This caused many eyebrows to frown. Some even argued that I am not a missionary because Australia is not poor like India. According to them 'missionary' means a religious person from a rich country going into a poorer country to assist with social welfare. One may add a bit of religious activities to it. Is that what is meant by 'missionary'? The Gospel according to Luke 10:1-12 teaches what a missionary should be like.

Jesus sent 72 disciples to various places to take his message to people from diverse backgrounds. In Biblical terms the number 72 represents universality. Therefore Jesus, by appointing 72 disciples to carry his message to various towns, was declaring that his message is meant for all cultures. It is interesting to note that Jesus instructed the missionaries not to take any material goods with them as they go. The primary duty of the missionary is not to provide material welfare for anyone. A missionary is to take the message of hope and trust in God to the people as Jesus did. This would mean accepting the welcome and hospitality of the people for whom the missionary is sent. Jesus does not want the missionary to impose his culture or wealth on others. At the height of missionary activities in the history of the church, this aspect of the Gospel teaching seems to have slipped the mind of many missionaries.

Saint Paul also was very clear about his missionary vision. In his letter to the Galatians (Ref 6:14-18), he says "It does not matter if a person is circumcised or not; what matters is for him to become an altogether new creature." Paul means to say that Jesus did not come to convert Romans and other people to the Jewish culture or religion before making them Christians. Following this teaching we too are not to carry our baggage of culture and money power to anyone to whom we take the message of Christ. We are simply to preach the Gospel in its entirety, without fear, with all the energy and power God gives.

Incidentally this weekend for us in Australia is Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday. With all good intensions, earlier missionaries compelled the native Australians to adopt foreign cultures; and this has proven to be counter-productive. Missionaries as disciples of Jesus are called to give and accept gifts with gratitude, grace and humility. Every person, every culture, has something to give, but needs enrichment from the Gospel. A missionary is to provide that enrichment.

In a multicultural parish like ours, there are lots of opportunities to practice true missionary activity to each other. It starts with endearing various cultures. Opportunities like Parish Day are not to be missed. Almost all of us have a culture of origin and a culture of adoption. Acknowledging this aspect is something positive. Knowing the difference and celebrating hope and trust in God which unifies us is the kind of fellowship we desire.

Holy Father's Appeal


