First Reading Is 58:7-10

Thus says the Lord:

Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over. Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call, and he will say, 'I am here.' If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

Second Reading 1 Cor 2:1-5

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

Gospel Mt 5:13-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men. 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.

SCPIPTUPAL CONTEXT

Following blessings

Today's gospel passage is one that is quite commonly quoted and relatively well known. When it is taken in isolation, it's very easy to forget that these words immediately follow the Beatitudes that we heard in last week's gospel. The imperative for justice in the images of salt and light of the world becomes even clearer when we remember that these words follow the blessings on those who are poor; who mourn; who are merciful and fight for justice. Jesus has blessed all these who are least in the world and then charges the disciples to be salt and light for them.

Living # gospel

Be the change

Gandhi, the great leader of the Indian independence movement, is credited with saying, "You must be the change you want to see in the world." He sought a life free from tyranny and violence and so led a movement of non-violent resistance. It's tempting to think that he may have been influenced by some of the teachings of Jesus because so much of his approach reflected Jesus' call for justice. The charge to be the light of the world that shines in the sight of all and sets an example for all is echoed succinctly in Gandhi's words.



Affirmation or Challenge

The salt and light of the world passage is often used to affirm and encourage, but when Jesus tells his disciples – and us – to be salt and light of the world it is not so that they can draw attention and glory to themselves. The whole purpose of being salt and light is to lead others into right relationship with one another and with God. Whilst the translation we have clearly states that disciples are to be salt and light of the world, it is just as clear that the intention is that they/we be salt and light for the world.

FAITH IS NOT PRIVATE, BUT PUBLIC

Last month, I hosted the Ministers Fraternity of Auburn region. It is a meeting of the Ministers from different denominations of Christian Faith. At these meetings we read a Bible passage, pray together, and discuss how we live out our Christian witness in a practical way. Recently arrived refugees and how to help them in the season of Christmas was the discussion before Christmas. In the January meeting, it was suggested that we conduct a combined Stations of the Cross in public, in Auburn city on Good Friday. It's another way of public witness to the Christian faith we profess.

Christian faith is not a private matter. Neither feeling good in oneself is the point. Christian way is to lead an active life of hope and joy. Such a life will provide inspiration and enlightenment for others. Continuing from the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12) Jesus told his disciples, "You are the salt of the earth." and "You are the light of the world". Jesus was challenging us to go beyond Ten Commandments and find hope even in the most depressing life situations. He asked his disciples not to keep their faith life to themselves but bring it out to be a witness and inspiration to the people.

Our lives are to be like salt that spices up food and activate nutrients from the soil for the plants. If salt loses its saltiness, it is good for nothing. Such is our faith life too. If it does not have the quality of providing inspiration for others, it is good for nothing. "No one lights a lamp and put it hidden". Lamps are meant to provide light. Therefore, if it is hidden and not providing any light, it is a worthless lamp. Similarly our faith life should also provide enlightenment to the people. If it does not do that then it does not have any religious worth.

It is an important and necessary part of our faith life to appreciate and praise people in our faith community for the great things that they do. Our faith life is not a private matter. There is always a public dimension to our faith life.

Feasts & Memorials of the Week

Monday —St Paul Miki and Companions



St Paul Miki was a Japanese Jesuit priest who was well known for his preaching. During his life the number of Christians in Japan was steadily growing. This displeased the Japanese ruler, Hideyoshi. He ordered the execution of Paul Miki and 25 of his companions. They were all crucified near Nagasaki in 1597; the

first Christian martyrs in Japan. It is said that Paul Miki gave his last sermon from the cross, during which he forgave his persecutors as Christ had done.

Friday —St Scholastica



St Scholastica was born in 480 AD and was the sister of St Benedict. Her life was dedicated to God from an early age and she later founded the order of Benedictine nuns. Scholastica met her brother once a year at a house near his monastery. According to the writings of Gregory the Great, on their last visit she asked


Benedict to stay longer but he refused. She began to pray for rain and a fierce storm erupted which prevented him from leaving the house. She died three days later and tradition says that Benedict saw his sister's soul leave her body in the form of a dove.

Sacraments of Initiation

First Holy Communion and Confirmation are two Sacraments of Initiation to follow after infant baptism. Catholic Schools, through the school curricula help the students understand the meaning of these sacraments in depth. The parents and siblings in the family help the little ones to experience the joy and place of these sacraments by taking them to Church and worship with the Parish Community. Our parish always works on improving the Sacramental Program to prepare the children to celebrate these Sacraments of Initiation well. This Year of Mercy, we give greater emphasis on making the preparation more parish based. There will be three different programs for Confirmation, First Communion, and First Reconciliation.

Confirmation - Enrolment

The Confirmation Program will with the enrolment of the Candidates on 18/19 February at SPC Church. If your child is in Yr 6 or older, and has made their First Holy Communion, they are eligible to enrol. Candidates are invited with their parents to church 30 minutes before the start of Mass (Vigil or 10 AM Mass). The Sacramental team will collect a \$15 enrolment fee and provide the registration form. Parents help the candidates to fill the forms and present it during the Mass to the priest. On Tuesday, 21 February at 7 PM, parents are invited to SPC Church for a meeting where detailed information on the program will be explained an resource material will be provided. We will be using resources provided by Gracia Publication



Communion



Parents are invited to enrol their children for First Holy Communion on 4/5 March. If your child is in Year 4 or older they are eligible to enrol. Please arrive at SJW or SPC Church half an hour before the start of the Mass. The Sacramental team will collect \$15 as registration fee and provide the families with forms to fill in. The children are to present these forms during the Mass to the priest. Parents are then invited to a meeting at 7 PM on Tuesday 7 March at SPC Church. Details of the program will be explained at this meeting and resource materials will be distributed to the parents. Using the material the parents will be able to explain Holy Eucharist to the Children and enthuse

them to participate in Sunday Liturgies. The children and their parents are to meet for one hour catechetical sessions on each Sundays in June after 10 AM Mass in the Jubilee Hall. Alternatively the parents can prepare the children at home. Fr Thomas would like to meet with each family individually, before mid August, to check the preparedness of the child before the reception of the Sacrament. Thursday 24 August is the retreat day for the children at St Peter Chanel Primary School. First Holy Communion will be celebrated at SJW at 8am on Sunday 27 August and at SPC on Saturday 2 September at 5pm or at 10am on Sunday 3 September.

Reconciliation

The First Reconciliation Program will start this year with enrolment at all Masses on the first weekend of September. A parents meeting will be held on the following Tuesday evening and the catechetical classes will be held in the Jubilee hall four consecutive Sundays starting on 15 October. The First Reconciliation will be celebrated on 15 November.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

I write to you as the final hearing involving the Catholic Church at the Royal Commission into Child Sexual Abuse commences on February 6, 2017.

For the victims and survivors, for the Catholic community and for many in the wider Australian community, this hearing may be a difficult and even distressing time, as the Royal Commission reviews the evidence it has already received and seeks to understand why and how this tragedy has occurred.

Deeply mindful of the hurt and pain caused by abuse, I once again offer my apology on behalf of the Catholic Church. I am sorry for the damage that has been done to the lives of victims of sexual abuse. As Pope Francis said recently, 'it is a sin that shames us'.

Over the next three weeks, evidence presented during the Royal Commission hearings will be analysed, statistics about the extent of abuse will be made public, and the way forward will be explored. Many of our bishops and other Catholic leaders will appear before the Royal Commission. They will explain what the Church has been doing to change the old culture that allowed abuse to continue and to put in place new policies, structures and protections to safeguard children.

Pope Francis has urged the whole Church to, 'find the courage needed to take all necessary measures and to protect in every way the lives of our children, so that such crimes may never be repeated'.

Throughout the coming weeks, I want to assure you of my thoughts and prayers. I encourage you to turn in prayer to the one who is always ready to listen: Jesus Christ, who brings healing and hope
