First Reading

Gen 12:1-4

The Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your family and your father's house, for the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name so famous that it will be used as a blessing. 'I will bless those who bless you: I will curse those who slight you. All the tribes of the earth shall bless hemselves by you.' So Abram went as the Lord told him.

Second Reading

2 Tm 1:8-10

With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News.

Gospel Mt 17:1-9

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead'.

'Listen to him!'

God's voice from the cloud claims Jesus as his Son, the Chosen One and then goes on to instruct those present – and we, the readers – to 'Listen to him!' For the disciples, this was a message not to get carried away with their own ideas about the Messiah but to listen to what Jesus was saying about the suffering he must endure and to what he was saying about true discipleship. Jesus tells us that to be a follower of his involves sacrifice, hardship and often unpopularity. It is this message we must listen to as much as the promise of salvation.

<u>GOSPEL</u> <u>A new vision</u>

Peter sees the appearance of Elijah and Moses as a confirmation that Jesus has come to continue the work of the great prophets of the past. Rather than placing Jesus in the old tradition of the prophets, the appearance of Elijah and Moses, together with the voice of God, is to endorse the new direction that Jesus' ministry is taking. Jesus' new vision for the world is informed by the relationships forged between God and the prophets of the past, but it is a vision of a completely different way of relating to God: a much more personal relationship that calls us to respond from the heart to those around us.



Gospel Parallels

The account of the Transfiguration appears in all three synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke). The word, synoptic, means 'seen together' and these three gospels can be seen together because they have so much material in common. It is now accepted that the gospel of Mark was the first written as so much of it appears in the other two, while the gospels of Matthew and Luke both seem to have also drawn on another source of Jesus material (known as the 'Q' source). Despite the parallels, each writer uses the same story to convey the particular message of that gospel.

WHO DOESN'T WANT TO BATHE IN GLORY?

Who does not want to bathe in the glory if it comes your way? When you are in the height of glory you would not think of coming down from such peak in life. When Jesus appeared in a very glorious form with Moses and Elijah, Peter, James, and John, the three privileged disciples were ecstatic. (Ref Matthew 17:1-9) They did not want to leave the



mountain top. Peter said, "Let us pitch three tents here". The idea was to keep themselves bathed in the glory they just experienced. But a divine voice confirmed to them that the dazzling white appearance of Jesus is because he is the son of God and he is God's favourite. But instead of getting lost in this glorious apparition, listen to him. What did Jesus tell them?

Jesus led them down the mountain to the planes of everyday life. They came to Mount Tabor on their long walk from the shores of Galilee to the far northern town of Caesarea Philippi. The whole walk, like life itself, was a pilgrimage. On the way the disciples had different experiences and they listened to the teachings and wisdom of Jesus. Climbing the mountain of glory was also part of it. When they were on the peak, bathed in glory they did not want to come down. The disciples were told that they cannot continue to stay there. They will have to come down the mountain and continue their pilgrimage. Because such glory on earth is not going to last long. Before we can reach the real glory in life we will have to pass through the way of the cross and suffering. Just like Jesus Christ had sacrificed his life on the cross before the glory of his resurrection, so will we require to sacrifice our self before we can attain lasting glory.

If you are enjoying a good status in your career, remember that it is not going to last forever. You will need to climb down the mountain of your glory. Even if you are on the top of the world with fame and money, the day will come you will have to climb down the mountain of your glory. Even if you are enjoying the best of health, remember that the author of life may have surprises for you. Are you prepared for it? Nothing that is great and enjoyable in this world is going to last forever. Therefore listen to the Beloved Son of God. He has the Words of Life which will lead you to a glory that will last forever. If the son of God had to suffer grievously before the glory of the resurrection we too should not be hesitant in embracing the crosses we need to carry. The awaiting glory which is eternal is the encouragement we have to do so. Therefore let no sickness, failures, or rejection in your life make you depressed. Keep walking the pilgrim way as people of hope.

Feasts & Nemorials of the Week

Friday—St Patrick

St. Patrick was born in Britain c.385 and as a young man was captured by Irish pirates and sold into slavery. After six years in Ireland he escaped, returned to his family and trained for the priesthood in Gaul. In c.435 he returned to Ireland as a missionary bishop. Through his work, Christianity flourished and the church became organised.

Although not extensively learned, St Patrick was known for his sincerity and pastoral care, and was largely concerned with abolishing paganism and idolatry and encouraged monastacism. There are many legends about Ireland's most beloved saint, including his use of the shamrock for explaining the trinity, and his banishing of all snakes from Ireland.

Project Compassion: Martina's story -Timor-Leste

For Martina, Caritas Australia's Protection Program offered far more than just shelter from domestic violence.

An East Timorese mother of eight, escaping domestic violence was the first step in her journey to a new life. But at first, her future seemed very uncertain. Timor-Leste is one of the least developed countries in the world, with extremely low levels of basic health, literacy and income. Most East Timorese live in rural areas, with very limited access to basic services or livelihood training, and many households don't have enough food year round.



The shelter where Martina sought refuge, Uma PAS, offered her many ways to transcend these challenges. Uma PAS is a partner in Caritas Australia's Protection Program, a holistic community-wide program in Timor-Leste that offers women like Martina economic empowerment and a life of safety in a supportive community.

Through the program, she was linked with a network of support services, and this enabled her to undertake livelihood training and start a small business to support her children. The program also linked her with a supportive community.

"Martina is a person who did not want to give up, but wanted to be able to support her family," her counsellor at the shelter says. Through the Protection Program, Martina says, "I have learnt how to change my life to support myself, and my children."
