First Reading

Acts 6:1-7

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.

Second Reading

1 Pt 2:4-9

The Lord is the living stone, rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him; set yourselves close to him so that you too, the holy priesthood that offers the spiritual sacrifices which Jesus Christ has made acceptable to God, may be living stones making a spiritual house. As scripture says: See how I lay in Zion a precious cornerstone that I have chosen and the man who rests his trust on it will not be disappointed. That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store for them.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

Gospel

Jesus said to his disciples:

'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me. There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you. I am now going to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too. You know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?'

Jesus said: 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me. If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.'

Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me? 'To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, "Let us see the Father"? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself: it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work.

You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason. 'I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.'

The Call to Stewardship

"Whoever believes in me will perform the same works as myself" (John 14:11) says Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles tells us how the Christians in the early Church did the things as Jesus would. According to the Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7 the early Christians offered hospitality to each other, they looked after the needs of the Apostles who were busy preaching. They even pooled their resources. They prayed together the Eucharist as Jesus had commanded them to do. Following the example and teaching of Jesus, early Christians were service minded, helping especially the poor. The apostles as leaders shared their responsibility with other Christians.

The Church as a fellowship continues to base its life on these four pillars, namely Hospitality, Prayer, Formation, and Service, highlighted in the Early Church. These four pillars together could be called the STEWARDSHIP. It is a duty we all church members should share. Our parish always should be a place of hospitality, prayer, formation and service. It requires each of us sharing of time, talent and treasure with the rest of the Parish. Stewardship of the Parish is an integral part of Christian living.

From the Acts of the Apostles we learn a great deal spiritual truth. No one who has received blessings from God can be selfish enough to say "I do with as I please with what is mine". Because we cannot claim total ownership of our wealth time or talent. We are stewards (managers, caretakers) of our time, our talent and out treasure. Our time, talent and our treasure are not given to us; rather, God entrusts them to our care, therefore:

- 1. We are grateful for the trust God has placed in us.
- 2. We hold what is given in proper regard, taking care of it as the property of another.
- 3. We use what we have been given according to the good pleasure of God, who is the owner and master of it all. The time, talent and treasure God gives to each person is given to be used for his glory, for our needs, and for the benefit of others.

You and I together have a role to play in carrying out the mission of teaching, sanctifying and serving that Jesus gave to his Church. Each of us should contribute to making the parish a place of hospitality, prayer, formation and service. Some people have more time, talent and treasure to share; others are more in need of receiving. All will have to give to God an account of their stewardship of what God has given to them. Therefore think about your time, talent and treasure and see whether they are used as God would like you to use them. Also think, what part you play in supporting the fellowship of your parish.

Historical Context

It is for the best...

At the time of this gospel's writing, some 70 years after the events it describes, amazing things have taken place in the early Christian community. Rather than everything falling apart with the death of Jesus, the message of Jesus has spread further than he himself could ever have accomplished. It is the departure of Jesus from their midst and the sending of the Spirit that really prompts the disciples to act on what they had experienced while Jesus lived among them. The gospel writer has Jesus saying that he has to go away so that the disciples can reach their potential.

The Way, the Truth and the Life

When Thomas asks, 'we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus answers by saying, 'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life.' The reader of the gospel has known this truth all along from the opening line of the gospel, 'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.' Our aim, as Christian people, is to be one with God, not only by sharing in the resurrection but also in the way we live. Jesus makes clear that the way to be with God is by following his example.

SCPIPTUPAL CONTEXT

The gospel of John

The gospel of John is very different from the other three 'synoptic' gospels. The other three have a very narrative style and can be seen together as different recounts of the same events. Whilst the gospel of John also has some beautifully narrated stories, it is better known as a more theologically reflective piece of writing. It assumes that the readers of this gospel are already familiar with one or more of the others, so it doesn't need to tell the story again. Rather, it presents a sweeping image of God, through Jesus, reaching out, in, through, and with love to the people.


(Fr Thomas' Homily for the School Mass for Mothers Day)

contain the curiosity and asked him where the gift is. The quick thinking son said, "Mum, I am your gift." Mum couldn't agree more. Though it was a trick from the part of the son to get out of the situation, what he pronounced was profound.

Feasts & Memorials of the Week

Friday—St Bernardine of Siena



St Bernardine was the son of the governor of Siena. He was orphaned at age six and was brought up by his aunt. He became a Franciscan friar at the age of twenty two and travelled all over Italy, preaching several sermons a day to large crowds. He is remembered for his devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. At the end of his sermons he would hold up for veneration a plaque on which he wrote IHS - the Greek translation of 'Jesus'. Through his preaching, Bernardine was responsible for a vast number of conversions to Christianity. In 1437 he became the vicargeneral of the Observant branch of the friars, during which time the number of Observants rose tenfold due to his popularity. After establishing theology schools for the friars, he returned to his favourite task of preaching at the age of sixty three, but died a year later on the 20th of May.
