The Most Holy Trinity —Year A 11 June 2017

First Reading

Fx 34:4-6, 8-9

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had commanded him. And the Lord descended in the form of a cloud, and Moses stood with him there.

He called on the name of the Lord. The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, 'Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.' And Moses bowed down to the ground at once and worshipped. 'If I have indeed won your favour, Lord,' he said, 'let my Lord come with us, I beg. True, they are a headstrong people, but forgive us our faults and our sins, and adopt us as your heritage.'

Second Reading

2 Cor 13:11-13

Brothers, we wish you happiness; try to grow perfect; help one another. Be united; live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you.

Greet one another with the holy kiss. All the saints send you greetings.

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Gospel

In 3:16-18

Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved.

No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.'

Historical Context

We believe...

The teaching on the Trinity was not formally constructed until the 4th Century and was documented in the creed that emerged from the Council of Nicaea. The Creed that is said today in the Sunday liturgy is a version of that original Nicene Creed. The Nicene Creed spells out Christian beliefs about the nature of God, Jesus and the Spirit and was worded very carefully to negate a variety of heretical views that were held at the time. It is as much a statement about what we do not believe as it is a statement about what we do believe!

Sign of the Cross

Every time we bless ourselves or begin prayer with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God – three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice.

<u>scriptural</u>

CONTEXT

Trinity

At no point in the New Testament is the term Trinity used. That understanding of the nature of God came much later. However, there are a number of scriptural references that led to this theological understanding. The Annunciation, the baptism of Jesus and the great commissioning of the disciples to baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are all examples of the three persons of God being recognised or active in the gospels. Today's second reading shows St Paul using the three experiences of God as a blessing of the people of Corinth.

Holy Trinity

If God is only one, how could we speak of three persons of God? This has been a puzzling question for many people. What does the Bible say about it?

Jesus always spoke about his intimacy with the Father. "I am in the Father and the Father is in Me" (Jn 14:10) In a most unprecedented way, Jesus addressed God as "Father" when he taught his disciples how to pray. (Ref Mt 6:9-13). Jesus has revealed to us that God is a loving Father. So with confidence we call God our Father and long for his loving providence.

Jesus also said,

"When the Advocate comes, whom I will send you from the Father — the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father —He will testify about Me." (Jn 15:26) We see this promise of Jesus coming true on Pentecost day when the Apostles received Holy Spirit and preached boldly about resurrected Christ.

In calling God 'Father' Jesus revealed that he is the Son of God. John in his Gospel affirms this revelation when he wrote "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (Jn 3:16)

So according to the Gospels, God has revealed Himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Yet they are not three different entities according to Bible, but one being. Therefore we say 'we believe in one God, yet three persons

in one God'. This may not be explainable using the normal logic of the world. Yet we know it is true because of the Bible. We also know that in all these revelations, it is the love of God which is made real and near to us.

Our response to this revelation of God should be, how, like Jesus Christ, I can grow in my intimacy with the Father in Heaven. We also strive to bring about the fruits of the Holy Spirit who has come down on us. Apostles and other faithful disciples are our model and guidance in this. In short in all what say and do, we should reflect that our "God is Love". (Cf 1st letter of John Chapter 4) Our faith in Most Holy Trinity makes the most loving people.

Feasts & Memorials of the Week



St Anthony of Padua was born at Lisbon, Portugal in c.1193. He joined the Franciscan friars around the age of 25 and worked as a missionary among the Muslims in Morocco. Returning to Europe due to ill health, Anthony spent time at an Italian hermitage, where his gift for preaching was soon discovered. Due to his reputation as a biblical scholar, he spent the remaining nine years of his life teaching in France and Italy before dying at Padua, around 1232. Many miracles were attributed to his intercession and to this day St Anthony is regularly invoked by many as a finder of lost items. He is named as one of the doctors of the Roman Catholic Church.
