# Reflections

# Have You Thought?

The parable of the woman placing leaven in three measures of flour is an intriguing one. In some translations, the text reads, "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven which a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened." Whilst you might initially hide yeast in some dough it doesn't take very long for the yeast to become apparent as it makes the dough rise. Such a large quantity of flour suggests the bread if being prepared for a festival—perhaps Passover when only unleavened bread was used? That would put a different spin on the woman's action!

#### Living the Gospel

We often hear that to fully live out the kingdom message of Jesus is to be counter-cultural. These parables are a perfect example of that call. Jesus himself acted in contrast to his cultural context and often used examples of his teaching that few in the face of cultural expectation. What does it mean to be counter-cultural today? Our world is driven by an emphasis on the individual, acquisition and on consuming. The kingdom parables of today's gospel call us to be the agents of change that 'irritate' in our own small way to make a different in the world.

#### Be the Yeast to the World

Our world is tainted by sin and institutionalised evil. We hear a lot about it. The abuse of power, the exploitation of the underprivileged and slaying of the innocent has always been part of the human story. Are we able to grow and mature in the midst of all these darnel? How can a benevolent God allow these to happen? Jesus answers these questions through parables. Mysteries of God are better explained through parables than otherwise.



In spite of the intense missionary work of Jesus his disciples were not many. He had a powerful opposition in his time. His disciples also might have been aware that there were people planning to kill Jesus. In this hostile world isn't the kingdom preached by Jesus collapsing? That is the kind of question his disciples had for Jesus. His answer is this: "The Kingdom of God can be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and left ..... They asked him: 'do you want us to go and pull up the weeds?' He told them: 'No, when you pull up the weeds, you might uproot the wheat with them. Let them grow together until harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the workers: pull up the weeds first... then gather the wheat into my barn" (Ref Mt13:24-30) It is not because Jesus, the Son of God is weak that these evils are allowed to happen, but because of God's providence and care for the righteous people. The wicked will be punished in the end.

Majority syndrome is another problem we suffer from. There is always a tendency to support and go by the stronger and bigger mob. In the face of the mighty Roman Empire and the kingdom of Israel, the group of disciples who followed Jesus was very insignificant. So what are they going to achieve? Jesus told them not lose heart. "The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast which a woman took and buried in three measures of flour until the whole mass of dough began to rise." (Mt 13:33) Being fewer in number should not discourage you. You are a catalyst who can fill the whole society and indeed the world with the values and joys of the Kingdom of Heaven.

In a world where people compared the mighty and powerful kingdoms to the huge cedars of Lebanon, tall, ever green, and able to withstand all elements of the nature a mustard plant would be insignificant. These cedars were considered the safest and most attractive place for the birds of the air to nest. Against this popular thinking, Jesus says, "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, ... smaller than other seeds, but once it has fully grown... the birds come and rest in its branches" (Mt 13:31-32) When you think about it, how true it is. Where is the mighty Roman Empire now? Likewise the kingdom of Israel has also become history. But the kingdom of heaven preached by Jesus and his small group of disciples has now reached all corners of the world. It keeps on attracting the 'birds of all kind', people of all races and cultures into it. Such is the mystery of the kingdom of heaven. Such is the work of God. Let us be the yeast to the world.



#### **New Logo**

A new logo is designed for the parish. 'Berala' means water ducks. Therefore the blue figure is shaped to imagine a water duck. It is also representing the flow of the water of baptism which is life giving. Southern Cross (stars) denotes hope and the cross the Christian symbol of salvation. The red colour for the cross is an inspiration from the blood of the proto martyr, St Peter Chanel, of Oceania.

#### Tuesday—St James

St James was the son of Zebedee and the brother of John the apostle. He was a fisherman from Galilee who become known as James "the Greater" to distinguish him from the other apostle James "the Less", son of Alpheus. Jesus called James and John the "sons of thunder", most likely in reference to their quick-tempers. Along with Peter, James and John were among Jesus' closest friends and they were chosen to be witnesses to the Transfiguration and his agony in the garden. After Christ's death, James became the first apostle to be martyred when he was put to the sword by King Herod Agrippa I.

#### Tax Deductibility and CWF Collection

A few months ago I told the parish that there will be a provision for providing 25% tax deductibility for the Planned Giving Contributions to the Parish. Since then I have realised that CWF Contribution is the best way to gain Tax deductibility for your contribution. Our CWF (Charitable Work Fund) quota for last Financial Year was \$15900 (fifteen thousand and nine hundred dollars) of which only third was collected through the Weekend appeals. The rest was made up from the 2<sup>nd</sup> collection of the parish. Therefore for this year, I propose that the amount you wish to have tax deduction be contributed to CWF using the special envelopes. Any contribution of \$2 and above to CWF is 100% tax deductible.
