HOMILY by Richard Leonard SJ (from LiturgyHelp)

Three key people of the Old Testament are given to us in today's readings: Abram, Moses and Elijah. Unfortunately most of what we know about these men is fairly sketchy. Who can blame the young children, then, who wrote the following answers in an exam on the Old Testament? 'Moses led the Hebrews to the Red Sea, where they made unleavened bread, which is bread made without any ingredients. The Egyptians were all drowned in the dessert. Afterwards, Moses went up Mount Cyanide to get the Ten Amendments. The First was when Eve told Adam to eat the apple. The Fifth was to always humour thy father and mother.'

The Jews of Matthew's community, however, would have been able to remember by heart every detail about Abram, Moses and Elijah. These men remain the Jews' greatest heroes. The first hearers of the Transfiguration story would have immediately made all the connections between Jesus' story and Abram, Moses and Elijah's experience of God on a mountaintop, where each has a life-changing encounter with the presence of God and is illuminated in every way. Each of them is called by God to fulfil a special task and so descend from the mountain with the strength to see it through.

Matthew is especially interested in the story of Moses. One of the refrains of the entire Gospel is that Jesus is the New Moses, the fulfilment of the law and the light that illuminates the darkest night. As interesting as the similarities are between Moses on Sinai and Jesus on Tabor, the differences are even more revealing for us. Moses goes up the mountain alone, Jesus takes companions with him who share in the experience and witness to it. The face of God is hidden from Moses whereas on Tabor Jesus is given to us as the face of God for the world. On Sinai Moses receives a code of law and is told to make sure the people obey it. On Tabor Jesus receives a proclamation of God's love and we're told to listen to him. While Moses' face shines, Jesus' whole body is transfigured with light. Moses descends to enforce the law; Jesus comes down to die that we might live.

On a much gentler scale, Sunday Mass is meant to be a weekly mountaintop experience for us where we hear God call us by name and confess his love for us; where we feel re-energised for the commission we have to bear his light to the world.

The God of Mount Tabor is not interested in each of us feeling isolated as we fulfil the letter of a legal code. He wants all of us to have hearts that listen to the Gospel of love so that we can gain the power to transform the world through the sacrifices of our daily lives.

Feasts & Memorials of the Week



Tuesday—St Mary of the Cross

Mary MacKillop was born in Fitzroy, Melbourne, in 1842, the eldest child of Scottish immigrants. In 1861 she moved to the small town of Penola in

South Australia, where she met Fr Julian Tenison Woods. Together they established Australia's first free Catholic school. In 1866 she co-founded Australia's first religious order, the Sisters of St Joseph, and took a vow of poverty. Soon there were 17 schools under her care, but Mary's refusal to abide by the rules of the Bishop in Adelaide led to her excommunication from the church. She was accepted back a year later and eventually shown respect by the Bishops for her work with the poor. Mary was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1995, as a result of a woman who was cured of leukaemia in 1961 after a

group offered prayers to Sister Mary. She was canonised by Pope Benedict XVI on 17 October 2010 and is now known as St Mary of the Cross.



Thursday—St Lawrence

St Lawrence was a deacon who lived in Rome at a time when Christians were being persecuted. He was closely associated with Pope Sixtus II,

who was martryed a few days before Lawrence at the hands of Emperor Valerian. Popular tradition tells of Lawrence's rather gruesome death by fire, although he was most likely executed with a sword, which was the usual method of capital punishment at the time. He became one of the early church's most popular martrys and was especially renowned for his alms giving. Together with St Steven, Lawrence is a patron of deacons.



Friday—St Clare

St Clare of Assisi was born in Italy in 1194 AD to a wealthy noble family. As a child she was devoted to prayer and at the age of eighteen she heard St Francis of Assisi preach and

she was inspired to follow his example, despite the protestations of her family. After living a life of strict poverty with the Benedictine nuns, she eventually lead a new order known as the "Poor Ladies of San Damiano". For a time the order was directed by St Francis himself, and Clare cared for him in his final days. In 1224 the Prussian King, Frederick II led an army to take the town of Assisi. It is believed that Clare faced the army carrying only the Blessed Sacrament, and that suddenly the army was overcome with fear and fled. Ten years after her death in 1253, her order became known as the Order of St Clare.

Letter from the Principal, Trinity Catholic College

August 1, 2017

Dear Parent and Caregivers

I am pleased to confirm that tuition fees in 2018 will be restricted to the usual 'cost of living' increases (generally between 2% and 5% each year). The fee schedule for 2018 has not yet been released, but I felt it was important following intense media coverage last term, to reassure you that there will be no significant changes to the fees at our school.

Thanks to the support of our families and parishioners, changes to Government funding have been delayed, and Sydney Catholic Schools have assured us that at least for 2018, 2019 and 2020 we hope to be in a position to continue to maintain similar tuition fees.

I recognise the sacrifices that parents and caregivers make when they choose a Catholic education and our Catholic School system is committed to keeping our schools affordable for our families. If any family is in financial difficulty I invite you to approach me for a confidential discussion.

Families on very low incomes will be able to apply for 'means-tested' bursaries to assist with the education of their children through the Catholic Education Foundation. I once again reaffirm that no Catholic child should be denied a Catholic education due to a genuine inability to pay fees.

SCS will continue to advocate to all sides of politics for a more equitable financial outcome for our schools and students. As the Federal government conducts its review into some aspects of funding, we will continue to keep you informed. We look forward to your continued support as we engage our politicians in deepening their understanding of our school system and the importance of supporting parent choice in education.

I am deeply appreciative of the trust and confidence that you have placed in us, in sending your child to our school.
