Reflections Historical Context. Chief Priests & Tax Collectors

Only men of the Israelite tribe of Levi could become Priests and Levites. Men from the other eleven tribes were prohibited. It was not a religious 'call' but rather a fact of birth that led men to be priests. The chief priests and high priest performed all the rituals in the Temple in Jerusalem—it was they who performed sacrifices on behalf of others. They were very important and influential. Tax collectors were regarded poorly because they acted on behalf of the Romanscollecting revenue for an occupying and pagan force. They made their living by collecting extra amounts. They were looked down upon most people.

From the Perspective of a Tax Collector

Hey, Jesus is talking about me again! I love it when he says that I'm better than some of those stuck up chief priests. All my life they've looked down on me; pretending they're better than me. I've seen the way some of them behave when they think no-one's watching! They're no better than me! And Jesus says that people like me will enter the kingdom before people like them! Yes! I know I've done the wrong thing plenty of times Jesus has helped me to see that. Maybe that's what makes me different from those priests; I don't pretend that I've never done anything wrong.

Living the Gospel. Saying 'Yes!'

In many ways, it is easy to say 'Yes' and not really mean it. Some people do it all the time in their lives. They say 'Yes' when they have no intention at all of following through on their commitment. It's easy to say 'Yes' and not mean it when it comes to faith as well. It's pretty easy to turn up at Church on a Sunday and be seen to be doing the 'right' thing. But if our faith doesn't change the way we live, then maybe we're really saying 'No' to God.

Walk the Talk for the Kingdom

It is only through lives which speak to a society in danger of losing its soul that Christianity will give evidence of the Kingdom. Lately there enough reason to fear that Christian Community and society at large are in the danger of losing its soul. Last Wednesday was the memorial of an extraordinary man, Vincent de Paul, through whose life the people of France and elsewhere recaptured the Christian soul of the society. He did it by taking up the challenges of serving the poor. His legacy is carried on through the Congregation of Mission and Sisters of Charity. For Vincent de Paul, professing his faith was not enough. He wanted to live it out.



We will be hosting a regional Mass for the Society of St Vincent de Paul on 20th October. It will be a celebration of men and women who are serving the poor in the same spirit as St Vincent de Paul. This is just one example of capturing the spirt of the parable when Jesus said: "A man had two sons. He went to the first and said to him, Son go and work in my vineyard today.' And the son answered: 'I will not go'. But later he thought better of it and went. The father went to the second and said the same thing. This son replied: 'I will go, sir'. But he did not go." (Mt 21:28-30) now the question was which of these two did the father's will.

Humanitarian activities are not as much a challenging thing to undertake in a humanistic society like ours. But it is much more challenging to opt for the moral life and religious freedom in a time when many rich and powerful people look at the religion with contempt. Even some of the institutions within the Catholic Church, for the fear of losing their institutional clout, shush the faithful who stand up for the Kingdom and its values. In such a situation, Jesus' answer is what he told the Pharisees and the Scribes when they questioned the authority of Jesus. A repentant sinner who lives the gospel ways has a better chance of entering the Kingdom than the best professionals who just only speak about the Gospel. So we need to walk the talk to inherit the talk. There is no substitute for it.

Feasts & Memorials of the Week

Monday—The Holy Guardian Angels



The cult of Michael, Gabriel and Raphael began in the East. In the West, this day first marked the dedication of a fifth century church of Saint Michael in Rome. This festival of Michaelmas came to be very popular and widely celebrated in medieval Europe. Raphael and Gabriel were added to the Roman calendar in the twentieth century, and the three are now celebrated together. In the Scriptures (for example, Revelation 12:7-9, Luke 1:26-38, Tobit 3:16-25), each of the three angels is named as a messenger of God, entrusted with special divine missions on earth.

30 September St Jerome Born about 340 at Strido on the Adriatic coast. Died in Bethlehem on this day in 420. Baptised in Rome while studying the classics, became a hermit in Syria for a time and was ordained a priest. Later retained as papal secretary by

Saint Damasus (11 December). Began work on a new Latin translation of the Bible, known as the Vulgate. Finally settling in Bethlehem where he founded monasteries, he devoted himself to studying the Scriptures, writing, and teaching. Often irascible and intolerant, he is remembered for his asceticism and scholarship and, above all, for his incomparable service to the word of God.

Wednesday—St Francis of Assisi



St Francis of Assisi was born the son of a wealthy merchant of Assisi in 1181. After a conversion experience as a young man, St Francis renounced his inheritance and even his clothes, instead wearing the simple

garments given to him by the bishop of Assisi. Living a life of extreme poverty, St Francis preached in the streets, begged for his sustenance, served the sick and lived in harmony with nature. After attracting followers, he founded the Franciscan order in 1209. He continued living in poverty, preaching and working with lepers. In 1221 he resigned as the head of the Franciscans.

After living in meditation on Mount Alvernia he received the stigmata, which bled periodically for the remaining two years of his life. His prayer, 'Canticle of the Sun', epitomises St Francis' communion with God and the universe and makes him an obvious patron of environmental causes.

Saturday—Our Lady of the Rosary



This commemoration was established in 1573 in thanksgiving for a Christian victory over the Ottoman forces at Lepanto. It entered the general calendar in the eighteenth century. It is a memorial of the Virgin Mary as

honoured in the rosary, a form of prayer combining the salutation of the angel (Luke 1:28) with meditation on the saving mysteries of Christ. Originally the rosary was the laity's "psalter," the Hail Marys replacing the 150 psalms.
