First Reading

Is 5:1-7

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen only a cry of distress

Mt 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'

Reflections

Scriptural Context. Fulfilling Prophecy

Matthew's whole recount of this parable is dependant upon the reader/listener's familiarity with earlier writings within the Old Testament. We are fortunate that the designers of the lectionary have included the relevant passages as the first reading and psalm for this Sunday's readings. The original audience would have drawn on their own familiarity with the texts and recognised Jesus' words as echoing those of Isaiah and the psalmist. Matthew's gospel was particularly keen to cast Jesus in the image of fulfilling the prophecies of the Jewish tradition. Throughout Matthew's gospel we see the author placing the words of prophecy in Jesus' mouth or using the narration to confirm that Jesus performed actions to fulfil the words of the prophets.

Have You Thought?

One of the images from this gospel that would have been puzzling to the audience and may have tipped them off that Jesus was telling a parable with a particular message, is the image of the landowner being incredibly benevolent and tolerant of his rebellious tenants. Jesus' audience would have known that the law was always on the side of a landowner over his tenants. Any misdeed by a tenant farmer would have been dealt with swiftly and severely and yet the landowner in Jesus' story (God) is almost unbelievably patient and prepared to give the tenants every opportunity to do the right thing.

Living the Gospel. Different View—Using Scripture to Justify Hatred

This text is one that has been used by some Christians to justify their hatred and persecution of Jews. They point to the parable Jesus told as evidence that Jesus blamed the Jewish people for his death. It is a strange fact that some people believe that the only way to justify their own beliefs is to try to destroy the beliefs (and believers) of other faiths. For hundreds of years Christians abused and tormented Jews, driving them out of cities and even countries. The terrible treatment of Jews in World War II was drawing on a long history of Christians persecuting Jews.

You are the Corner Stone

Last Thursday I hosted the Ministers Fraternity at Berala, with pastors from different denominations in Auburn Berala area. One of the major concerns raised at the meeting was 'what a mess our country Australia is in, because of the recent attacks on the institution of marriage, attack on the sacredness of life by pro Euthanasia lobby, and so on'. Looking at these developments one might ask whether we are heading towards some kind of devastation? A similar question was asked in the eighth century BC.



About seven centuries before Christ, prophet Isaiah spoke, to the people of God, using the allegories of vineyard which produced only sour grapes. The owner was so disappointed by the lack of proper fruit from the vineyard that he abandoned it to be ransacked by foreigners. (Ref. Is 5:1-7) The prophet was speaking of the punishment awaiting Israel for not producing the fruits God wanted of them. Losing the Land and vineyard was seen then as losing the foundation their religion and community by Israelites. Isaiah warned them of the punishment of the Lord coming on them.

When Jesus told the parable of the wicked tenants who ill-treated the servants of the landowner, and killed the son of the landowner, (Mt 21:33-46) the Jewish people were reminded of the punishment foretold by prophet Isaiah. But unlike the prophecy of Isaiah, Jesus had a good news for them. Though the trusted people betrayed their trust and invited devastation on themselves, Jesus Christ will be the foundation of the Church. "The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. This was the Lord's doing, and we marvel at it." (Mt21:42)The 'Son' of God who was neglected and killed by the trusted people has become the corner stone, the foundation of the Kingdom of God.

If Christ is the cornerstone, the foundation of the Kingdom of God, then you and I are part of it. Because you and I are joined with Christ's body at Holy Communion. Therefore, like Christ, we too are to be the corner stone for the Kingdom of God. Let the world marvel at how we stand firm as the foundation of the Kingdom face of rejection and violence. The secular society may challenge and attack our faith and religious practices. The builders of the secular society may consider you as irrelevant to community building. You may be the stone rejected by the builders, but God has made you the corner stone, the foundation of the Kingdom of Heaven.

A WhatsApp Message

During the week I received a WhatsApp message from one of the parishioners. It should be of some amusement for you. Therefore here it is:

A priest that I heard of, if and when he sees people leave Church early (especially after receiving Holy Communion), stops them and reminds them that only one person left the Last Supper early!

Well, I am not going to do that, but I am tempted to do what St. Philip Neri did: He saw someone leaving church right after Communion and he sent servers with candles and bells to accompany the man.

The guy stormed back into the church and confronted the priest. "What kind of joke is this?" he demanded.

St. Philip Neri said, "It's no joke. The rules of the liturgy say the Blessed Sacrament should be treated with reverence. You left the Church immediately with no prayer of thanksgiving. You were carrying the Blessed Sacrament within you. So I asked the boys to accompany you to honor Him."

After Communion you and I are tabernacles - the physical presence of Jesus continues in us for a brief time. That's why we have the Communion hymn, a time of silence, the Communion Prayer - and even the announcements - to build up the Body of Christ in practical ways.

I encourage you to use well the time after Communion to say thanks, to express your gratitude.


