Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time—Year A

12 November 2017

First Reading Wis 6:12-16

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim. By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her. Quick to anticipate those who desire her, she makes herself known to them. Watch for her early and you will have no trouble; you will find her sitting at your gates. Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for her and anxiety will quickly leave you. She herself walks about looking for those who are worthy of her and graciously shows herself to them as they go, in every thought of theirs coming to meet them.

Second Reading 1 Thes 4:13-18

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be

the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

Gospel Mt 25:1-13

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five of them were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

Reflections

Historical Context: Where was the bride?

It may seem a little odd that the bridegroom was travelling to the wedding hall by himself. What appears to have been the custom is that the bridesmaids escorted the bride to the hall whilst the groom remained behind to settle matters with the bride's family. Whilst the bride price, or dowry, would have been agreed well before the wedding, the family would emphasise and even haggle over the value of gifts to further reinforce the great value of the bride and the wise choice that the groom and his family has made.

From the Perspective of a Bridesmaid.

My friend, Miriam, was married yesterday. She is 14, two years older

than me, and has married a fine man. As we waited to receive her husband, some of the girls ran out of oil. They asked me for some of my oil but I knew that if I gave them my spare oil we might all run out before he arrived and then there would be no one to welcome him and light his way. What shame that would be! Miriam and her husband were so angry, they didn't allow the girls into the hall. No one will ask them to be bridesmaids again!

Living the Gospel: Living in Hope

A feature of Christian faith is an approach to life that views the future with hope. In our world today many people look to the future with distrust and even fear. As Christians, we look forward with hope. When change occurs, some allow that change to happen to them whilst others engage in the change process and approach it with hope and expectation. Today's gospel reminds us to be ready for what the future holds; to look with hope towards what lies ahead, but to ensure that we've prepared ourselves properly. The future can only be viewed with expectant hope if we've done the proper preparation!

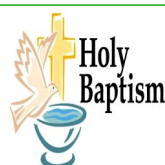

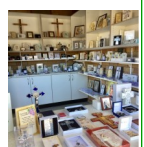

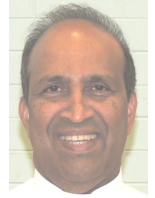

Not All Doors Open Automatically



Going to my local Bank, as soon as I reach the front door it opens automatically. Because they want my business. Then there is another door inside building to the operations area. Though they still want my business, this door does not open for me, because I am not eligible. It opens only to the selected few who are qualified to go in. It is typical of our human life. Some doors open automatically for us. There are general services available to everyone who approaches the door of life. But to get into the core of the business of living and to have control of the account of our life, like a banker, one needs to be specially qualified and should know the passcode.

The door was initially open to the ten virgins waiting for the Bridegroom to arrive. But it is only a matter of time before the foolish five realised that the door does not automatically open to them always. They should have been better prepared from the time of their first entry. They should have secured enough oil to last the whole time of waiting. Instead they were like the people who are too much bogged down with the pleasures and joys the world would offer them immediately. Such people are not wise enough to have enough of good work and preparation in their spiritual life to meet the Lord when the time comes.

Preparedness from the first entry, from the time of baptism onwards, is what is required to enter into the Kingdom of God. To illustrate this the Gospel of Matthew tells the story of the ten virgins waiting for the Bridegroom to arrive. In the traditional weddings of Jesus time, the bride and groom are given a solemn reception when they come to Bridegroom's house after the ceremonies at the Bride's house. Usually the Groom stays back to settle the contract and the bride price while the bride goes to her newlywed husband's house. The bargain over the value of gifts and so on. It can be a long process of bargains. Therefore there is no certainty when the bridegroom will return. The maids to welcome the newly wed can only wait patiently. This is the background of the story of ten virgins.

Baptism is like the time all virgins who got into the hall in the first place. Then if you did not keep up with charity and devotional life, you are like the five virgins who got out looking for more oil to keep their lamps burning. But it could be too late like the disappointed virgins who kept on knocking at the door. But the Bridegroom from inside rejected them utterly, "I do not know you". Surely you do not want to have the same misfortune like these foolish virgins.

Friday – St Elizabeth of Hungary (Memorial)

Born in Bratislava (Slovakia) in 1207. Married at the age of fourteen, widowed at twenty, and died at twenty-four in Marburg (Germany) on this day in 1231. Mother of three children, happily married to Ludwig of Thuringia. When Ludwig died of the plague while on crusade, she continued to protect the poor and founded orphanages and hospitals, living this life of service as a Franciscan tertiary despite the hostility of her relatives and the harshness of her confessor. Remembered for her good-humoured resilience in adversity and for her humility in menial service of the needy.

Change of Mass Schedule

A few weeks ago I proposed to the Sunday 8AM Congregation at St Joseph the Worker Church that from the New Year 2018 the Sunday Morning Mass be shifted from Auburn South to SPC Berala. I arrived at this proposal after considering the declining number of Mass attendance, the efforts required each Sunday morning to set up the church for Mass, and related matters. Only 50% of the 60 or so people who attend 8AM mass are from the vicinity of SJW Church. Moving the 8AM Mass to Berala would make things easier for me as well. Setting up promotional materials and conducting appeals will be easier if it is all done at SPC only. The materials need to be set up only once and they can stay for the following weeks if necessary. Whenever a visiting priest is to celebrate Mass in my absence, I need not anticipate ways and people to get bags and materials to SJW and back. Since I invited the people to comment on the proposal, most of the comments I had were supportive of the move, though a few thought otherwise. One of the major concern of some of the people was the transportation to Mass and back. The parish can organise transportation for those who require it.

Considering all factors, I would like to propose that Sunday 31 December 2017 be the last Sunday Mass at SJW. From Sunday 7 January 2018 onwards we shall have all weekend Masses, including 8 AM Mass, at St Peter Chanel Berala. I would like confirm a decision by the end of this month. Should you have any comments or concerns about it, please do not hesitate to contact me.

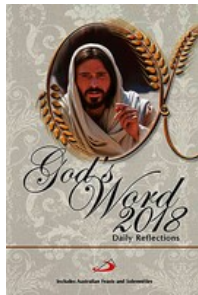
