Third Sunday of Advent - Year B

17 December 2017

First Reading Is 61:1-2. 10-11

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. 'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels. 'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

Second Reading 1 Thes 5:16-24

Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God, because this is what God expects you to do in Christ Jesus. Never try to suppress the Spirit or treat the gift of prophecy with contempt; think before you do anything – hold on to what is good and avoid every form of evil. May the God of peace make you perfect and holy; and may you all be kept safe and blameless, spirit, soul and body, for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Gospel Jn 1:6-8. 19-28

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.' Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandalstrap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

Reflections on John 1:6-8. 19-28

Have You Thought? A time to Rejoice! This Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word for Rejoice! Advent was originally celebrated as a five week season and with the same fasting and penitential nature as the season of Lent. The third Sunday, Gaudete, was like a break for rejoicing in the midst of the fasting. When Advent was reduced to four weeks and the nature of the season altered, Gaudete Sunday was retained. The colour of this Sunday is rose—a celebratory colour—and it is reflected in the vestments worn by the priest and in the colour of the third candle used in Advent wreaths.

Living the Gospel: A Witness? Me? It came as something of a surprise to me to think that other people might observe the way I treated others and draw conclusions about my motivation. It was when I started to work with young people that the truth of this was revealed. I realised that my actions could speak so much louder than anything I might say. I hoped that the young people I was working with might stop sme time and think to themselves, 'I wonder why he treats us all that way? I wonder how it fits with that religion stuff he talks about?' Well, I can hope can't I?

Gospel Focus: Same but Different Having the same gospel passage from two different gospels used in the liturgy in consecutive weeks is an ideal opportunity to highlight the different focus adopted by the different gospels. The language of John's gospel is remarkably different from that of the three synoptic gospels (synoptic = 'seen together'). The synoptics share a fairly common narrative style, while John relies much more on metaphor and imagery -it is a more poetic language. In the gospel account of John the Baptist we see in John's gospel greater emphasis on the conversion around what was occurring, while the Markan version emphasises recording the event.

Johnny told mum that some of the toys she bought are girls' toys and how come she bought them for him. Mum told him, "Dear they are not for you. We are going to gift wrap them and place them under the Christmas tree in the Church." Jonny asked, "Why?" Mummy explained to him that there are children out there who are too poor to get toys and gifts this Christmas. Therefore the Society of St Vincent de Paul of the parish is collecting these gifts through the church and making hampers to distribute to the poor families. Mummy also told her child the importance of sharing and the need to look after the welfare of others. Making others happy is our happiness. Surely this mother was training her child not to be selfish in his life but to be other-centred in his life.

The most destructive sin is selfishness and self-centeredness. Self-centredness is the seed of greed and violence. It also can generate unhealthy pride and arrogance. Turning away from this sin is very important to receive God's gifts. John the Baptist baptised people who confessed their sins and prayed for the forgiveness of their sins. John who came to make a path straight for the Lord, was focussed on repentance and renewal in life. Australians as a rule like to help people in need. Most people in our country are prepared to make sacrifices in their lives to help others. We are living in a humanitarian society. As we participate in many charity activities, we are doing what John the Baptist is asking for, turning away from self-centeredness to other-centeredness. So far so good.

John the Baptist does not stop there. He told them that his baptism is only a preparation for something more profound. There is someone greater than him is coming after him. That is Jesus Christ. John through his call for repentance was preparing the way for Jesus Christ to come. John the Baptist asked his followers to turn to Jesus and follow him, because he is the saviour.

So if we can't be just content with our works of charity and humanitarian concerns. Our spirituality should go much beyond being good and useful for others. Then we will be in tune with what John the Baptist is calling us to do. We as Christians should do more than being good people. We need to follow Jesus Christ. Let us acknowledge Christ as our Saviour and connect with him by praying with Bible and participating in Eucharist. See your works of charity and self-sacrifices as preparation to receive Christ. Final Report by the Royal Commission for Institutional Response to Child Sexual Abuse

The Royal Commission has handed over to Governor General on Friday 15 December, its report on the institutional response to child sexual abuse. It is a massive 17 volume document covering nearly five years of hearing. The leaders of the Church will be studying the report. Meanwhile Archbishop Anthony Fisher has issued a statement. He said, "Many told their stories with great courage, even at great personal cost, revisiting traumatic experiences. I say again how sorry I am that you were hurt in this way by people you should have been able to trust. I hope the release of this report provides some comfort to you, your family and friends with the determination that what has been revealed in the pages of this report can never be repeated." He also said, "I can assure you I will not rest there and I commit myself and the Catholic Church in Sydney to do our best for survivors of abuse to ensure this terrible chapter is never repeated.

We will, I pray, be a humbler, purer, more compassionate Church as a result of the Commission's work and the scrutiny we have received. "

2018 Year of Youth: Open new horizons for spreading joy

The Parishioners may know Sister Dorothy Bayliss who returned to South Sudan to be missionary there. She has returned from South Sudan, due to ill health. I visited her last Wednesday. After some rest and a retreat she will be moving to Brisbane to resume a ministry with Refugees, Asylum Seekers, the Homeless and with Trafficked Women and Girls. Sr Dorothy said,

"My arrival there where my little clinic was situated was a horrific scene I was shocked to see the change and to hear what the people have been suffering for month.

Just outside my door were thousands of men women and children who had fled from various areas due to the ongoing violence and killings. I was the lone person offering medical attention so once again it was a 24/7 days a week which I didn't mind but got a bit tired especially from the night calls."

She went on tell about the circumstances that made her to leave South Sudan. "In the camp I fell and broke a bone in my right hand, badly bruised my hip but tried to manage until I got pneumonia and a severe case of malaria my first ever in all my years on mission.

As there was no medical help readily available I had to come home for treatment, which broke my heart. I am now feeling very much better thank God except for the heart ache that goes with leaving the suffering poor, and not understanding God's plan in all of this.

I know now that my time in SS has come to an end, which is very sad but I know God has His own plan so I am trusting in Him which I have always tried to do all of my years."



She also wished all parishioners and friends peace and blessings for this festive season.




