THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

7 JANUARY 2018

First Reading Is 60:1-6

Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising on you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples. Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. The nations come to your light and kings to your dawning brightness. Lift up your eyes and look round: all are assembling and coming towards you, your sons from far away and your daughters being tenderly carried. At this sight you will grow radiant, your heart throbbing and full; since the riches of the sea will flow to you; the wealth of the nations come to you; camels in throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense and singing the praise of the Lord.

Second Reading Eph 3:2-3. 5-6

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been revealed through the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets was unknown to any men in past generations; it means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body, and that the same promise has been made to them, in Christ Jesus, through the gospel.

Gospel Mt 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet wrote: And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

Visiting Jesus will Change your Life

During the Christmas and New Year season I rang friends and family back in India to greet them. Such calls is also an occasion to share news. One of them told me the good news about a neighbour who had a gambling problem. He went to a one week Bible Convention and returned as a new man. His life was totally changed. He professed to have experienced Jesus Christ in this Bible Convention. Now he wants to live for Jesus Christ. This is not an isolated story. There are many people with such stories of conversion in Kerala, India. No wonder Bible Conventions, which also are called retreats, are very popular in this part of the world.



The wise men from the east who visited baby Jesus in Bethlehem also had a conversion experience. According to the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 2:12) after seeing baby Jesus and acknowledging him as the Christ (saviour) the wise men did not go to the power and glory of the worldly king Herod, but went a 'different way' home. Matthew is not speaking about the physical path here. He is referring to a 'different way of life' of the wise men who had encountered Jesus and accepted him as their saviour.

The gifts the wise men presented to Jesus meant a lot more than our Christmas gifts. We might have been exchanging gifts as a mark of our good will and appreciation of each other. But the wise men from the east offered gold to represent the divinity of the child. The gift of frankincense is a symbol of holiness and righteousness. Myrrh was a spice and was used in embalming. Therefore it represented the redeeming sacrifice of Christ on the Cross and his entombment before his resurrection. It is not the historicity of this story that matters. Matthew wants to make a point. By telling us about the wise men from the east visiting baby Jesus in Bethlehem, Matthew announces that Jesus is born not just for the Jews but for the whole world. Have you been following the signs of hope like the wise men? Have you acknowledged Jesus as your saviour? If you have, it will transform your way of life!

REFLECTIONS ON MATTHEW 2:1-12

Have you Thought? Epiphany

The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus to humankind. The wise men are the representatives of humanity bearing witness to this revelation. However, the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as not only the Messiah of Israel but the Saviour of the whole world. Interestingly, in this gospel that emphasises the 'Jewish-ness' of Jesus, the witnesses to the birth are gentiles from a foreign land. Their inclusion is a powerful declaration that the revelation of Jesus is for all people. Regardless of the liturgical year, this reading is always used on the feast of Epiphany to celebrate this pivotal moment.

Historical Context: The Magi

In some translations, the 'wise men' of this passage are referred to as 'Magi'. Magi was the name given to the Persian priestly caste. Persia (now, Iran) lies to the east of Israel. These wise men are also sometimes portrayed as astrologers, but that is largely because of the reference "We saw his star as it rose'. It is interesting that the passage describes 'some' wise men; tradition has developed a specific number of three—based on the three gifts presented. These anonymous (and purely literary) figures have been given names and their 'relics' lie in honour beneath the Cathedral of Cologne.

Gospel Focus: Going Home

The wise men, or Magi, are warned in a dream not to go back to Herod and they go home by a different way. How could they do anything but go home another way—indeed, go home as different people? They are changed by their encounter with the child Jesus and they go home in a different way; in a different state; in a whole different frame of mind. When we genuinely encounter Jesus—in scripture, in life, in prayer, in ourselves—then we cannot go home the same way; we must go home by a different way as the Magi did.

Monday - The Baptism of the Lord

Drawing from the Eastern tradition of Epiphany, the West has remembered the baptism of the Lord on the octave of the Epiphany since the eighth century. Formally introduced into the Roman calendar in 1960 on the Sunday after the Epiphany, it now concludes the Christmas season. Commemorates the revelation of Jesus as God's beloved Son, the Christ, anointed by the Spirit.

Lenten Programs


