First Reading 1 Sm 3:3-10.19

Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am'. Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So from God. You are not your own property; you have he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eliand said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down'. Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place. The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel!, Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.' Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him and let no word of his fall to the ground.

Second Reading 1 Cor 6:13-15. 17-20

The body is not meant for fornication; it is for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. God, who raised the Lord from the dead, will by his power raise us up too. You know, surely, that your bodies are members

making up the body of Christ; anyone who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him. Keep away from fornication. All the other sins are committed outside the body; but to fornicate is to sin against your own body. Your body, you know, is the temple of the Holy Spirit, which is in you since you have received him been bought and paid for. That is why you should use your body for the glory of God.

Gospel

Jn 1:35-42

As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,' - which means Teacher - 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning. Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' – which means the Christ – and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' meaning Rock.

The Word of Mouth

My ministry in Berala has its beginning with a 'call'. One day in December 2011 I had a call from the Office of the Archbishop, Cardinal Pell. When I met him, he asked me to consider Berala and Auburn South parishes. Therefore my ministry for the last six years owes to that call. Arriving in my new parishes I had to establish or re-constitute the pastoral councils. Thus it was my turn to personally call volunteers to share ministry of pastoring the parish community with me. When it came to various programs like carols, Christmas luncheon, kids' camp and so on, the core team called more volunteers to join them in their ministry to the parish. This kind of chain process of call and response is what we see in the Gospel of John too.

John the Baptist shows his companions the 'Lamb of God'. Jesus calls them to where he lives. They realise who Jesus is; he is the Messiah. Andrew calls his Simon to Jesus experience. Thus they become a team helping Jesus in his ministry of the Kingdom of God. There are two things noteworthy in the Gospel account of the process of personal invitation. John the Baptist is not interested in keeping his followers as his own fans. His ministry is Christ-focussed and he guides his followers to Jesus the Lamb of God. Secondly, the people like Andrew who knew Jesus as the Messiah, personally invites others like Simon. Together they make a team to support the ministry and mission of Jesus.

Our Parish is here to continue the ministry of Jesus. The best practice we can follow is that of the 'Team Jesus'. As a parishioner come to personal encounter with Jesus through your personal prayer. Reading the Bible should be part of our personal prayer to encounter Jesus. Then tell others about your experience of Jesus. Invite them to celebrate the Jesus experience together with you in the Church. Traditionally too many of the parishioners were without any personal experience of Jesus Christ. Not many are good at sharing their faith with others. Therefore our church has been very dry for a long time. Now it is withering away. Therefore I need you to experience Jesus through personal prayers and support my ministry with your word of mouth. Nothing will be as effective as your word of mouth; sharing of your faith with others and your personal invitation to celebrate their faith with you in the church.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 1:35-42

Living the Gospel: Vocation

These days, the word 'vocation' seems to be applied to whatever job someone happens to find themselves in. More traditionally, the word carries with it a sense of undertaking work that has a deliberate purpose about it and that is outwardly focused. Usually, there is a sense that there is 'importance' to the work that it is linked to God's dream for the world. The Church has tended to use vocation in reference to religious life. The word comes from the Latin, vocare, meaning call or name. Realizing to what it is we are called can be one of the great challenges of life.

Have You Thought? Why disciples? Why did Jesus call a group of people to follow him closely and share in his ministry? Certainly, it was not uncommon at the time that a charismatic leader might attract a group of followers and 'hangers-on' but Jesus appears to have deliberately called some people to travel with him and share in what he was about. So much of what Jesus spoke about was living in right relationships: with God; and with one another. Rather than simply being a 'back-up grou' for Jesus, the disciples provided a lived example of trying to live in right relationships. They didn't always get it right, but they were on the way.

From the Perspective: The Disciples We'd been following John the Baptizer for nearly a year. He was a great man doing great work. He had called us to repent and baptized us in the river. We were so impressed with him that we began to follow him. There'd been plenty of other healers and preachers to follow but John seemed to be something specialsome had talked about him being the messiah! Then all of a sudden John pointed out Jesus and called him the lamb of God. There was something different about this man and it just seemed right to leave John behind and go with Jesus.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK



Wednesday - St Anthony, abbot

Born in 251 in upper Egypt. Died in 356. At an early age he gave away his possessions and sought the austere life and solitude in the desert. Yet he remained involved in the theological controversies of his day, defending the divinity of Christ. He attracted disciples who formed communities of hermits. The account of his life by Saint Athanasius (2 May) was extremely influential in the development and spread of monasticism. Remembered as the father of monasticism.
