Gospel Mk 1:21-28

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

Exorcise Modern Evil

Human trafficking and modern slavery takes different forms. It is an evil that needs to be eradicated. I am pleased to announce that Our Archbishop Anthony Fisher will be launching the Archdiocesan Anti-Slavery Task Force on Thursday, 8 February. It is the feast day of Saint Bakhita, Patron Saint of Sudan and Anti-Human Trafficking. The Archbishop will announce the strategies and initiatives in respect of supply chains, education and wider community engagement, all directed towards eradicating Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking. This initiative is the modern version of what Jesus did according to Mark 1:21-28. Jesus drove evil spirits out the people who were possessed. Thus Our Lord helped them to regain their God given dignity and freedom.

According to the Gospel account, the evil spirit shouted, "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God." (Mk 1:24) Through these words the evil spirit was trying to overpower Jesus. "But Jesus said sharply, "Be quiet! Come out of him!" (Mk 1:25) This dynamics has not changed even today. The evil forces in modern times too would try to intimidate anyone trying to exorcise them. The only response to such intimidation is that of Jesus, 'shut up and get your hands off our people'. Our people have the right to freedom and dignity and we are here to help them regain it. In doing so, we continue the ministry of Jesus, proclaiming the Kingdom of God. Collectively we are the Body of Christ. Therefore when we do it as a Church, we are presenting Christ to the world, especially to those who need salvation from the evils of Slavery and Human Trafficking.

Jesus was very effective because he spoke with authority. He was not just quoting Rabbis. When he spoke, it was with conviction and honesty. That was the authority which made his commands very effective. Therefore we too cannot just quote our Archbishop and the Holy Father Pope Francis and expect the evil of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking to go away. On 2 December 2013, Pope Francis signed the landmark Declaration on Anti-Slavery and Human Trafficking. Our Archbishop will launch the Task Force on 8 February. We, as a parish Community and the Body of Christ, need to own up to our ministry and make a conscious commitment. That is the way to join our ministry to Jesus' ministry of driving out the evils that destroy human freedom and dignity. So let us be like Jesus and exorcise the evils of the society with firm and conscious commitment.

REFLECTIONS ON MARK 1:21-28

Scriptural Context: The Messianic Secret

A feature of the Gospel of Mark is an element of secrecy and confusion that surrounds Jesus' identity. He silences demons who would announce his identity and warns those he heals to be quiet about what has occurred. There is a real lack of understanding displayed by the disciples about who Jesus is. At one point, Jesus asks the disciples, 'who do you think I am?' They identify him as the Messiah but immediately demonstrate that they don't really understand what that means. The theme that runs through the gospel is a developing understanding of what it means that Jesus is the Messiah.

Historical Context: He said what?

In an age when most people were illiterate, Jesus appears to have been quite well educated. Some suggest that he may have spoken three or four different languages. He obviously spoke everyday Aramaic, as it was spoken in that region. Jesus also appears to have been taught Hebrew, the language of religious texts and religious practice. Greek, the language of trade in marketplaces, was a language that Jesus probably used when helping Joseph sell his carpentry products at stalls and markets. Finally, Jesus probably picked up a reasonable amount of Latin, the language of the Roman occupiers—he was able to hold a conversation with Pontius Pilate.

Gospel Focus: Exorcisms

This week's gospel features an exorcism by Jesus—driving an unclean spirit out of a possessed man. Some people read these acts of exorcism as being literally true. Others are keen to demonstrate that these 'possessions' described in the gospels are able to be explained by various manifestations of mental illness. The thrashing fits described in the gospels have been likened to epileptic seizures and episodes of paranoia and schizophrenia might explain the first century understanding of possession. Rather than trying to justify or explain away these events, we must seek to understand the gospel writer's purpose in including such episodes.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK



Wednesday - St John Bosco
Born in Piedmont (Italy) in 1815. Died at
Turin on this day in 1888. Grew up in extreme
poverty and, after ordination, devoted his
whole life to educating young people,
especially the poor. Founded the Salesians,
men and women who continue this work with

youth throughout the world. Remembered – like the order's patron, St Francis de Sales (24 January) – for his cheerfulness and total trust in the providence of God.



Friday - The Presentation of the Lord
Feast originated in Jerusalem before the
fifth century and was adopted in Rome
during the seventh century. Celebrated forty
days after Christmas, commemorating the
prescribed Mosaic ritual following the birth
of a child, and recalling the encounter of
Jesus with Simeon and Anna in the temple.

Christ is "the light to enlighten all nations", and so candles are blessed during the introductory rites and carried in the entrance procession.
