First Reading Ex 20:1-17

God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. 'You shall have no gods except me. 'You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

While the Jews of wisdom, here are Jews on obstacle madness, but to the wisdom of God they are Jews or the wisdom, human wisdom, human strength.

'You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. You shall do no work on that day, neither you nor your son nor your daughter nor your servants, men or women, not your animals nor the stranger who lives with you. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that these hold, but on the seventh day he rested; that is why the Lord has blessed the sabbath day and made it sacred.

'Honour your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God has given to you.

'You shall not kill.

'You shall not commit adultery.

'You shall not steal.

'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour. 'You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his servant, man or woman, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is his.'

Second Reading 1 Cor 1:22-25

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Gospel Jn 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.'

LECTOR FOR MASS

Maintain the Integrity of the House of God

When I came to Berala, there were a lot of things I had to make right. There was the leaking roof to fix, deteriorating windows to attend, fans to be installed, as so on. To keep up the maintenance which was neglected for many years was very challenging. But they were nothing compared to maintaining the integrity of the Parish as the House of God.

Jesus found the Jerusalem temple fundamentally lacking integrity. Therefore he demanded purification of the temple and restoring its integrity as the house of God. According to John, it is not just the temple built with stone and mortar that Jesus was speaking about. (Ref Jn2:13-25) He is referring to the real Temple (or House) of God. That which is built by human hands will wither away, as did the temple of Jerusalem in 70 AD. But we have a new temple which is not made by human hands, that is Jesus Christ himself. With his resurrection, Jesus Christ has replaced the temple and all that is associated with it.

Through our Holy Communion in Eucharist, we become part of Christ's Body. Together with all who make Holy Communion with Christ, we become the physical Body of Christ. In other words we are the new Temple or House of God. Coming together for Holy Communion on Sundays, our Parish is the Body of Christ. Therefore it is important for us to keep the integrity our Parish as the new Temple, the Body of Christ. How do we do it?

The purpose of any temple is to help find wholeness of life and holiness of human life. Whatever that is not helping us to realise the wholeness and the holiness of our life is to be given up. If gossip is depleting our life, we give it up to make our life more respectable. If greed for money is our focus, then find enough strength to say no to such profits. It is not easy when it involves huge financial benefits. Therefore this Lent should be a time to give up shoddy practices. It is a time to say no to any involvement with immoral practices to gain money. If our pleasure in eating is affecting negatively on our wholeness in our God given life, then it is important to give up gluttony. All these may not be easy. The again cleansing of Jerusalem temple was not for the faint hearted. According to the Gospels when Jesus did it, it was like a rage.

In this Lent let us give up all that is not fitting to the House of God. Let us discipline ourselves to subvert the sinful practices and the bad habits. No more nagging of family members. No more foul language. No more excuses. Then if we come together to celebrate Eucharist and enter into Holy Communion with God, we make our gatherings (Parish) a House of Prayer acceptable to God. Thus we become the worthy Body of Christ, bringing great witness to the World. Let us to be Good News to the World around us.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 2:13-25

Have you thought? Mountaintop Moments

Throughout the Bible there are instances of important encounters with God on mountaintops. Even this week's first reading, the sacrifice of Isaac by Abraham, occurs on a mountaintop. It is not the potential sacrifice, but the new relationship between God and Abraham that is a mountaintop moment. In modern language, we often speak about 'peak experiences' - moments of exceptional clarity, intense emotion or extraordinary accomplishment. Sometimes, like Peter, we are tempted to try to remain 'in the moment' rather than using the peak experience as a motivator for when we go back down

the mountain to our normal (if perhaps changed) existence.

Scriptural Context: Not quite.

Throughout the gospel of Mark, it is important to look at the stories that lie either side of important events to pick up the subtlety of the gospel writer's message. In this instance, the passage that immediately follows the Transfiguration is a story of the disciples trying unsuccessfully to heal a boy and Jesus having to intervene. It reinforces the message of the mountain top in which the disciples still only partially understand Jesus' purpose and presence. They still haven't fully mastered who Jesus is and so they have not fully mastered the ability to heal.

Gospel Focus: A new vision.

Part of Peter's mistake is to see the appearance of Elijah and Moses as a confirmation that Jesus has come to continue the work of the great prophets of the past. Rather than placing Jesus in the old tradition of the prophets, the appearance of Elijah and Moses, together with the voice of God, is to endorse the new direction that Jesus' ministry is taking. Jesus' new vision for the world is informed by the relationships forged between God and the prophets of the past, but it is a vision of a completely different way of relating to God: a much more personal relationship that calls us to respond from the heart to those around us.


