Don't Park Your Religion, Move with Christ to the Kingdom of God

You have been practicing self-discipline through fasting. You were generous in alms giving though Project Compassion or otherwise. You were praying specially during this Lent. You also have been using the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the Holy Week. Now we have come to it. Today we commence the Holy Week with blessing of Palms and procession with it, remembering the solemn entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. This Palm Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday.



The word 'passion' normally used to mean 'compelling love' or 'boundless enthusiasm'. But the name 'Passion' for this Sunday is from the Latin word 'passio' meaning suffering. In fact what we remember and celebrate today is the love of God the Father who gave his only Son suffering of a sacrifice to remission of our sins. Jesus the Son of God was full of his Father's love that He walked the way of the Cross. Even when everyone, including his chosen disciples deserted him, Jesus did not waiver. Even when the thought of the coming crucifixion was so agonising, he prayed in Gethsemane, "let it be as you, not I, would have it". No amount of mockery or violence dissuaded Our Lord from the self-Sacrifice on the Cross for our sins.

Though the execution of Christ on the cross was a scandal for many people, the Early Christians preached it boldly because they knew that Christ is not lost, the risen Christ is still with them. Since then all generations preached Cross everywhere. We too preach and celebrate it today. It is because we know, just as the early Christians did, the Cross on the Calvary was not the end of the story. Resurrection followed it and Christ has won victory over death.

Now the question is how passionate are we in our preaching of the crucified Christ. Are we ready and willing to walk the way of the Cross as Jesus did? We don't want to park our religion and get nowhere. We want to move with Christ and get to the Kingdom of God.

REFLECTIONS ON MARK 14:1 – 15:47

Living the Gospel. Before the cock crows.

Peter is an interesting character in the gospels. He is one of the first of the disciples to be called; Jesus changes his name and places great trust I him; he is witness to the most significant moments of Jesus' life; he is able to profess his faith in Jesus as the Christ and yet it is he who denies even knowing Jesus. We might have thought that Peter was Jesus' most loyal and faithful follower, yet it is he who can't stand up and claim that he was a follower of Jesus. Is it any wonder that it is difficult for us today sometimes?

Have You Thought? Passion of the Passion

The Passion narrative is very aptly named. The emotion and power of this story is nothing short of passionate. The gospel writer's style of fast paced, unadorned factual narrative is a very effective way of helping the reader/ listener to engage in the story. It is, after all, the first half of the most important Christian story—finished off by the resurrection that is celebrated on Easter Sunday. It is easy to see why this stark, narrative style was embellished and expanded upon by the later gospel writers and yet it is perhaps the more passionate for the lack of explanation and theologising.

Gospel Focus: This Man was a Son of God

By the time we have stood and listened to this lengthy Passion narrative, the listener may have started to wilt by the time we get to the death of Jesus. Yet, the gospel writer keeps one of the most important messages for this moment. As Jesus dies, a centurion standing by utters the inspired words, 'In truth, this man was a son of God.' Famously played by John Wayne in the movie, The Greatest Story Ever Told, the centurion is the voice of the gentile - the non-Jew - representing all those throughout the world who will recognise the truth of Jesus' life and purpose.



To the people of the Church of Australia, on GOOD FRIDAY 2018 -

Since 2011, the civil war in Syria has inflicted unspeakable suffering on the people. The Franciscan friars are still doggedly present in demolished cities such as Damascus, Homs and Aleppo.

"Welcome to Aleppo!" The road sign reads like a joke. But the town has slowly started to come back to life. Some Christian families have heard that the Church is ready to donate a first-aid food package, also to assist in rebuilding their damaged homes and to help a father to find a job. They have decided to return home. Parish Priest Fr Ibrahim Alsabagh OFM sees this as a great sign of hope for the exhausted local community and for the Franciscans who have always been alongside the people. "It encourages us to keep on going."

Visiting Aleppo, Fr Luke OFM from Rhodes reports, "Our friars and nuns really have done a wonderful job. The two Catholic hospitals have remained open throughout. The soldiers are used to seeing the Franciscans about on foot, visiting the poor and gathering the children for the creches and for Catechism. Even a few kind words from us help the people. They see in us determination to be with them and near them despite the danger."

Syria has captured our attention, but the Custody of the Holy Land embraces also Israel and Palestine, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Rhodes and Cyprus.

Fr Michael Perry OFM, Minister General, visited the Custody of the Holy Land and reported, "I admire the courage and determination of the Christians who do not want to leave their country... I saw that the friars are united, they pray and work together, although they are tired and worn out by the situation... Then I listened to the local Christians, who spoke of the presence of the friars in their midst like real men of God capable of love and welcome."

Our Pope's world-wide Good Friday Collection offers us Australian Catholics an opportunity to contribute to the upkeep of the Holy Places and to express our solidarity with Christians in the Custody of the Holy Land. 
