EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD—YR B 1 APRIL 2018

First Reading Acts 10:34. 37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Second Reading Col 3:1-4

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be

on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Gospel Jn 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Plagued with Scandals, Yet Good News

Scandals everywhere. Trial of Cardinal Pell, the Royal Commission's finding on Catholic and other churches, alleged ball tampering by Australian Cricket Captain and team, Russian muddling in foreign politics and apparent state sponsored killing of defectors, thus goes the list. In fact it is nothing new. Even at the time of Jesus, and surrounding him, there were plenty of scandalous happenings. From the specially chosen and trained group of elders titled 'The Apostles', Judas Iscariot betrayed and sold his master, the leader of the apostles, Peter utterly denied his Lord at a time Jesus needed the support of his disciples most. In fact none of the disciples had the guts even to appear anywhere near Jesus when he was condemned and assassinated by hanging on the tree. Most of all, Jesus who is proclaimed to be the Son of God is condemned to the shameful death of crucifixion.

But the irony of the first century is that there were plenty of people who felt no shame or loss of spirit in owning up their master's crucifixion, but were elated to speak about the ultimate sacrifice of the Lord Jesus Christ. This turnaround happened because Jesus Christ who was killed and buried is now resurrected from the dead. Jesus could not be contained within the walls of the tomb. He truly belongs to the living. He now has opened for us also the Kingdom of God, the realm of the living. Therefore the disciples were people of hope and joy. We too find hope and joy in the Easter happening.

Having empowered to join the joy and hope of the Easter, we too celebrate this day, as none other. We have now the tools and the knowledge how to turn the crosses in our life and the life of our dear ones into new life of Resurrection. You, as the Christ in our world today, are able to rise from the decay of the scandals into the glory of the new life of the Kingdom. So do not be shy in living out the new found dignity of Easter. Let the world know that nothing can subdue your God given dignity. You are the light and life of the world.

Together as the Church, the Body of Christ, we have brought joy and hope to many through the ministries in education, social justice, caring for the suffering, standing up for the unborn, walking with the disadvantaged and marginalised, and so on. Let no scandals box you in. Let the world know that you are now empowered to raise the scandalised, the marginalised, and the deprived to the glory of the new life in the Kingdom of God.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 20:1-9

Historical Context: Mary Magdalene Mary Magdalene, or Mary of Magdala, plays an important role in the gospel accounts of resurrection. She was obviously a significant follower of Jesus, being named as a witness to the crucifixion, discovering the empty tomb and the first to encounter the risen Christ. One would think that she would hold a prestigious place in the Church, but for many years she was confused with another character identified in the gospels and was portrayed as a prostitute and sinner. Mary is named in each of the four gospels and not once is it indicated that she was a sinner or prostitute. She has been a victim of mistaken identity for 2000 years.

Different View. An empty tomb?

There are some writers who have questioned the historical accuracy of the empty tomb account of the resurrection. Some theologians and biblical scholars (eg members of the 'Jesus Seminar') argue that historically, it is far more likely that the victim of Roman crucifixion would be left to rot on the cross or buried in a shallow criminal's grave—not laid to rest in an expensive private tomb. However, they do not argue against resurrection. They maintain that Jesus' body was not resuscitated' or 'reanimated'. What happened to his corpse, they argue, is irrelevant to Christ's resurrection.

Gospel Focus: The disciple Jesus loved.

In this week's gospel we see reference to a disciple as 'the one Jesus loved'. It is generally agreed that this disciple is John. There is some suggestion that the disciple, John, is in fact the John ascribed as the author of this gospel. If this is so, to describe himself as the disciple Jesus loved is merely a means of avoiding using a personal pronoun—I or me. Just as Jesus described himself as 'the Son of God' or 'the Son of Man' rather than say 'I', John uses the same convention to avoid naming himself. It is not to suggest that Jesus didn't love his other disciples.


