PENTECOST SUNDAY

20 MAY 2018

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phyrgia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading Gal 5:16-25

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If

you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

Jn 15:26-27; 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness. And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset. I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now.

But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine.

Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'

Guidance of the Holy Spirit to look to the Future

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. God's spirit that came down on the Disciples of Christ, made them bold enough and capable to reach out to the all cultures and languages on this day. Till then the word of God was thought to be limited to the Hebrew people of Israel. To the amazement of everyone, at Pentecost the disciples could reach out to people of various cultures and languages. The people of different languages and cultures could understand each other.



As a disciple, it is always my desire to know how much I could reach out with the message of Christ to the people of diverse backgrounds. The appraisal on my ministry which you participated earlier this year has been helpful in this respect. Its final report is being prepared by Anne-Marie Fensom. I will be keenly observing the strength and weakness of my ministry as a disciple who is anointed and sent.

Now the Bishops of Australia are planning a Plenary Council in 2020. It is an opportunity to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church in Australia. In the process towards the Plenary Council, everyone of us is invited to listen to God, by listening to one another. The agenda for the Plenary Council will be built on what is heard in the dialogue which is to happen from now on. In the coming weeks, according to the direction from the Archdiocese, as a parish community, we will gather together to listen to one another, to share our own stories of faith, and our experience of the Church.

Along with the preparation for the Plenary, this year we are celebrating the Year of Youth. The youth who are anointed and sent have the energy to witness and vibrancy of faith to reach out beyond any boundaries as it happened at the Pentecost. It is not just the young, but all who are baptised and anointed with Chrism are sent forth to preach the Good News of Christ. Therefore what do you think God is asking of us in this parish? What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time? Let us seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit and look forward to the future.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 15:26-27; 16:12-15

Historical Context. Pentecost.

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter and comes as a Sabbath day after seven weeks of seven days. In Jewish tradition the 50th day after the Passover was celebrated as a blessing of the harvest and rather than the unleavened bread of Passover it was celebrated by leavening the bread. It was for this reason that the disciples were gathered together when they experienced the Holy Spirit empowering them. In Christian tradition, Pentecost is celebrated as the arrival of the Spirit, promised by Jesus, that animated the disciples to spread the gospel of Jesus and gather believers to form what would eventually become the Church.

Have you Thought? The Spirit.

We can sometimes regard Pentecost as the day the Holy Spirit came into the world. However, the Spirit had long been active in the world before this event. In fact, even the second verse of Genesis Chapter 1 tells us that the Spirit hovered over the waters. The Old Testament is filled with references in which 'The Spirit of God came upon (him) with power' and the Spirit was evident as Jesus' baptism and throughout the gospels. Jesus is frequently described as being 'filled with the Spirit'. So, from the very beginning of creation the Spirit has moved in the world and continues to energize it today.

Living the Gospel. Come, Holy Spirit. 'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, Vene Sancte Spiritus, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundres of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Saturday—St Philip Neri, priest



St Philip Neri was born in Florence in 1515. His mother died when he was young and he was educated at a Dominican convent. In 1533 he went to Rome and lived as a hermit for two years, then spent a further three years studying theology and philosophy. He gave up his studies and sold his books and encouraged his friends to join him in working for the sick and visiting the churches of Rome. St Philip was ordained a priest in 1551 and he spent many long hours hearing people's confessions. He founded the Congregation of the Oratory, which gave its name to the musical form 'Oratorio', which developed from their services. St Philip was known as a happy man, who enjoyed playing the occasional practical joke, but was also regarded as a living saint by those who knew him.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Our Lady Help of Christians

Thursday, 24 May is the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians. It is a solemn feast. There will be 2 Masses in our parish – 6.45 AM, 9.15 AM.

The feast day to Mary Help of Christians has been celebrated in Australia since 1844 but the history to this day dates back to the start of the 1800's.Napoleon Bonaparte had jailed Pius VI who died in jail. When Pope Pius VII was elected he too was jailed by Bonaparte, who kept him prisoner at Fontainbleau. The Holy Father vowed to God that if he were restored to the Roman See, he would institute a special feast in honour of Mary. The military eventually forced Bonaparte to release the Pope and on 24 May 1814, Pius VII returned in triumph to Rome.



Twelve months later the Pope decreed that the feast of Mary Help of Christians be kept on 24 May. The infant church in Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed except for one brief year until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive. Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary and was the first nation to choose her under the title Help of Christians, as principal Patroness.

St Mary's Cathedral was dedicated in her honour by the Irish pioneer priest, Fr John Therry, who arrived in Sydney in 1820 and assumed responsibility for the planning and initial construction of the Cathedral. When Australia became the first country to have Mary Help of Christians as Patroness, it became the first country to have a mother-cathedral under the same title.

The statue of Mary, Help of Christians, stands in the Chapel of the Sacred Heart in the Cathedral. The Church has traditionally focussed on two aspects of Our Lady's help on this feast day. Firstly, upon the role of Our Lady's intercession in the fight against sin the life of a believer. Secondly, Our Lady is one who assists Christians as a community, through her intercession, in fighting against anti-Christian forces. In the Opening Prayer for Our Lady Help of Christians, the Church prays that through Our Lady's intercession God will "grant wisdom to our leaders and integrity to our citizens", so that "under her protection Australia may be granted harmony, justice and peace".



Plenary Council 2020

With the permission of the Holy Father, Pope Francis, the Bishops of Australia have resolved to hold a Plenary Council in 2020-21 for the Catholic Church in Australia.

The purpose of a Plenary Council is not to change Church teaching or discipline. Rather, it's purpose is to help promote the flourishing of the faith, and propose ways that the Church might do this in response to contemporary opportunities for and obstacles to people achieving their ultimate end, communion with God in heaven.

Plenary Councils do not happen often. The last one in Australia was in 1937 and was at a time when the young Australian Church faced many challenges such as the rise of Communism. Now, eighty years later, the Plenary Council takes place at a time when the Catholic Church in Australia is once again confronting a series of challenges, both different from and similar to those of 1937.

The Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse highlighted many failings on the part of some members and leaders of the Church. This has had a profound impact on the Church in Australia that will play out for some time yet. However, this is but one of the challenges for the Church in contemporary secularising Australia. There are many others that are worthy of discussion, discernment and prayer and the Plenary Council is giving us the opportunity to do so.

Some areas that the Plenary Council 2020 might consider are:

- How can we combat the virulent secularism in some quarters of our society and the rise of atheism, especially among young people?
- How can we renew and support the family, the parish and the school which have traditionally been such wells
 of evangelical energy for the Church in Australia, until recently?
- How can we best evangelise, re-evangelise and transmit the faith, proposing the Catholic vision of the human person, relationship and morality under grace?
- How can we ensure that we are praying and worshipping God in ways that are worthy and welcoming?
- How can we best reach out to and care for those on the margins?
- How can we promote, form and support good marital, priestly and religious vocations?
- How can we strengthen the Catholic identity and mission of our key Catholic agencies?
- And all the other questions on your mind!

Pentecost 2018 to Pentecost 2019 has been designated as a year of 'dialogue and discernment' in the lead up to the Plenary Council. During this time, you will have an opportunity to participate by giving your input on these matters and many others that you may have by engaging with our Archdiocesan Plenary Council Working Group co-chaired by Bishop Terry Brady and Associate Professor Sandy Lynch. I encourage those in our parishes, schools, universities, agencies, lay groups and movements, along with clergy and bishops, to enter into the Plenary Council process as we move towards the first session of the Plenary Council in October 2020.

Come, Holy Spirit of Pentecost. Come, Holy Spirt of the great South Land.

O God our Father, bless and unite all your people in Australia and guide us on the pilgrim way of the Plenary Council.

Give us the grace to see your face in one another and to recognize Jesus, our companion on the road.

Give us the courage to tell our stories and to speak boldly of your truth.

Give us ears to listen humbly to each other and a discerning heart to hear what you are saying.

Lead your Church into a hope-filled future, that we may live the joy of the Gospel.

Through Jesus Christ Our Lord, bread for the journey from age to age. Amen.

Our Lady Help of Christians, pray for us. St Mary Mackillop of the Cross, pray for us.
