First Reading

Ez 17:22-24

The Lord says this:

'From the top of the cedar,

Gospel

Mk 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom
of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night
and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed
is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know.
Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot,
then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when
the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap
because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God
is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a
mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the
soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once
it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all
and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air
can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word
to them, so far as they were capable of
understanding it. He would not speak to them except
in parables, but he explained everything to his
disciples when they were alone.

MASS INTENTIONS FOR THE WEEK



PLANT THE SEED, THEN GOD WORKS



The Church attendance in the western world has diminished considerably. In Australia it is less than 10% in many cases, though our parish is doing a little better. Child abuse and related scandals that plagued the Church is not helping. Therefore the picture painted in many minds may be that of gloom. In this context, two parables, one from prophet Ezekiel and another one from the Gospel of Mark provide a different perspective. Ezekiel tells the parable of a cutting from a cedar being planted on an Israel mountain top which flourishes into huge tree of hope. (Ref. Ezekiel 17:22-24)

Ezekiel was considered as the father of Judaism. He prophesied a new beginning for the Jewish people who were in Babylonian Exile. At a time the Jewish people lamented that priest, prophet, and King - the three main pillars of their society - are lost, God had other plans for his people. God taught them to focus on the essentials of the religion in the captivity. Then God used another foreign king, Cyrus to help them re-establish in Jerusalem. After this happened, the Jewish people considered Ezekiel as the Father of Judaism.

When Jesus uses the parable of the mustard seed (Ref Mark 4:22-34), he was alluding to the prophecies of Ezekiel. From the insignificant and very small seed God can grow a large bush or tree, and the Kingdom of God is like that (ref Judges 9:15 - tree as the rule of God). It was like Ezekiel telling the Jewish people that God will raise a big tree from a little cutting from the top a tree in Lebanon and planting it in a fertile land. Jesus also said that the bush that grows from a very small seed will be large enough for the birds of the air to make their nest in it (Ref. Ezekiel 17:22-24). Following the prophetic language of Ezekiel, birds are symbols of non-Jewish people, the gentile. Thus Jesus was foretelling that the small group of disciples he had in Galilee will grow big enough to accommodate people from all corners of the world with differing cultural and ethnic backgrounds. That is what Catholic (Universal) church is now.

We are to plant the little seeds of the Kingdom which God will let grow into big trees. Leading a fruitful life of Christian discipleship is the only way we can make sure we have the seed of the Kingdom of God to plant. Share in the mission and ministry of the Body of Christ, Church. Thus we become fruitful and can produce seeds for the Kingdom of God. There a number of ways we can plant these seeds of the Kingdom. Making acquaintance with other members of the Church and building up a fellowship is a start. Then we should be sharing our Prayer Experiences and our God Experiences with others. Catholics are found to be very reluctant to speak about their God experience and prayer experience with others. Our God experiences and prayer experiences are the seeds of the Kingdom of God. Therefore we cannot neglect sharing our God Experience and Prayer Experience with others. Once we do this, God will help the Kingdom grow. How it will happen may be beyond our human understanding. But it will happen. Let us do our bit, planting the seed of the Kingdom of God.

REFLECTIONS ON MARK 4:26-34

Living the Gospel. Seed on the land.

The first parable in the gospel passage describes the unerring work of the kingdom. It is like the seed that almost magically transforms into a fully grown plant that may be harvested - apparently without any external forces. Of course, we know that plants need to be fed, watered, weeded and nurtured to ensure their proper growth. However, the kingdom of God works in our lives in a similar way - if we feed and nurture it, the kingdom will produce a great harvest. Even if we don't pay attention, the kingdom is present and acting in our world.

Scriptural Context. Kingdom Parables.

Jesus sought to describe the kingdom of God by comparison and analogy - 'The kingdom of God is like...'; 'To what can we compare the kingdom of God?' He never gave a lecture about the kingdom, rather, he painted a picture in terms that were readily recognised by his audience but forced them to think differently about the image he used. It forced them to think about themselves and their world in a different way. Kingdom parables begin innocently enough with a familiar image but very quickly shift to a challenge about the way we normally perceive things. The kingdom is often portrayed as a contradiction.

Gospel Focus. The Kingdom of God.

The references to the kingdom of God in the gospels always carry a paradox. It exists in the present, yet is something to be achieved in the future. It is here, but not yet. If we live 'as if' we are living in the kingdom here and now then we hasten its coming. The kingdom of God is not a place but a way in which the world operates. It is a kingdom that is ruled by justice and gives precedence to those who are regarded as nothing in the world. It is a kingdom of promise and hope that inspires and calls all people to more than they currently are.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Thursday, 21 June - St Aloysius Gonzaga

Born in Lombardy (Italy) in 1568. Died in Rome on this day in 1591 of the plague, contracted while caring for its victims. Devout and ascetical from the time of his childhood in a family of Italian nobility. Pursued a religious vocation as a Jesuit against enormous family opposition. Remembered for his youthful ideal of perfection and his determination to achieve it.



Friday, 22 June - Sts John Fisher, bishop & Thomas More, martyrs

John Fisher: Born at Beverley (England) in 1469. Died at London on this day in 1535. Chancellor at Cambridge and bishop at Rochester, combining diligent pastoral ministry with

the defence of Catholic doctrine.

Thomas More: Born in London in 1478. Died there for the faith on 6 July 1535.

An Oxford scholar, a noted humanist and apologist, an incorruptible judge and Lord Chancellor, a devoted husband and loving father. Drawn into conflict with Henry VIII, both were imprisoned and beheaded for treason. Remembered for their wide learning, for their devotion to the Church, and for their uncompromising integrity and courage.

An opportunity to celebrate all the English martyrs, Catholic and Protestant, of the Reformation era. Coming from every walk of life, people rich and poor, married and single, women and men died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or suffered harsh persecution for their faith.
