First Reading Am 7:12-15

Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, said to Amos, 'Go away, seer; get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there. We want no more prophesying in Bethel; this is the royal sanctuary, the national temple.' 'I was no prophet, neither did I belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets.' Amos replied to Amaziah, 'I was a shepherd, and looked after sycamores: but it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

Second Reading Eph 1:3-14

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ. Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determined that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved in whom, through his blood, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins. Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us in listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust all wisdom and insight. He has let us know the mystery of his purpose, the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he

would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth. Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff – no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals, but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic.' And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to from under your feet as a sign to them.' So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.

Let us make our Mission Fruitful

There has been great news early last week; much more delightful than the World Cup. There was almost a cosmic sigh when the news of the 12 teenage football players rescued from Tham Luang Cave in Thailand started to spread. These twelve young players with their Coach Ekapol Chantawong were trapped in a cave where they took shelter from the threat of rain. Before they realised it became a terrifying ordeal for them which required experts from all over the world to save them. Thank God and the rescuers that they are safe now. It is the skill, discipline, goodwill and courage of the rescue team that brought them out, almost like a rebirth.

Then there is a bible story of another team of twelve and their coach. A concise version of the mission of this team is reported by Mark (Mk 6:7-13). While both stories are about life and peril, the dynamics and mission are different. The twelve Apostles of Jesus were coached and sent by their master to enlighten the people and save them from the darkness of sin. The way the twelve apostles were formed and sent is the model for all those who are chosen and sent thereafter. The theme of our Parish Day this year is 'ANOINTED AND SENT', reflecting the missionary commissioning of the Apostles. Children from both SPC and SJW schools have made banners based on this theme. You see these banners and posters decorating the church and the Jubilee Hall.

A few days ago I had a rather long conversation with Cathy Kennedy, Director of ENCOUNTER, about what it means to be 'anointed and sent' in our time. We agreed that the process starts with Jesus personally inviting the men to be his disciples and welcoming them into his life. Jesus 'the man', who did it is not available now. But now our parish, is standing in for Jesus as the body of Christ. We invite and welcome people to the celebration of our Christian life. The intentional ministry of Greeters and Welcomers at the Weekend Masses highlights our way of recreating Jesus' calling of his disciples.

The next step is to proclaim the good news of God being with us. Reading of Bible, Bible Study programs, RCIA Programs, Retreats, Homilies and other spiritual readings published in the Bulletin are helping us to encounter Christ and respond to Him personally. Once we encounter Jesus personally, transformation will happen within ourselves as disciples. We will want to have a daily schedule of prayer. Transformed Disciples of Christ will also grow in Christian virtues. They will support the Parish (as the Body of Christ) with their Time, Talent and Finance. Our parish is known as a welcoming parish, with beautiful liturgies, conducting meaningful spiritual formation, and powerful sacramental celebrations. Each of you intentionally wanting to live the Christian Discipleship is making our parish as true Body of Christ.

This Church of St Peter Chanel is as young as me. Built 60 years ago, it is the icon of a beaming Christian life. Though this building was blessed by Cardinal Gilroy 6 decades ago, it was never formally dedicated. Now I have organised with Archbishop Anthony Fisher to do the dedication on 17 February 2019. It will also be an opportunity for the active parishioners to formally dedicate themselves as Disciples of Christ. Archbishop Fisher will also install a relic of St Peter Chanel in a specially built reliquary. Thus this Church will become the first and only Parish Church in Australia with a Reliquary of St Peter Chanel. It will be a privilege for pilgrims to light candles and present prayer intention cards at the Reliquary. It will make our joy as Disciples of Christ contagious. With your help I shall lead this mission. We are sent with a mission as the Apostles were sent by Jesus. Together let us make our mission fruitful.

REFLECTIONS ON MARK 6:7-13

Scriptural Context. Mission and Ministry.

This seems an odd event in the narrative of the Gospel of Mark. The twelve are sent out and we are told that they 'cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them'. After a diversion to explain the fate of John the Baptist the gospel picks up again by simply stating that the disciples returned and reported all they had done. There is no explanation of why Jesus sent them out; no indication of how long they travelled; no evidence of what reception were given. This was a prelude to the later ministry that would be performed; it was an instruction by Jesus for how the mission was to be carried on.

Living the Gospel. Travelling Light.

Jesus made it plain to the disciples that they were to travel unencumbered by the extras of life. In face they were to carry next to nothing and rely on the goodness of others. The challenge to travel lightly through life is a difficult one in a world today that is dominated by materials possessions. In the race between the 'haves' and 'have nots' the 'haves' are way out in front. The gospel passages challenges us to think about the 'things' with which we burden ourselves. What is really necessary to live a good life and follow Jesus? Have you thought? Sent in pairs. It is interesting that the disciples were sent out in pairs. It is indicative of the fact that such ministry is difficult to accomplish alone. When we are engaged in ministry it is important that we seek and provide mutual support. Whether it is a hospitality ministry at Sunday Mass, visiting the sick, or a street ministry to the homeless, we will feel more confident and willing to reach out to others if we know that we are sharing that ministry and are supported by others. It is important to invite others to join in our ministry but it is also important to make sure that we support them as they enter into it..

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK



Wednesday, 20 July - St Apollinaris

St Apollinaris was believed to be born in Antioch, in the Roman province of Syria. Tradition has it that he was the first bishop of Ravenna and was appointed by St Peter himself, after which he faced constant persecution by Roman authorities. He was eventually arrested, tortured and put to death by the sword, although there is no reliable written information about his life and martyrdom. Apollinaris is a patron saint against epilepsy and gout.

From a letter to the Corinthians by Saint Clement, pope

St. Clement of Rome was the third successor of Peter the Apostle as bishop of Rome, and therefore, our fourth Pope. Clement was a contemporary of Peter and Paul. His service as Bishop of Rome was probably from about 92-101 A.D. There is a tradition that he was ordained by St. Peter. Clement's papal letter to the Corinthians was written about 80 A.D. in an effort to restore peace to the Church at Corinith, Greece which had broken into factions and was intent upon firing some of their presbyters.

Beloved, see what a marvellous thing love is; its perfection is beyond our expression. Who can truly love save those to whom God grants it? We ought to beg and beseech him in his mercy that our love may be genuine, unmarred by any too human inclination. From Adam down to the present time all generations have passed away; but those who were perfected in love by God's grace have a place among the saints who will be revealed when the kingdom of Christ comes to us. As it is written: *Enter your chambers for a little while, until my wrath and anger pass away; and I shall remember a good day and raise you from your graves.* We are blessed, beloved, if we fulfil the commands of the Lord in harmonious, loving union, so that through love our sins may be forgiven. For it is written: *Blessed are those whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the man to whom the Lord imputes not iniquity, and in whose mouth there is no deceit.* This is the blessing that has been given to those who have been chosen by God through our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever. Amen.

We should pray then that we may be granted forgiveness for our sins and for whatever we may have done when led astray by our adversary's servants. And for those who were the leaders of the schism and the sedition, they too should look to the common hope. For those who live in pious fear and in love are willing to endure torment rather than have their neighbour suffer; and they more willingly suffer their own condemnation than the loss of that harmony that has been so nobly and righteously handed down to us. For it is better for a man to confess his sins than to harden his heart.

Who then among you is generous, who is compassionate, who is filled with love? He should speak out as follows: If I have been the cause of sedition, conflict and schisms, then I shall depart; I shall go away wherever you wish, and I shall do what the community wants, if only the flock of Christ live in peace with the presbyters who are set over them. Whoever acts thus would win great glory for himself in Christ, and he would be received everywhere, *for the earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof*. Thus have they acted in the past and will continue to act in the future who live without regret as citizens in the city of God.
