First Reading Jer 23:1-6

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost – it is the Lord who speaks! 'See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity.'

Second Reading Eph 2:13-18

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which

used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. Call to a Lonely Place

Last few days I was at a Clergy Conference at Leura. I felt like I was like Jesus telling his disciples who returned after their appointed mission, "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while" (Mk 6:31). They were taken by boat to the lonely place; I was taken by my car to the tranquillity of Leura Conference Centre. When the disciples reached the shore with Jesus which was meant to be lonely, ironically they were greeted with a huge crowd hungry for the Word of God. "They were like sheep without a shepherd" (Mk 6: 34). In a week full of news about Archbishop Wilson's conviction which lead to many, including the Prime Minister, call for his resignation, the overwhelming feeling was that of a sheep without shepherd. The pending trial of Cardinal Pell is not helping either.

The crowd Jesus had to face on the shore where the disciples were meant to have lonely time with him was not a nuisance to Jesus. That perhaps is the difference between many of us and Our Lord. Jesus pointed out to his disciples that they are people without shepherd and it is a challenge. Challenges are always opportunities for a Disciple of Christ. The disciples learned this lesson from their Master. They observed what the Lord was doing. Jesus felt compassion for the crowd and started to proclaim to them the Word of God, teaching them many things. Thus Jesus taught his disciples how to provide shepherds to the people who are hungry for the Word of God. Their role was to provide the compassion of God to the people who are looking for it. The disciples' role was to teach people that 'The Lord is our shepherd, there is nothing we will want', as we pray in Psalm 22.

At the Conference I attended, Bishop Eugene Hurley, Bishop Charles Drennan, Dr Sr Maeve Heaney, and many others were very inspirational in their sharing of how they showed compassion, proclaimed the Word of God, and taught many things about the providence of God. Therefore going away to a 'lonely place' has lead me to reflect on the effectiveness of my ministry and mission. You, my parishioners also share in the mission and ministry of Christ. Just as the disciples of Jesus needed to go away into a lonely place after the active life of ministry, each of my parishioners also need to go away to a lonely place with Christ. The personal time with the Lord each day, and being with the Body of Christ on weekends are part of going into a lonely place with the Lord. But time and again we all need an inspiration retreat with Jesus Christ. With this in mind the parish will be organising Spiritual Retreats. When such occasions arise know that it is Jesus calling you to a 'lonely place to be Him'.

REFLECTIONS ON MARK 6:30-34

Historical Context. Prayer & Reflection
Jesus demonstrated how important it is to
engaged in times of quiet prayer and
reflection. When you expend a lot of
time and energy in the service of others it
is essential to reflect on those
experiences, to learn from them and
consider what you'd do differently next
time. It is also important that any
ministry that seeks to be based in the
message of Jesus can only remain so if it
is fuelled by prayer. Only through
prayerful dialogue with God can we learn
what God desires for us.

Living the Gospel. Take time out.

I recently travelled to France and was amazed that in the smaller towns and villages everything stopped for two hours in the middle of the day and people went home for lunch. As a tourist used to almost 24 hour convenience, it was at first terribly frustrating. Even tourist attractions would close down. The only businesses open were restaurants. However, the wisdom of the custom soon became apparent. How wonderfully civilized and life-giving to stop for two hours in the middle of the day, go home and have a leisurely lunch. It made me ask myself, when do I take time out to renew myself?

Have you thought? Sheep and Shepherds.

This gospel passage is one of many gospel references and even more Old Testament references to sheep and shepherds. It is an enduring image from the Bible. Much of it stems from the shepherd-become-King, David. When a monarchy developed in Israel it was clear that the role of king was like that of a shepherd, caring for his flock. Jesus applied the image to himself on several occasions, reinforcing an image of servant leadership. The language continues today, with bishops referred to as shepherds of their diocese and carrying a crosier that is reminiscent of a shepherd's crook.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Wednesday, 25 July - St James, apostle



Born at Bethsaida in Galilee, a son of Zebedee. Died about 44, the first apostle to die, beheaded by Herod. A fisherman, summoned by Jesus together with his brother Saint John (27 December). They were called the "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17). Remembered as a favoured apostle: with Saint Peter (29 June) and Saint John he

was present at the transfiguration, the raising of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in the garden.

Thursday, 26 July St Joachim & Anne



St Joachim and St Anne are named as Mary's parents in a late second century tradition. Churches dedicated to Saint Anne are found in Jerusalem and Constantinople from the middle of the sixth century. The feast of Saint Anne was kept in Rome by the eighth century, that of Saint Joachim from the fifteenth century.

The feast honours the parents of the Virgin Mary and grandparents of the Lord.

We should be Christians in deed, as well as in name

From the beginning of a letter to the Magnesians by Saint Ignatius of Antioch, bishop and martyr

Ignatius, also called Theophorus, to the church at Magnesia on the Maeander, a church blessed with the grace of God the Father in Christ Jesus, our Saviour, in whom I salute you. I send you every good wish in God the Father and in Jesus Christ.


I was delighted to hear of your love of God, so well-ordered and devout, and so I decided to address you in the faith of Jesus Christ. Honoured as I am with a name of the greatest splendour, though I am still in chains I sing with the praises of the churches, and pray that they be united with the flesh and the spirit of Jesus Christ, who is our eternal life; a union in faith and love, to which nothing must be preferred; and above all a union with Jesus and the Father, for if in him we endure all the power of the prince of this world, and escape unharmed, we shall make our way to God.

I have had the honour of seeing you in the person of Damas your bishop, a man of God, and in the persons of your worthy presbyters, Bassus and Apollonius, and my fellow-servant, the deacon Zotion; may I continue to take delight in him for he is obedient to the bishop as to the grace of God, and to the presbyters as to the law of Jesus Christ.

Now it hardly becomes you to presume on your bishop's youth, but rather, having regard to the power of God the Father, to show him every mark of respect. This, I understand, is what your holy presbyters do, not taking advantage of his youthful condition but deferring to him with the prudence which comes from God, or rather not to him but to the Father of Jesus Christ, to the bishop of all. So then, for the honour of him who loves us, it is proper to obey without hypocrisy; for a man does not so much deceive the bishop he can see as try to deceive the bishop he cannot see. In such a case he has to reckon not with a man, but with God who knows the secrets of the heart.

We should then really live as Christians and not merely have the name; for many invoke the bishop's name but do everything apart from him. Such men, I think, do not have a good conscience, for they do not assemble lawfully as commanded.

All things have an end, and two things, life and death, are side by side set before us, and each man will go to his own place. Just as there are two coinages, one of God and the other of the world, each with its own image, so unbelievers bear the image of this world, and those who have faith with love bear the image of God the Father through Jesus Christ. Unless we are ready through his power to die in the likeness of his passion, his life is not in us.
