5 AUGUST 2018

First Reading Ex 16:2-4. 12-15

The whole community of the sons of Israelbegan to complain against Moses and Aaronin the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our hearts content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.'

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your hearts content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God." And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

Second Reading Eph 4:17, 20-24

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets

corrupted by following illusory desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

Gospel Jn 6:24-35

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat. Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you, for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered:

'I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'.

Work Up a Different Appetite

Early Catholic convicts in Australian history were compelled to attend Church of England services. Their children and orphans were raised by the authorities as Anglicans. Having denied the faith nourishment for them and their children, the Catholics were like the complaining Israelites in Sinai Desert (Ref Ex 16:2-4). The people Moses led through Sinai desert were liberated from the slavery of Egyptians, but now starved of food. Since the people cried to God, He rained 'manna' for them to eat to their satisfaction. God communicated through Moses to the starving and complaining people in Sinai. In early Australian settlement, God communicated through people like Attorney-General John Plunkett who prepared provisions for Catholic Schools. The Catholics now could have their own faith-based schools for their children. Now the joy of the Catholics was like that of the Israelites eating 'manna' in Sinai desert. Catholic Church put great energy and resources into creating a comprehensive alternative system of education. So many religious sisters and brothers were instrumental in the establishment and nourishment of the Catholic education system to what it is now.

Now the Catholic Schools are so much sought after that many schools cannot cope with all the applications they receive. There is so much appreciation from the public for this catholic initiative; not because they see signs of Christian hope, but because of the good education the schools can provide. A lot of parents are not choosing the catholic schools for faith reasons. These parents are no different to the people who went to Capernaum looking for Jesus (Ref Jn 6:24-35). About them Jesus said, "I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat."

It is not just the Catholic Schools that attract people to the Church, the Body of Christ. Like the people who ate to their fill at the 'multiplication of bread' and then went looking for Jesus in Capernaum, Catholic Charities like the Society of St Vincent de Paul and other outreach programs are also attracting people to the living presence of Christ, the Church. These charities are satisfying the hunger for the material welfare amongst people. But how many Christians can see these Catholic Charities as signs of God's providence? How many of them consider the Catholic Outreaches as pointers towards a meaning of life beyond the worldly comfort and affairs? To such people Jesus says, "Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you, for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal" (Jn 6:27). We need to work on creating the awareness that Catholic education and Catholic Charities are to lead people to Christ who is the real food. My dear brothers and sisters work up an appetite for the 'food that endures to eternal life'. Upcoming parish retreat is a special opportunity to work up an appetite for meaningful life and discipleship of Christ.

REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 6:24-35

Historical Context. Bread.

For thousands of years, bread has been a staple part of the human diet in many cultures. It is no accident that the image of Jesus as bread makes such a significant appearance in the gospel of John. For the Jews, like other Ancient Near Eastern cultures, bread was a vital mainstay of their diet. In the Bible, the word 'bread' often simply means all food - it was that important! For many, regular access to bread did equate to life. Bread also played a crucial role in religious practices, especially the Passover meal.

Scriptural Context. Bread that endures.

Jesus says, 'Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life.' The reference to food that cannot last relates to today's first reading about manna. In the full account of Exodus 16 you will see that the manna that fell on the first five days had become rotten by the next day and could not be eaten. However, the manna that fell on the sixth day was 'food that endures' so that it would be eaten the next day - the Sabbath day, when the work of gathering the manna was not allowed.

Living the Gospel. The Body of Christ.

Christ is present in the Eucharist in many forms: in the people gathered; in the celebrating priest; in the Word proclaimed; and in the consecrated bread and wine - the Body and Blood of Christ. In relation to receiving Christ through the reception of communion, St Augustine wrote, 'Be what you see, and receive what you are.' We not only receive the Body of Christ through Eucharist, we are called to be the Body of Christ because of what we have received; and we receive the Body of Christ because we are already part of the Body of Christ.

From a letter of Mary MacKillop to Monsignor Kirby

For personal reflection on the Feast of St Mary of The Cross MacKillop on 8 August

Oh, Father, I cannot tell you what a beautiful thing the will of God seems to me. For some years past, my Communions, my prayers, my intentions have all been for God's will to be done. I can never pray for a particular intention, a particular person, or anything particular about our own Institute, but in God's loved will, that is — whilst I desire with all my heart to pray for these, I cannot help at the same time desiring that He only use my prayers for the intention that His own will most desires at this time. Thus I feel a joy when things go well, for I see His will in this, and an equal joy when they seem to go wrong or against our natural desire, for there again I see His will, and am satisfied that He has accepted my prayers and those of many more for some other object at the time nearer to His adorable will.

To me, the will of God is a dear book which I am never tired of reading, which has always some new charm for me. Nothing is too little to be noticed there, but yet my littleness and nothingness has often dared to oppose it, and I am painfully conscious that in many ways I still in my tepidity offend against it without perceiving what I am doing. But such dear lessons as you gave me the other evening then come to my aid and encourage me, for the love of my sweet Jesus is too strong, too beautiful, and His merits too great, for me not to cling to Him.

Drought Stricken Farmers

Many Australian farmers are very badly stricken by drought. In some parts of Queensland farmers are facing their fifth or sixth year of drought without an income. Carmel Marshall, Centacare CQ's planning and development manager, said: "Some farming families need to find off-farm income and often it's the farmer who has to leave to find that work, leaving their families behind to take care of the property. There are also a number of families where the children are staying home to look after the farm instead of going to boarding school." In this situation, I would like to hear from you how as a faith community of the parish we can assist these brothers and sisters of ours desperate for help. Meanwhile one of import help can provide is to pray for rain. Let us appeal to the providence of God by saying at least one Hail Mary each day for rain.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Monday, 6 August - The Transfiguration of the Lord



This feast had its origin in the East in the fourth century as the commemoration of the dedication of the church of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. It was observed in the West from the eighth century and extended to the entire Western Church in the fifteenth century. The feast celebrates the divine radiance shining in

Christ's human flesh and God's glory shining forth in the lives of Christians.

Wednesday, 8 August - St Mary of the Cross



Born in Melbourne (Australia) in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering

special care to destitute women and children. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence. Named as the second patron of Australia on 15 January 2013.

Friday, 10 August - St Lawrence

Died at Rome on this day in 258, four days after Saint Sixtus II (7 August), with whom he was closely associated. Honoured



for his almsgiving. Became, after the apostles, the most celebrated martyr of the Church of Rome. His cult spread throughout the Church from the fourth century. Remembered in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon), and in five ancient Roman churches dedicated to him.

Saturday, 11 August - St Clare



Born at Assisi (Italy) in 1193 or 1194. Died there on this day in 1253. From a well-to-do family, Clare embraced an evangelical way of life after hearing the preaching of Saint Francis of Assisi (4 October). Founded the order of the Poor Ladies, now the Poor Clares. Remembered for her life of extreme poverty, austerity, contemplation, and charity.
