### **Christ the King**

Mahatma Gandhi's statue was unveiled in Parramatta Jubilee Park by Indian President last Thursday. Many countries in all continents have monuments erected to Mahatma Gandhi. You do not normally expect a foreigner to be honoured in such way. What makes him special? He was a man who influenced millions of minds and hearts in many generations. It was not battles or forceful imposition that made him the king of millions all over the world, but his life of service and thirst for truth is what conquered friends and foes alike. Such was the power of his personal charisma that he even brought the imperial powers to their knees. I believe Mahatma Gandhi was inspired by the teachings of the Gospels which he read.

John's Gospel presents Jesus as King. "Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born" (Jn 18:37). It was not position and power like that of Pilate that made him king. The authority of Jesus was his integrity. Therefore those who seek truth, Jesus said, will listen to him. Unlike Roman emperors and kings, Jesus did not go to war to establish his kingdom. Washing of the feet of the disciples was the way Jesus established his Kingdom.

It is not just Jesus who is King. After baptism of a child, the priest anoints the child with Chrism Oil and says, "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always sharing his everlasting life." This means that at baptism you too are anointed a King. An ideal king will always be at the service of his subjects. Every Christened person is called to be another Christ through a life of service. The feast Christ the King and the gospel read at the liturgy on this occasion give us an opportunity to reflect on the different ways in which we, and others, exercise influence and leadership. The authority of Pilate came from position and power. Whereas the authority of Jesus came from his integrity and what he stood for. Social reformers like Mahatma Gandhi and great saints like Mother Teresa of Kokotha have proved how a life of integrity can be good news to others. The values of the kingdom of God cannot be imposed. It is never a matter of fighting battles, or forcing others into compliance. As a parent, a teacher, or a group leader how has your integrity become good news to others? Jesus came to bear witness to the truth. Not just Jesus but we all are created for a purpose. What do you believe is the purpose of your life? As an anointed 'king' (at the Christening) has your life of service becoming good news for yourself and to others?

### **REFLECTIONS ON JOHN 18:33-37**

Historical context. Christ the King. Unfortunately, political and military images of kingship have played a dominating role in the Church since very early in its history. The very earliest Christians, or followers of the Way, did not conform to social and political hierarchies of their day. But when Emperor Constantine declared Christianity to be the official religion of the Roman Empire the structure of the Church quickly adopted the political and social structures of the empire. At times in history the Pope has adopted a regal status and led huge armies into battle. Many of these structures persist today and we sometimes struggle to recapture Jesus' intention when he declared himself a king.

Have You Thought? The Kingdom of God.

When Jesus speaks about the Kingdom of God he never gives a particularly clear picture of what he means. He usually refers to the kingdom with metaphoric language ('the kingdom of God is like....') and often the kingdom is defined by what it is not. The kingdom is also a real contradiction: it is here and now and yet it is still to come; it is almost impossible for some to enter the kingdom while others are assured a place; it is within us and in our hearts and yet it is a great banquet to which all are invited.

Gospel Focus. Truth.

Jesus says to Pilate that he came into the world 'to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.' That is where today's gospel passage finishes but as the gospel continues on, Pilate famously asks Jesus 'What is truth?' and the question is left dangling; unanswered. The truth Jesus has borne witness to is the truth of his whole life - the revelation of God's love for humanity. It is for proclaiming this truth that Jesus is placed on trial and is brought before Pilate..

### **FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK**



Friday, 30 November - St Andrew, apostle (Feast)

Born at Bethsaida (Galilee). A fisherman and perhaps a disciple of John the Baptist (24 June). Introduced his brother, Simon Peter (29 June), to Jesus and became one of the first to follow Christ. Mentioned a number of times in the gospels, for example, in introducing some Gentiles to Jesus (John 12:20ff.). Widely venerated since ancient times and remembered as one of the twelve who bore witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.



### **New Anthem for Parish**

I had commissioned Fr Kevin Bates to write an Anthem for our parish, before I went on holidays. This is to be used on the occasion of the Dedication of the Church on 17 February. Last Thursday, along with Maureen Hynes, Leader of the Parish Choir, Chris Hynes, Jenny Michael of Liturgy Committee and I went to Hunters Hill to receive the words and music for the new anthem. It is titled FROM MANY STRANDS. The anthem reflects what our parish is. It is also a beautiful prayer. It was a delightful experience to hear Fr Kevin play the music and sing it for us. Fr Kevin is one of the leading Hymn writers of Australia and we have been using a number of his hymns in our liturgy. After learning how to sing, there will be a launching of this Hymn in our parish to which we will be inviting the author also. Not many parishes got their own anthem. Therefore we can feel special having our own Anthem. It will also add solemnity to the celebration on day of Dedication and Installation of the Relic of St Peter Chanel.

You may also notice that the depository for the Relic is now ready in the shrine of Our Lady in the Church. Similarly at the Baptismal Font there is a new depository for the Holy Oils. The monstrance for the Relic and the candle holders for Dedication Candles are sponsored by benevolent parishioners. ### Family Festival, Carols in Guilfoyle Park


