STAND ERECT

Asia Bibi case made headlines in the media recently. Assiya Noreen is a 47 years old Pakistani woman known as Asia Bibi. In June 2009, she was accused of blasphemy after an argument with co-workers while harvesting berries and was arrested and imprisoned. In 2010, a judge sentenced her to death by hanging which was upheld by the High Court. She did not receive much sympathy from her neighbours or Islamic religious leaders, some of whom adamantly called for her to be executed. Minorities minister Shahbaz Bhatti and Punjab Governor Salmaan Taseer were both assassinated for advocating on her behalf and opposing the blasphemy laws. Muslim cleric Maulana Yousaf Qureshi announced a huge bounty to anyone who would kill her. Asia Bibi could avoid all this persecution if she changed her religion to Islam. But she did not do it. In spite of these persecutions, she held her head high as a Catholic. People from all over the world pleaded with pakistani Government and prayed for her release. On 31 October 2018, the Supreme Court of Pakistan acquitted Asia citing "material contradictions and inconsistent statements of the witnesses" which "cast a shadow of doubt on the prosecution's version of facts." There are many parts of the world where Christians endure persecutions, though the nature of persecution may differ. Last Tuesday Catholic News Agency reported that Irish nurses and midwifes felt compelled to call on their government to protect their freedom of conscience following the legislation of abortion in the Republic of Ireland.

We too have our own challenges to keep our heads high as Christians. Last Wednesday Archbishop of Hobart, Julian Portius warned against the litigations that could menace Christians with the amendment of Marriage Act in Tasmania. In the face of such challenging situations what are we to do. Are we to cringe or despair that the Church has lost its relevance or conclude that there is no God on our side. But Bible provides hope and joy.

Speaking with his disciples about the troubled times, Jesus asks them not to lose heart, not to be discouraged when adverse situations encircle them. "they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand." (Lk 21:28) Our God has not abandoned us. He will never abandon us. He will come in glory.

Are you able to stand erect in troubled times of your personal life, holding head high. Do you see God coming into your life? Are you able to help someone you love and care for, showing them God coming into their darkest moments?

REFLECTIONS ON LUKE 21:25-28. 34-36

Have You Thought? Waiting, waiting, waiting....

I'm not a big fan of waiting! Anticipation is pretty good; getting prepared and getting ready are OK, too. But when it comes down to being all dressed up and ready to go, I'm just hopeless at waiting. If Advent is a time of pointless waiting for Christmas then we've somehow missed the message. Rather than just waiting, Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation. But it's not just about anticipating Christmas. That's part of it, sure. However, Advent is about reminding ourselves that we have a job to do: preparing for the reign of God - in our lives and in our world.

Scriptural Context.

This week's gospel passage comes from a lengthy passage in the gospel of Luke in which Jesus speaks extensively about the future. It is a very different style of writing from the usual narrative, teaching and parable forms that make up most of the gospel. The style is an echo of the prophetic writings of the Old Testament. Compare this passage with this week's first reading of other passages from the writings of the prophets. The style is always rich in metaphor and symbol. There is a grandness about the style. We know, just from the use of language, that great things are afoot!

Different View. We're doomed!

Fundamentalists love readings like this week's apocalyptic gospel passage. Full of portent and urgency, it inspires the sort of thinking that says, 'Repent now, because you could be dead tomorrow!' It is easy to look at a passage like this and apply it to the conditions of the world today: everything's going to rack and ruin; it's just as the Bible foretold; the end of the world is just around the corner. But we have to remember that this was written nearly 2,000 years ago! Yes, there is still urgency! Yes, there is still need for change! But we still have time to get it right.

FEASTS & MEMORIALS OF THE WEEK

Monday, 3 December - St Francis Xavier (Memorial)



Born in 1506 in Navarre (Spain). Died on this day in 1552 off the coast of China. Met Saint Ignatius of Loyola (31 July) while studying in Paris,

became one of the first Jesuits, and went to Goa (India) as a missionary. Travelled extensively through southeast Asia to Japan, winning many converts and leaving behind organised Christian communities. Remembered for the witness of his poverty and for his tireless efforts as a missionary.

Friday, 7 December - St Ambrose (Memorial)



Born in Trier (Germany) about 340. Ordained bishop on this day in 374 and died at Milan (Italy) on Holy Saturday 397. A lawyer who

became governor in Milan and who was still a catechumen when elected "Immaculate Conception" and was bishop by popular acclaim. Upheld orthodoxy against the Arians and won many Christian converts. Encouraged monasticism and defended the independence of the Church against secular authority. Remembered as an outstanding pastor through his writings on the sacraments and Christian ethics and through his homilies, instructions, and hymns.

Saturday, 8 December - The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Solemnity)



This feast had its origin in the East as the "Conception of Mary by Saint Anne". It spread through the West during the Middle Ages as the

extended to the entire Western Church in the eighteenth century. The feast celebrates Mary, preserved from sin from the moment of conception; she is the first fruits of her Son's redemption and a prophetic model of what the Church is called to be.

The twofold coming of Christ

St Cyril of Jerusalem

We do not preach only one coming of Christ, but a second as well, much more glorious than the first. The first coming was marked by patience; the second will bring the crown of a divine kingdom.

In general, whatever relates to our Lord Jesus Christ has two aspects. There is a birth from God before the ages, and a birth from a virgin at the fullness of time. There is a hidden coming, like that of rain on fleece, and a coming before all eyes, still in the future.

At the first coming he was wrapped in swaddling clothes in a manger. At his second coming he will be clothed in light as in a garment. In the first coming he endured the cross, despising the shame; in the second coming he will be in glory, escorted by an army of angels.

We look then beyond the first coming and await the second. At the first coming we said: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. At the second we shall say it again; we shall go out with the angels to meet the Lord and cry out in adoration: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

The Saviour will not come to be judged again, but to judge those by whom he was judged. At his own judgement he was silent; then he will address those who committed the outrages against him when they crucified him and will remind them: You did these things, and I was silent.

His first coming was to fulfil his plan of love, to teach men by gentle persuasion. This time, whether men like it or not, they will be subjects of his kingdom by necessity.

The prophet Malachi speaks of the two comings. And the Lord whom you seek will come suddenly to his temple: that is one coming.

Again he says of another coming: Look, the Lord almighty will come, and who will endure the day of his entry, or who will stand in his sight? Because he comes like a refiner's fire, a fuller's herb, and he will sit refining and cleansing.

These two comings are also referred to by Paul in writing to Titus: The grace of God the Saviour has appeared to all men, instructing us to put aside impiety and worldly desires and live temperately, uprightly, and religiously in this present age, waiting for the joyful hope, the appearance of the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Notice how he speaks of a first coming for which he gives thanks, and a second, the one we still await.

That is why the faith we profess has been handed on to you in these words: He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

Our Lord Jesus Christ will therefore come from heaven. He will come at the end of the world, in glory, at the last day. For there will be an end to this world, and the created world will be made new.



I had commissioned Fr Kevin Bates to write an Anthem for our parish, before I went on holidays. This is to be used on the occasion of the Dedication of the Church on 17 February. Last Thursday, along with Maureen Hynes, Leader of the Parish Choir, Chris Hynes, Jenny Michael of Liturgy Committee and I went to Hunters Hill to receive the words and music for the new anthem. It is titled FROM MANY STRANDS. The anthem reflects what our parish is. It is also a beautiful prayer.

It was a delightful experience to hear Fr Kevin play the music and sing it for us. Fr Kevin is one of the leading Hymn writers of Australia and we have been using a number of his hymns in our liturgy. After learning how to sing, there will be a launching of this Hymn in our parish to which we will be inviting the author also. Not many parishes got their own anthem. Therefore we can feel special having our own Anthem. It will also add solemnity to the celebration on day of Dedication and Installation of the Relic of St Peter Chanel.

You may also notice that the depository for the Relic is now ready in the shrine of Our Lady in the Church. Similarly at the Baptismal Font there is a new depository for the Holy Oils. The monstrance for the Relic and the candle holders for Dedication Candles are sponsored by benevolent parishioners.
