THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR C

First Reading Zep 3:14-18

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

Second Reading Phil 4:4-7

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

16 DECEMBER 2018

Gospel Lk 3:10-18

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

Make Your Life Great Again

After so many setbacks in her pursuit of Brexit, Theresa May, the UK Prime Minister, is asking what shall I do to make UK great Britain again. She is getting too many advices and, it looks like she does not know which one to follow.



In the Gospel of Luke we see all kinds of people asking just one man 'what shall we do' to make ourselves great again and they are getting very precise answer. (Ref Lk3:10) Tax

collectors, teachers, soldiers, and in fact people from all walks of life asked John what 'shall we do'. This quest resembles that of the people who returned from Babylonian captivity about regaining their dignity. Nehemiah and his contemporary prophets instructed the people about the importance of Torah and Sabbath and how to rebuild the Temple of Jerusalem. They did what was told and Judaism became a great religion. Nearly five centuries later when John (the Baptiser) was asked 'what shall we do to make our lives great' his answer was slightly different to what Nehemiah gave.

John's response acknowledged that even as a religious person, it is okay to be a soldier of a pagan king (Roman Emperor), or as tax collector (handling the tainted thing, money), or taking up the noble job of teaching. But everyone should act justly and live dutifully. 'Do not take more than what is due to you from anyone. Be satisfied with your legitimate pay'. In our terms we would say, 'do not be corrupt, and be just in all what you do'. For some people the definition of good life ends there. They think this much is enough to make our life great. But John's advice goes one more step further.

John then directed his disciples to someone greater than him, someone who can make their lives great by removing all chaffs in their lives. He was pointing to Jesus Christ. 'Be fired up with the spirit of Jesus, who can baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire'. Like a farmer who separates good grain from chaff, making great treasure of his labour, Jesus can sort out the greatness in you from the chaff and make you great again. Be prepared and let Jesus make your life great again.

REFLECTIONS ON LUKE 3:10-18

Have You Thought? A change of heart..

The baptism that John preached and practised was a baptism of repentance. What he called on people to do was to recognise the areas of their lives that were unbalancing their relationship with God. There was a strong recognition that unless they were in right relationship with one another they could not be in right relationship with God. In recognising the need for change in their lives, John challenged them to also make a change of heart: to approach their lives differently. This is why they were questioning him about practical ways of living out their new commitment.

Gospel Focus. Baptised with the Holy Spirit.

John makes clear to his audience the difference between himself and the Messiah who is still to come. His ritual of baptism will pale in comparison with the baptism with the Holy Spirit that the Christ will offer. Compared to a symbolic action of baptism, Jesus will offer the people of a tangible experience of life in the Holy Spirit. He will give them not only a glimpse of the reign of God, but an invitation to enter fully into it. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is a lived experience, not just a ritual action.

Living the Gospel. Generosity of spirit.

John's words to the crow, the tax collectors and the soldiers are about adopting a spirit of generosity and a generosity of spirit. A generosity of spirit can be expressed simply in the attitude with which we approach other people: a positive, hope-filled and generous attitude will often turn around a potentially negative situation. As we approach the Christmas season, there is a need for practical actions of generosity as well. Those in need can approach Christmas with dread rather than joyful expectation. It can be the hardest time of year for struggling families. Acts of generosity can make all the difference.

A Spiritual Canticle of St John of the Cross

Recognising the mystery hidden within Christ Jesus

Though holy doctors have uncovered many mysteries and wonders, and devout souls have understood them in this earthly condition of ours, yet the greater part still remains to be unfolded by them, and even to be understood by them.

We must then dig deeply in Christ. He is like a rich mine with many pockets containing treasures: however deep we dig we will never find their end or their limit. Indeed, in every pocket new seams of fresh riches are discovered on all sides.


For this reason the apostle Paul said of Christ: In him are hidden all the treasures of the wisdom and knowledge of God. The soul cannot enter into these treasures, nor attain them, unless it first crosses into and enters the thicket of suffering, enduring interior and exterior labours, and unless it first receives from God very many blessings in the intellect and in the senses, and has undergone long spiritual training.

All these are lesser things, disposing the soul for the lofty sanctuary of the knowledge of the mysteries of Christ: this is the highest wisdom attainable in this life.

Would that men might come at last to see that it is quite impossible to reach the thicket of the riches and wisdom of God except by first entering the thicket of much suffering, in such a way that the soul finds there its consolation and desire. The soul that longs for divine wisdom chooses first, and in truth, to enter the thicket of the cross.

Saint Paul therefore urges the Ephesians not to grow weary in the midst of tribulations, but to be steadfast and rooted and grounded in love, so that they may know with all the saints the breadth, the length, the height and the depth – to know what is beyond knowledge, the love of Christ, so as to be filled with all the fullness of God.

The gate that gives entry into these riches of his wisdom is the cross; because it is a narrow gate, while many seek the joys that can be gained through it, it is given to few to desire to pass through it.



National Redress Scheme

Recently the Chancery said, "The Archdiocese is committed to joining the National Redress Scheme." Church officials have been busy finalising the procedures and documentation required for all dioceses linked to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference to join the Scheme.

A special company has been established, Australian Catholic Redress Ltd, by which dioceses will interact with the Redress Scheme. The bishops of Australia have already begun signing the Participation Deeds by which their dioceses will join the Company and hence the Redress Scheme. It is anticipated that the various legal formalities will be completed in the coming weeks thereby allowing survivors of child abuse in Catholic parishes and institutions to apply for redress.

A number of Catholic religious congregations have indicated that they will separately join the National Scheme.

Father Gerry Gleeson, Vicar General said, "The Catholic Church, like other bodies and indeed some State governments, is not delaying its participation in the Redress Scheme, but simply taking the necessary time in conjunction with the Commonwealth to put the most appropriate procedures in place. Survivors of institutional child sexual abuse are encouraged to approach the Redress Scheme or to approach the Church directly should they wish to do so."
