From your Pastor

Don't be satisfied with the map

An explorer has just returned home after visiting mighty river Ganga in India. The people here were eager to learn all about the vast and mighty river and the country surrounding it. But how he wondered, could he ever describe it to them - how could he ever put into words the feelings that flooded into his heart when he saw the exotic flowers and heard the night sounds of Himalayan hillside. How could he communicate to them the smells that filled the air and the sense of danger and excitement that would come whenever he and his fellow explorers encountered in strange situations?

So the explorer did what all good explorers do - he said to the people, "go and find out for yourselves what it is like", and to help them he drew a map of the river from Gangotrhi in Himalaya to the Bay of Bengal. It pointed out the various features of its course and describing some of the dangers and the routes that could be used to avoid those dangers.

The people took the map and they framed and hung on the wall of their home. After a period of time many of those who made copies for themselves considered themselves experts on the river – and indeed they knew its every turn and bend, they knew how broad it was and how deep, where the rapids were and where the falls were. They were very keen to teach others about Ganga, but never really knew what Ganga was, unlike the explorer.

The people from Emmaus and other disciples of Jesus knew the scripture very well. The disciples knew the nuances of the Prophetic Literature and the Books of the Law from Bible. They were like the people who had the map of Ganga. But it is when Jesus came, after his resurrection, appeared in front of them, that they started to get the real grasp of things. Until they personally met and experienced Jesus for themselves, their scripture knowledge did not mean much. But when they experienced real presence of Jesus who ate with them and showed his wounds and marks, the disciples were transformed into people of hope, joy, and courage. Soon they took off to spread the Good News of Jesus' resurrection.

All our theology and scripture knowledge can make us behave like the people who were satisfied by studying the map of river Ganga and never went to experience it themselves. To transform ourselves like the disciples of Jesus in today's Gospel, we too need to encounter Jesus personally. Nothing can substitute personal encounter. If there are any obstacles, any sins, hindering personal experience of Jesus Christ, we need to seek forgiveness. Then through the Holy Communion, holy Eucharist, we will encounter Jesus personally. We will also encounter the real presence of Jesus Christ in the lives of the needy – our brothers and sisters. That will transform our lives. You will become people of new vision, courage, joy, and faith. Thus make the Easter Joy real in your lives.

Memorials and Feasts of the Week

Wednesday, 25 April — Anzac Day

This day marks the defeat of Australian and New Zealand soldiers in an ill-fated campaign during the Great War of 1914-1918. It has become a day of remembrance in which the young nations recognise the establishment of ideals of courage and self-sacrifice for the common good. The liturgical texts recognise the sacrifice of the fallen and commend them to eternal life, and seek the blessing of peace upon our lands.

Thursday, 26 April — Saint Mark, Evangelist. Feast

Died about the year 74. Usually identified with the John Mark whose mother's house in Jerusalem was a meeting place for the apostles, and with the young man who followed Christ after his arrest (Mark 14:51). A cousin of Saint Barnabas (11 June). Accompanied Saint Paul (29 June) on his first missionary journey and later followed him to Rome. A companion of Saint Peter (29 June) and traditionally credited with the gospel which reflects Peter's teaching and memoirs. Honoured as the founder of the Church in Alexandria.

Saturday 28 April — Saint Peter Chanel, Priest, Martyr. Memorial Feast; Our Parish Patron

Born at Cuet (France) 1803. Died on Futuna (South-west Pacific Ocean) on this day in 1841. A parish priest noted for his pastoral zeal, particularly his care of the sick. Joined the Society of Mary (Marists) and remembered for his missionary work in the Pacific. Evangelisation in the local language brought some success on the island of Futuna which led to his murder by a jealous chieftain. Honoured as the first martyr of the Church in Oceania.
