From your Pastor

Wishing you God's Blessings on Coming Feast Days

On this Feast of Ascension, I will have started my visit to some of the places a great missionary of the Lord, St Paul, preached. When the disciples knew that their Lord, Jesus, is going away from them, they were sad. They knew how much they will miss him. But Jesus consoled them saying, I will send you a special gift from heaven, the Holy Spirit. This Holy Spirit is going to be their advocate and consoler. The Divine Gift he sent for his disciples to continue His mission was very powerful. Look at what happened at the Pentecost. Those timid disciples started to speak very boldly, gaining thousands of converts.

The conversion of Saul, who was renamed Paul, was the most dramatic one. He who was a much feared persecutor of the church was turned into one of the most effective missionaries of the church. He won so many minds and hearts of the gentiles that he became the apostle of the gentiles. In a way we can say it was Paul who shaped Christianity. Therefore it is with much excitement that I am going to visit some of the places St Paul journeyed.

St Paul was not a tall man. Therefore whenever he could, he stood on an elevated stone or pedestal to preach. This weekend, as you gather in the church to celebrate the Mass of the Feast of the Lord's ascension, I will be standing on some of such stones in on Areopagus Hill in Athens where Paul preached to Athenian Philosophers; and in the ruins of Corinth where Paul preached in the Rostrum. I will also be celebrating an outdoor Mass in Corinth this weekend. I shall remember you, my parishioners in my Mass. Some of you also have asked me to pray for special intentions. I can assure you that I will remember your intentions along my Pilgrimage.

On Wednesday, 37 of our young parishioners will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation from bishop Terence Brady. Last Thursday I spoke to the candidates on the gifts of the Holy Spirit and invited them to join some of the ministries of the Church. As I will be praying for them, you too may pray for them, so that their confirmation will enliven in them a spirit of Ministry and Evangelisation.

May God's blessing abound in you during the coming weeks of three major feasts – Ascension, Pentecost, and Corpus Christi – concluding the season of Easter.



A big thank you to all those who made Fr Kings' farewell Mass and morning tea such a success. To the parishioners who organised and setup the hall, those who brought a plate along to share, the musicians and singers, to the many who made the Church so beautiful and to everyone who volunteered - well done and congratulations.

PASTORAL COUNCIL for BERALA PARISH

I would like to establish a Pastoral Council for Berala Parish. As a preparation towards it below is the guidelines. Parishioners will have three weeks to think and discuss it. Then when I get back from my Pilgrimage I will be inviting nominations. Fr Thomas

ROLE

Our Pastoral Council's role is to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love and values of Christ in the world around us.

Our Pastoral Council shares in the responsibility for the ongoing life and development of our parish community, working together with parishioners to provide support for their efforts to live as followers of Christ.

Our Parish Pastoral Council seeks to:

- Listen to and gather information about the hopes, ideas, needs and concerns of parishioners
- Generate responses to these identified issues
- Encourage and support the continuing good work of existing groups within our parish
- Provide opportunities for parishioners
- to grow in their relationship with God and with each other
- to support and encourage them in their continuing efforts to be a Christian influence in the wider community
- Contribute towards making parish decisions that reflect the values of the Gospel and the teachings of the Church
- Provide support for our Pastor, working collaboratively with him and with each other.

MEMBERSHIP

There may be eight members recommended by parishioners.

In addition there may be two ex-officio members: the Principal of St Peter Chanel Catholic School and a member of the Finance Committee.

The Council will have as broad a membership as possible, with a diversity of age, gender and ethnic origin. Each Pastoral Councillor is a representative of the whole parish community and not a representative of a specific parish group only.

There will be a session of formation for all Council members prior to the first meeting of the newly chosen Council. This year councillors will be joining Proclaim 2012 in Chatswood for their training. It is held from 9 to 11 August.

TERM OF MEMBERSHIP

The term of membership is one year or two years. A definite decision will be taken about it in consultation with the initial Council is established. Anyone who serves two terms consecutively will then stand down for at least one term.

NEW MEMBERS

After Fr Thomas returns from his Pilgrimage, all parishioners will be asked to recommend other parish members for possible membership of the Council. If the number of nominations of possible membership is more than required, the membership will be finalised either by

negotiation or a prayerful selection process.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

In a spirit of prayerfulness, each member of the Parish Pastoral Council will:

- Attend the regular meetings of the Parish Pastoral Council
- Develop a spirit of enquiry and the ability to listen and understand the issues affecting the lives of parishioners
- Provide input to deliberations of the Council
- Provide prayerful support and encouragement for other members of the Parish Pastoral Council
- * Actively participate in the implementation of finalised plans of action

- Embrace opportunities for personal faith development and for gaining skills to assist with effective participation in the Council's operations
- Represent the Parish Pastoral Council when required e.g. other parish meetings, deanery or diocesan meetings.

OFFICE BEARERS

The Parish Priest together with the office-bearers will form the executive of the Pastoral Council. The office-bearers, chosen by the members, will be chairperson, deputy chairperson and secretary.

The role of the executive is to:

- Reflect on the effectiveness of each previous Council meeting. What went well? What can we do better?
- Organise the agenda for each meeting, incorporating input from all pastoral councillors
- Arrange distribution of the agenda, minutes and all relevant material one week in advance of that meeting
- Coordinate the business of the Council between meetings
- Arrange additional formation opportunities outside the regular meetings.

MEETINGS

There will be a minimum of eight meetings of the Pastoral Council each year.

CONSENSUS

The consensus approach will be used in the process of contributing towards the making of parish decisions, with each member offering input towards the final outcome. Majority voting, lobbying, competition and domination are to be avoided.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE PARISH

The Pastoral Council will report to the parish community regularly. It will seek the input of parishioners through various means, e.g. parish consultations, focus meetings, conversations.
