

St Paul's Expedition

Greece

Though I had been to Greece before, this time is different. Last time was just a holiday in Greece. Now I am here to experience and understand the greatest missionary of all times, St Paul. It was so fitting to start the first day of the Pilgrimage with a Mass in the Athens Cathedral of St Dionysius. Dionysius was the first person St Paul baptised in Greece. He became the bishop of Athens. Now he is the patron of the Cathedral of Athens, a city named after the goddess of wisdom. The year St Thomas the Apostle went to India, 52 AD, St Paul came to Athens. Though he did not spend many days in Athens, he left an everlasting impression in the city where philosophers and academicians were honoured most. Education was considered so superior in Athens, it is said that teachers were paid more than judges in this city!

Athens attracts so many tourists because of the Acropolis Athena, which at the time of St Paul had a magnificent temple overlooking the city. Those temples told stories of victory over enemies and athenian pride in their philosophy. But these days all these past glories are being unearthed as ruins. Whereas what Paul preached, which was considered as folly by the great thinkers of the time is now the guiding principle of people. Christianity is the state religion. While we were looking at some of the ruins of old pagan Greece, we could hear church bells and chanting from the Orthodox churches all around us.

Ecumenism with Greek Orthodox Church may be active outside Greece, but not in Greece where 97% of the population is Orthodox against no more than 2% of Catholics. Some of the very old Byzantine monasteries are still functioning with orthodox monks. One of such places we visited was in a small town called Kalampaka. There are huge rock cliffs overlooking the town. On the cliff edges of the rocks are six monasteries. Going into one of the monasteries, we thought of saying a prayer. But one of the monks forbade us. We were allowed to talk, discuss and look at the art works of the church, but not pray! Though Catholic Church officially recognises Orthodox sacraments, they do not count Catholic ones as valid.

Corinth

After Athens, St Paul went to Corinth. It was just two hour drive from Athens for us. But not for Paul who walked all the way. It took a lot of guts for St Paul to preach in Corinth. The peninsula of Corinth is between Adriatic and Aegean seas. Ships carrying goods between Italy and Eastern Countries did not

want go around Corinthian peninsula; because the sea was dangerously rough in the southern side of the peninsula. Therefore they had their ships towed by horse over the land between these two seas at Corinth. Thus the port of Corinth was always busy with rich international traders. Along with all other business, prostitution also was flourishing in this city. The old Corinthian city had Acro (Mount) Corinth overlooking it with a temple dedicated to goddess of Aphrodite. Temple prostitution was practised here. In such a culture St Paul pitched his tent as a tent maker, helped by a devout couple Priscilla and Aquila. St Paul's anti-women polemic is to be understood in the context of the sexual immorality he was addressing in Corinth. But courageously he told them what was wrong and what is right.

On the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, we celebrated Holy Mass standing amongst the ruins of the old city. I took this opportunity to pray for my parishioners, friends, and relatives.

Later this week, I will be celebrating Masses in other places like Philippi and Thessalonikki where St Paul preached. Along the journey too we pray rosary and other prayers as a group. I can assure you, in all these prayers I remember you parishioners.

PASTORAL COUNCIL for BERALA PARISH

I would like to establish a Pastoral Council for Berala Parish. As a preparation towards it below is the guidelines. Parishioners will have three weeks to think and discuss it. Then when I get back from my Pilgrimage I will be inviting nominations. Fr Thomas

ROLE

Our Pastoral Council's role is to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love and values of Christ in the world around us.

Our Pastoral Council shares in the responsibility for the ongoing life and development of our parish community, working together with parishioners to provide support for their efforts to live as followers of Christ.

Our Parish Pastoral Council seeks to:

- Listen to and gather information about the hopes, ideas, needs and concerns of parishioners
- Generate responses to these identified issues
- Encourage and support the continuing good work of existing groups within our parish
- Provide opportunities for parishioners
- to grow in their relationship with God and with each other
- to support and encourage them in their continuing efforts to be a Christian influence in the wider community
- Contribute towards making parish decisions that reflect the values of the Gospel and the teachings of the Church
- Provide support for our Pastor, working collaboratively with him and with each other.

MEMBERSHIP

There may be eight members recommended by parishioners.

In addition there may be two ex-officio members: the Principal of St Peter Chanel Catholic School and a member of the Finance Committee.

The Council will have as broad a membership as possible, with a diversity of age, gender and ethnic origin. Each Pastoral Councillor is a representative of the whole parish community and not a representative of a specific parish group only.

There will be a session of formation for all Council members prior to the first meeting of the newly chosen Council. This year councillors will be joining Proclaim 2012 in Chatswood for their training. It is held from 9 to 11 August.

TERM OF MEMBERSHIP

The term of membership is one year or two years. A definite decision will be taken about it in consultation with the initial Council is established. Anyone who serves two terms consecutively will then stand down for at least one term.

NEW MEMBERS

After Fr Thomas returns from his Pilgrimage, all parishioners will be asked to recommend other parish members for possible membership of the Council. If the number of nominations of possible membership is more than required, the membership will be finalised either by

negotiation or a prayerful selection process.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

In a spirit of prayerfulness, each member of the Parish Pastoral Council will:

- Attend the regular meetings of the Parish Pastoral Council
- Develop a spirit of enquiry and the ability to listen and understand the issues affecting the lives of parishioners
- Provide input to deliberations of the Council
- Provide prayerful support and encouragement for other members of the Parish Pastoral Council
- * Actively participate in the implementation of finalised plans of action
- Embrace opportunities for personal faith development and for gaining skills to assist with effective participation in the Council's operations
- Represent the Parish Pastoral Council when required e.g. other parish meetings, deanery or diocesan meetings.

OFFICE BEARERS

The Parish Priest together with the office-bearers will form the executive of the Pastoral Council. The office-bearers, chosen by the members, will be chairperson, deputy chairperson and secretary.

The role of the executive is to:

- Reflect on the effectiveness of each previous Council meeting. What went well? What can we do better?
- Organise the agenda for each meeting, incorporating input from all pastoral councillors
- Arrange distribution of the agenda, minutes and all relevant material one week in advance of that meeting
- Coordinate the business of the Council between meetings
- Arrange additional formation opportunities outside the regular meetings.

MEETINGS

There will be a minimum of eight meetings of the Pastoral Council each year.

CONSENSUS

The consensus approach will be used in the process of contributing towards the making of parish decisions, with each member offering input towards the final outcome. Majority voting, lobbying, competition and domination are to be avoided.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE PARISH

The Pastoral Council will report to the parish community regularly. It will seek the input of parishioners through various means, e.g. parish consultations, focus meetings, conversations.
