Bread of life

From your Pastor There is a counter at the front of St Peter Chanel Church which could be done up to use as a kiosk on Sundays. When it is done we could have morning tea every Sunday after Mass. That will help parishioners to get to know one another better. It is important to do things like this as a worshipping community of faith.' Comments to this effect was made to me by a number of parishioners at Berala. Yes, food has a very significant role in bringing people together. Food plays a special role in building up communities. It is true of spiritual life of a community also.

The people went looking for Jesus to his home town, Capernaum. Seeing the crowd Jesus tells: 'you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs, but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.' (Jn 6:26). Jesus multiplied the bread to feed the thousands (last Sunday's Gospel). Today's Gospel is a continuation from last Sunday's reading. In today's reading Jesus wanted the people to understand the full meaning of the sign of the 'multiplication of bread', which points to universal realities beyond the fact of feeding the hungry. The multiplication of the loaves and fish is an act of God's gracious love. But there is more to it.

The fellowship around the food Jesus gave them to eat, is an invitation to share a 'fellowship with Jesus'. Jesus is the bread of life, which "gives life to the world" (6:33), a life beyond the hunger of the stomach demands.

For the Jewish people 'fellowship around food' (table fellowship) meant 'sharing life'. In the Jewish culture, every table fellowship is an anticipation of the eschatological fellowship with God in heaven. Therefore they tried to 'purify' themselves before each meal to be holy and worthy for the fellowship. They also wanted others who share in their meal also to be 'holy'. That explains why religious people criticised Jesus for sharing table fellowship with 'sinners'. Jesus taught them that love and compassion is what sanctifies life. As Christians whenever we fail in love and compassion, we go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation to sanctify our lives, before we go for the fellowship meal of Eucharist.

In this day and age, we may not attribute as much importance to table fellowship in homes as we used to. Yet the concept is not forgotten. The idea of table fellowship is shifted to elsewhere. It is now seen in the 'world of money making', where we see proliferation of 'Business Dinners' - share a meal and discuss business. Money may bring pleasures and comforts. But it would not bring true meaning and direction in life which will in turn bring us lasting joy and peace. Therefore we need a shift of focus from money centred 'table fellowship' to Jesus centred fellowship'. We see people crowding in Catholic Schools looking for Jesus because of the good education they offer, just like the people who went Capernaum because they had 'plenty of bread to eat.' Let us help people see beyond the immediate benefits. I pray that more people will realise Jesus as the real and living bread and come to the Eucharistic Table for the fellowship.

Feast This Week!

Monday, 6 August — The Transfiguration of the Lord. Feast

This feast had its origin in the East in the fourth century as the commemoration of the dedication of the church of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. It was observed in the West from the eighth century and extended to the entire Western Church in the fifteenth century. The feast celebrates the divine radiance shining in Christ's human flesh and God's glory shining forth in the lives of Christians.

Wednesday, 8 August — Saint Mary Mackillop Religious, Feast

Born in Melbourne (Australia) in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence.

Friday, 10 August — Saint Lawrence, Deacon, Martyr

Died at Rome on this day in 258, four days after Saint Sixtus II (7 August), with whom he was closely associated. Honoured for his almsgiving. Became, after the apostles, the most celebrated martyr of the Church of Rome. His cult spread throughout the Church from the fourth century. Remembered in Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon), and in five ancient Roman churches dedicated to him.
