Might and Extremism is Not Our Way

From your Pastor Those who join a religious order like Jesuits, or Marist Brothers, or Josephite Sisters have a period of formation called Novitiate. It is a year or two of secluded training when the candidate is instructed in the special Charism of the Order. Through this is a period of intense training they understand and adopt an identity which makes them a Jesuit or a Marist Brother or Josephite nun. Jesus took his special disciples for a special instruction and training like this. A fortnight ago we heard in the Gospel reading that he sent them into towns and villages to preach the Kingdom of God. They came amazed at the wonderful impact they could have on the people. Then Jesus took them for a long walk – about 80 KM or more one way. As we heard last week, He was instructing them all along. He was teaching them what to expect as his disciple and what the Kingdom of God means. The backdrop of today's Gospel is the return journey. It must have taken many days if not weeks to get back to Capernaum. All along he was instructing the disciples about the meaning and purpose of the Kingdom of God. At the end the disciples still find it hard to understand the basic essence of the Gospel message.

The prime message was that Jesus as the Messiah will have to suffer grievously. Last week we heard from the Gospel reading how this message shocked Peter and companions. But Jesus continued to tell them that the Messiah will have to suffer grievously. Still the disciples were discussing who will be the greatest among them. They are still dreaming of the glory of becoming a leader in the Kingdom of God to come. Taking on this issue, Jesus teaches them that the values of the Kingdom of God are very different to the values of the World.

The world likes to bathe in glamour and glory. But the Kingdom of God is all about being at the service of others. The innocence of a child is what is required. Once again Jesus changed the parameters of religious life. While the world tries to win over others with their might, a disciple of Jesus wins over others through service, innocence and humility.

Like many saints honoured in the Church, we too need to strive to be at the service of others. We do this by and large. The challenge is not to lose our focus from it.

Most of the Islamic world is up in arms in protest against some You-tube publication. Now another caricature published in France is adding fuel to trouble. All protesting Muslims think that even the nonbelievers not honouring Allah's reputation will diminish the reputation of God. Therefore they volunteer to defend Allah. It is not that easy to get Christians to protest against things like an article in Sydney Morning Herald last Thursday that Jesus took a wife. It is because we know God is to be honoured by the kind of love and charity we practice, not might and violence. We focus on Catholic Care, Society of St Vincent de Paul and so on. When innocent children are violated, Christians rightly demand action. The Church spends its resources on protecting the rights and trust of the vulnerable. Educating the innocent is our priority, not training militants. We shall never lose our direction.

Feasts This Week

27 September - Saint Vincent de Paul. Memorial

St. Vincent was born in Pouy, Landes, Gascony, France, to a family of peasant farmers. He had four brothers and two sisters.

He studied humanities in Dax, France, with the Cordeliers and he graduated in theology at Toulouse. He was ordained in 1600, remaining in Toulouse until he went to Marseille for an inheritance. In 1605, on his way back from Marseille, he was taken captive by Turkish pirates, who brought him to Tunis and sold him into slavery. After converting his owner to Christianity, Vincent de Paul escaped in 1607.

After returning to France, de Paul went to Rome. There he continued his studies until 1609, when he was sent back to France on a mission to Henry IV of France; he served as chaplain to Marguerite de Valois. For a while he was parish priest at Clichy, but from 1612 he began to serve the Gondi, an illustrious family. He was confessor and spiritual director to Madame de Gondi, and he began giving preaching missions to the peasants on the estate with her aid.

In 1622 de Paul was appointed chaplain to the galleys, and in this capacity he gave missions for the galley-slaves. In 1625 de Paul founded the Congregation of the Mission, a society of missionary priests commonly known as the *Vincentians or Lazarists*. In 1633, with the assistance of Louise de Marillac he founded the Daughters of Charity. He also fought against the Jansenist heresy.

De Paul was renowned for his compassion, humility and generosity. For this reason he is known as the "Great Apostle of Charity".

29 September — Saints Michael, Gabriel & Raphael, archangels. Feast

The liturgy celebrates the feast of these three archangels who are venerated in the tradition of the Church. Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.

Amalgamation of Parishes

At the beginning of the year I wrote in the Parish Bulletin that our Archbishop, Cardinal Pell, has asked me to work on amalgamating St Joseph the Worker parish and St Peter Chanel parish. I believe the parishioners have had enough time to think through it and now I would like to further on the procedure. As I promised, a formal consultation with the parishioners is necessary. On Saturday, 10 November 2012, I am calling a combined meeting of Pastoral Councils of both parishes, Finance Committee, and members of various ministries. The main purpose of the long meeting on this day is to discuss Pastoral plans for the future. Agenda of the meeting includes topics like, CATHOLICS RETURNING HOME, ALPHA, YOUTH MINISTRY, and Building and Maintenance Program. At the meeting I will also introduce plans for the Amalgamation of the Parishes.

Once the parishioners consent to amalgamation, Cardinal will supress both St Peter Chanel Parish and St Joseph the Worker Parishes. Then one new parish will be created of both suppressed parishes. The new parish may have a new name. We will have to discern the new name. But it does not mean building a new church. Even as an amalgamated parish (under a new name) the parish will retain both churches with their respective names. Mass and other sacraments will be celebrated in both churches. The parish schools, namely St Joseph the Worker Catholic Primary School Auburn South and St Peter Chanel Catholic Primary School Regents Park will also continue as usual. Trinity Regents Park is a Regional School and the amalgamation will not have any impact on it.

The new parish will have only one set of advisory bodies like Pastoral Council and Finance Committee. The Finances of both parishes will be combined and will be administered as one set of accounts. After the initial consultation on Saturday 10 November, I will be preparing a document for the parishioners to sign to express your consent. On Sunday, 25 November there will be separate General Meetings of both parishes. St Joseph the Worker Parish meeting will be at 10 AM in SJW School Hall. St Peter Chanel Parish meeting will be at 7 PM in the Jubilee Hall.

Patrimonies of the parishes and the donors' intentions will be honoured as best we can. Patrimonies mean any bequests or donations given to either of the parishes for specific purposes. I am not aware of any such patrimonies so far. But should any of the parishioners be aware of any such patrimonies, please let me know.

I believe that the proposed amalgamation of the parishes will make our pastoral programs more efficient. When I return from holidays I will be happy to address any concerns any parishioners may have.
