From your Pastor

Vietnam trip

It is with great excitement that I travelled to Vietnam. My interest in Vietnam started when I was at St Felix Parish Bankstown. The predominant ethnic group in the parish was Vietnamese. So I made many Vietnamese friends, who invited me to their weddings feasts and other celebrations. It was the best initiation I could have into the wonderful variety of Vietnamese food. Many of my Vietnamese friends also shared many stories about their country. Therefore it was my interest to visit this fascinating part of the world. But it took so many years and some prompting from Lam and Minh Mai from Cronulla to organise a trip to this great land of mighty waterways, legends, exotic food, and communism. My first stop is Saigon, the most bustling city of Vietnam.

Saigon

It is not Saigon anymore – but Ho Chi Minh City. It was not Saigon from the beginning. It is the French who called this city Saigon, a name by which even now most people refer to this financial capital of Vietnam. When the communist movement from the North annexed the south to it, the city was renamed after their leader Ho Chi Minh.

One in ten of the 90 million people in the country live in this city. The first thing that captured my attention is the enormous number of motor bikes on the road. As I was coming out of the airport, I noticed that the small car park outside it is nearly empty. But by its side there is a huge shaded area for parking bikes which was packed with perhaps millions of two wheelers – the common man's transport. My first ground transportation is on motor bike with another bike carrying my suite case.

On to my lunch and rest by the canal, I saw Notre Dame Cathedral along the Kings Palace which is a national treasure now. In a country which had communist party systematically killing Christians, to see Notre Dame Cathedral and many other churches indicated to me the strength of faith these Vietnamese Catholics have. The revolutionaries could kill some Christians, but their faith and spirit. Religion wise Vietnam may be more Buddhist, but surely Christianity is more active.

Mekong Delta

My friends Lam and Minh were supposed to be joining me on my second day in Vietnam, for a tour to Mekong Delta south of Saigon. But they had some misfortunes with their flights. But that did not stop me from going along with my itinerary. Tien and Rang took me to the south by national highways and Freeways. In recent years the infrastructure of this country has been improving very fast.

Thanks to many benevolent countries like Australia. One of the bridges across the mighty Mekong River, which I crossed, was built by Australia. Another huge suspended bridge was the result of the good will of Japan. Mighty Mekong River starts from the Tibetan plains of Himalaya, flows through China, Burma, Cambodia, and Thailand before it reaches Vietnam and joins the Indian Ocean. It is not just water that this river is bringing to the shores of Vietnam. All along the river flourished great Oriental culture with its own elaborate cuisine, colourful dresses, and musically sounding languages. Vietnamese may have fought guerrilla warfare for many years till they drove the mighty United States Army away. But the people I met have certain serenity and politeness about them.

It was wonderful to enjoy a boat ride through the mighty river, and rowing boats through small canal like tributaries of the Giant Mekong. There may not be many wild animals in this delta as the people have successfully hunted them out into extinction. But there is no shortage of tropical fruits, honey, rice wine, rice herbal liquor, liquor with snakes stuffed in it, and local beer on ice without which the food is not complete. I could enjoy most of these exotic cuisines. But the more exotic drinks like liquor with snake stuffed in it, I shall reserve for later - much later. Now that I have done the southern end, I am looking forward to driving up to the northern area.

Amalgamation of Parishes

At the beginning of the year I wrote in the Parish Bulletin that our Archbishop, Cardinal Pell, has asked me to work on amalgamating St Joseph the Worker parish and St Peter Chanel parish. I believe the parishioners have had enough time to think through it and now I would like to further on the procedure. As I promised, a formal consultation with the parishioners is necessary. On Saturday, 10 November 2012, I am calling a combined meeting of Pastoral Councils of both parishes, Finance Committee, and members of various ministries. The main purpose of the long meeting on this day is to discuss Pastoral plans for the future. Agenda of the meeting includes topics like, CATHOLICS RETURNING HOME, ALPHA, YOUTH MINISTRY, and Building and Maintenance Program. At the meeting I will also introduce plans for the Amalgamation of the Parishes.

Once the parishioners consent to amalgamation, Cardinal will supress both St Peter Chanel Parish and St Joseph the Worker Parishes. Then one new parish will be created of both suppressed parishes. The new parish may have a new name. We will have to discern the new name. But it does not mean building a new church. Even as an amalgamated parish (under a new name) the parish will retain both churches with their respective names. Mass and other sacraments will be celebrated in both churches. The parish schools, namely St Joseph the Worker Catholic Primary School Auburn South and St Peter Chanel Catholic Primary School Regents Park will also continue as usual. Trinity Regents Park is a Regional School and the amalgamation will not have any impact on it.

The new parish will have only one set of advisory bodies like Pastoral Council and Finance Committee. The Finances of both parishes will be combined and will be administered as one set of accounts. After the initial consultation on Saturday 10 November, I will be preparing a document for the parishioners to sign to express your consent. On Sunday, 25 November there will be separate General Meetings of both parishes. St Joseph the Worker Parish meeting will be at 10 AM in SJW School Hall. St Peter Chanel Parish meeting will be at 7 PM in the Jubilee Hall.

Patrimonies of the parishes and the donors' intentions will be honoured as best we can. Patrimonies mean any bequests or donations given to either of the parishes for specific purposes. I am not aware of any such patrimonies so far. But should any of the parishioners be aware of any such patrimonies, please let me know.

I believe that the proposed amalgamation of the parishes will make our pastoral programs more efficient. When I return from holidays I will be happy to address any concerns any parishioners may have.
