From your Pastor

Vietnam trip

Ha Long Bay

Ha Long Bay was declared as one of the seven natural wonders of the world by UNESCO in 1994. The lime stone formations of nearly two thousand islets are really wonderful. Through the aggression of sea and interaction of elements for many millennia, some of these islets have formed caves inside them. Not all of these caves are readily conspicuous from outside. A walk through a narrow hole into the Surprise Cave in one of those steep islets



took me to an exotic world. The Stalactite and Stalagmite formations triggered the imaginations of our guide and consequently ours too. We could see many animals, human beings and many body parts in those formations. Our guide pointed to a formation as a very large finger pointing up. To the imagination of many of others it looked like some other body part in erect position. Yes some are more imaginative than others. One thing is sure: the jaws would drop as we look at the play of nature and the God's humour in creation.

Apparently there were humans in these islets as far back as 18000 years! It is hard to find any humans living on these islets these days. But the modern civilization brings tourists, plenty of them, from all over the world to these Wonders. The bay is full of ships and boats carrying tourists. There is even a mini form of floating market in these quest waters where some of the locals try to sell provisions for the tourists from their canoes.

In this uninhabited and remote part of Vietnam, I saw something which I least expected – a loud speaker to announce the Communist Party line of news and entertainment. There are Loud speakers along the streets of most of the towns to announce Communist vision of everything. It is a form of brainwashing people in this totalitarian country. Not even the Ha Long Bay could escape the tool of party propaganda.

Bridges

Vietnam is two and a half times smaller than NSW. But it has nearly forty rivers enriching the Indo China coast of the Gulf of Tonkin and South China Sea. So many rivers necessitates plenty of bridges. Most of the major bridges are constructed with international help. Australia also has made its contribution which is acknowledged on one of the bridges I passed through. I felt a good feeling seeing plaques with Australian flag on The Mỹ Thuận Bridge over Mekong River. When it was completed in 2000, it was the largest overseas project undertaken by Australia, costing us A\$91 million – a dollar for each citizen of Vietnam.

The stories associated with some other bridges are more humorous. Nguyen Van Troi Bridge in Saigon has a story to its name. Van Troi was an ordinary fisherman from the locality. One day he was trying to catch fish by dropping live electric wire in the river under a bridge.

It just happened that at this time an American official came walking over the bridge. Naturally his body guards were inspecting the area for the official's protection and detected this very dangerous practice by Nguyen Van Troi and arrested him. Making the best of the opportunity, the communist party made him make a confession that he was trying to sabotage the bridge and kill the American official. The lure of fame offered by the communist party was good enough motivation for this local fisherman who did not have a family of his own. He was executed for the crime. Later the Communist Party declared him as a martyr and named one of the bridges in Saigon in his name.

Churches

For the thirteen million or so Catholics in Vietnam they have 26 dioceses and numerous beautifully architectured churches. Only the good will and charity of the people could churches look so great. The last of the churches I visited in Vietnam was built by Pierre Nguyễn Hữu-Hào, a man of good fortune, who inherited the wealth by marrying his rich employer's daughter. Later he built a beautiful church in Saigon to thank God for his fortune. He was further blessed when his daughter became the prime wife of the last emperor of Vietnam, Bao Dai.

Churches in Vietnam have such stories of people's gratitude to tell. Nothing else adorns the house of God better than the hearts of gratitude and the charity that flows from such hearts.

YEAR OF FAITH

In his apostolic letter – Porta Fidei – (the gates of faith) written to launch the Year of Faith, Pope Benedict XVI writes about the need to rediscover the journey of faith. He calls on the whole Church especially Her pastors to seek friendship with Jesus Christ, who is the one who gives us the abundance of life. He reminds us to be light that cannot be hidden, as well as witnesses of faith who are not afraid.

The Year of Faith will run from 11th October 2012 to 24th November 2013 so that it coincides with the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council in 1962. To mark the occasion the Holy Father has called a General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops on the theme "The New Evangelization for the transmission of the Christian Faith".

This is a timely reminder that each of us is called to use this time of spiritual grace to proclaim the Gospel anew by living and professing our faith in our parishes, our homes, our families, our religious communities, our schools and even our workplaces. Pope Benedict is also calling all of us to make special occasions during this Year of Faith to make a public profession of the Creed.
