Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord - 24 March 2013

Passion Sunday

From your Pastor Last Tuesday, Pope Francis had his installation Mass. In his homily, the Holy Father stressed the duty of any Christian to protect one another, especially the poor and the needy. The duty to protect extends to the environment as well. The course of protecting the poor and the needy will involve self-sacrifice. Pope Francis has already shown through his choices as Archbishop of Buenos Aires how he makes his Christian ministry reflect self-sacrifice. Because of his self-sacrificing attitude the whole world applauded his homily.

We have only one life on earth. We need to make best of this one and only chance we have. Indulgence is not the answer to make the best of life. In the life of Jesus we discover the true identity of our human nature. The way to become more human is only by emptying ourselves in sacrificial love for others. This, of course, requires God's Grace. Without that it would be hard to make sense of the terrible things that happen in our pilgrim life.

Today we start the Holy Week. Today we start to reflect on the ultimate sacrificial love of God. Today we reflect on the saving journey of Jesus through the Way of the Cross. Jesus carried the Cross to save us from our fallen-ness, from our sins. He did not do anything to deserve punishment. Therefore a reflection on the Passion of Christ brings us into focus on the incredible love of God. The criminal on the right side of crucified Jesus summed it up in saying, "in our case we deserve it, but this man has done nothing wrong."

To follow Jesus in his call to sacrificial love, we need to strengthen ourselves. A disciplined life is what will help to strengthen our spirit and body for challenges to follow Christ in the sacrificial love. Make daily prayer, weekly Mass attendance, regular reading of spiritual literature (spiritual reading), acts of charity, regular examination of conscience, and the Sacrament of Penance, as part of your schedule. This will enable us to follow Jesus in his way of the Cross to the Glory of Resurrection. May Holy Week be of special encouragement and enlightenment for you.

Project Compassion Boxes

Holy Thursday Mass in the evening is very special, as we will be remembering and re-enacting things Jesus did at his Last Supper. One of the concerns of Jesus was the poor. Joining in this spirit, all parishioners are invited to bring your Project Compassion envelopes and boxes to take in offertory procession.

Chrism Mass

On Holy Thursday, all are invited to St Mary's Cathedral in the city for Chrism Mass at 10.30 AM. This Mass will be presided over by our Archbishop, George Cardinal Pell, and concelebrated by other bishops and priests of the Archdiocese. At this Mass, the archbishop will bless three Holy Oils. They are Oil of the Sick, Oil of Catechumen (Baptism), and Chrism. After the blessing each parish of the archdiocese will take a portion of it for use in the local community. This is another symbolic way of showing our link with the archbishop. The Oil of the Sick is used to anoint the sick when priest pray over them for healing. The Oil of Catechumen is used for the first anointing at baptism. This anointing is done for strengthening the person for the Christian commitment he/she is undertaking. Chrism is used to anoint the forehead after the baptism with water. This way a baptised person is christened. The same oil is used to anoint the priests at their ordination, to anoint candidates at Confirmation, and to smear over a newly consecrated Altar. All are invited to St Mary's Cathedral to join in the Mass of blessing of the Holy Oils.

The Real Forgiveness of Sins

Why are we Catholic? When asked why he converted from atheism to Christianity and joined the Catholic Church in particular, G.K. Chesterton answered, "To get rid of my sins".

He explained, "It is confirmed by the logic, which to many seems startling, by which the Church deduces that sin confessed and adequately repented, is actually abolished and the sinner does really begin again as if he had never sinned...he [the Catholic] believes that in that brief ritual, God has really re-made him in His own image". (Chesterton, Autobiography)

Christianity without the forgiveness of sins does not make any sense. Neither does a church without the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If our reason for being Catholic has little to do with God's forgiveness which we are always in need of receiving, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, it is perhaps a strong indication that we need to rediscover the Catholic faith.

Pope Francis, our new pope, shared a beautiful story with the whole world in his first Angelus. About twenty years ago he met a humble elderly lady who wanted him to hear her confession. He asked her whether she, a pious woman over 80 years of age, really had sins to confess. She replied, "We have all sinned". He then asked her how she could know with confidence that God really forgives sins. She replied, radiant with sanctity, "If the Lord did not forgive everything, the world would not exist".

Pope Francis concluded the Angelus with the following words:

Let us not forget this: God never wearies of forgiving us, never! ...the problem is that we grow weary...we tire of asking for forgiveness. He never tires of forgiving, but we, at times, we tire of asking forgiveness. Let us never tire, let us never tire! He is the loving Father, who always forgives, who has that heart of mercy for all of us. And we too learn to be merciful with everyone.

Rollen's story

When Rollen was in Year 10 of high school, she met Sister Maryanne, Director of Mercy Works Goroka/Mt Hagen (PNG) – a program of the Sisters of Mercy and supported by Mercy Works (Australia) and Caritas Australia, this group supports vulnerable people, particularly those aged 15 to 25 years.



Together they spoke about problems affecting PNG youth such as poverty, unemployment, HIV/AIDS, addiction, high child and maternal mortality rates, law and order issues, and low rates of children accessing education. They also discussed Rollen's life; how it had changed dramatically over the last few years, and what she wanted for the future.

Growing up in Kerenga, a small village in the Bena district, Eastern Highlands Province, Rollen always felt "useless and hopeless". Every day, she would look after the goats, care for the vegetable garden and do the housework, but she desperately wanted more. One day, while looking at her blistered hands, Rollen, then 17, decided she was going to start school.

The next day she did, and after completing Years 7 and 8, she then completed Year 9. The following CT.

Office of Misses ou Holly Hintes year, on World Environment Day, she volunteered to plant trees for Mercy Works. This was her first contact with the organisation. They taught her microfinance, so her family could earn an income and assisted her with further schooling and studies. After completing work experience, Rollen now 24, works in a hotel in Port Moresby.
