From your Pastor

Urgency

It is crunch time for the political party leaders in our country now. Election is only weeks away. The leaders need to be very careful in what they say and do these days. The words that come out of their mouth can cost them vote or gain more support. The people will be looking at the promises they make to see whether they are benefiting themselves and the country at large. In short how the parties and their leaders present themselves will determine whether they will be able to form a government or not in a few weeks' time. Therefore there is a sense of urgency in the air and the leaders are flying the length and breadth of the country without much rest.

If winning an election for such a short term would demand such an urgency, how much more urgent we should feel with things that will have impact on our lives for ever! We are only pilgrims on this earth. Our destination is the Kingdom of God. What we do and say will have a profound impact on our destiny. Therefore we are urged to feel the urgency in the Gospel of this Sunday. With the Federal election we know that we have time till seventh of September. But when it comes to our personal journey on earth we do not know when our time is up. Therefore it will not be wise to leave the important decisions about life for later.

Also as a society and community we should be feeling a sense of urgency to adhere to the values of the Kingdom of God. Our society's dominant character is individualism. Personal gratification is the norm for most of the promotions we see in the commercial world. This kind of individualism goes contrary to the very nature the human life itself. Jesus in all his teaching emphasised the need for reaching out to the less advantaged people than ourselves. He also emphasised the need for making self-sacrifices for the fulfilment of life.

This teaching of Jesus is validated by what we see in history. All the people that humanity revere are the people who made self-sacrifices for the good of the wider community. If we can understand these signs from history, we cannot be foolish enough to ignore the teaching of Christ.

Unless we, with a sense of urgency, address the issue of individualistic trend of the society the consequence could be more depressions, suicides, senseless attacks, and so on. In spite of the affluence of the society today, we see an increase in these kinds of behaviour. Therefore there is urgency for proper footing in life for the children these days. There is no better teaching you can think of than the values of the Kingdom of God. So never be tired of living out and promoting the values of the Kingdom.

Feasts of the Week 14 August – St Maximilian Mary Kolbe, priest, martyr. Memorial

Maximilian was born in 1894 in Poland and became a Franciscan. He contracted tuberculosis and, though he recovered, he remained frail all his life. Before his ordination as a priest, Maximilian founded the Immaculata Movement devoted to Our Lady. After receiving a doctorate in theology, he spread the Movement through a magazine entitled "The Knight of the Immaculata" and helped form a community of 800 men, the largest in the world.



Maximilian went to Japan where he built a comparable monastery and then

on to India where he furthered the Movement. In 1936 he returned home because of ill health. After the Nazi invasion in 1939, he was imprisoned and released for a time. But in 1941 he was arrested again and sent to the concentration camp at Auschwitz.

On July 31, 1941, in reprisal for one prisoner's escape, ten men were chosen to die. Father Kolbe offered himself in place of a young husband and father. And he was the last to die, enduring two weeks of starvation, thirst, and neglect. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1982.

15 August – The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Solemnity

Celebrated every year on August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay--a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a Holy Day of Obligation.

The Feast of the Assumption is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally by the sixth century. The feast was originally celebrated in the East, where it is known as the Feast of the Dormition, a word which means "the falling asleep." The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God." The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, and recounts the death,



laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Tradition variously places Mary's death at Jerusalem or at Ephesus, where John was living.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life is a defined dogma of the Catholic Church. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, exercising papal infallibility, declared in "Munificentissimus Deus" that it is a dogma of the Church "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." As a dogma, the Assumption is a required belief of all Catholics; anyone who publicly dissents from the dogma, Pope Pius declared, "has fallen away completely from the divine and Catholic Faith."
