New Temple

Jerusalem temple was built as the only temple on earth for God. Therefore for the Jews religiosity was centred on the Temple of Jerusalem. So naturally the people were very upset to hear Jesus saying that the temple will be destroyed totally. Just as Jesus told, the Roman emperor Vespasian and his son Titus as the king of Judea destroyed the temple in 70AD, killed thousands of people, and took many others as slaves to work in the mines of Egypt.

In foretelling the destruction of Jerusalem temple, Jesus was not just warning them of a disaster for the community. He was announcing the establishment of a new order. In the new order, temple will not be the centre of religious focus. Jesus, as Son of God will take the centrality of religion. As a continued presence in the world Jesus established Eucharist and asked his followers to do it in his memory. Thus the gathering of the faithful to do Mass became the real presence of Jesus after his sacrifice on the Cross and his Resurrection. Such gathering of the faithful to do Mass is called Church. Thus CHURCH has now taken the place of the temple of the Old Testament.

Church as the new temple is indestructible. It will survive all kinds of attacks. Yet the followers of Jesus need to expect persecution. Just as Jesus had to suffer on the Cross, his continuing presence in the world through CHURCH also will face persecutions. But Church, as the real presence of Christ will flourish from the blood of the martyrs.

Australian part of the Church may have only the pain of purifying herself from the sin and crying of child abuses, we hear stories of political and physical violence against Christians in many other parts of the world. Will any of these destroy Church? If we were to go by what God has shown through the history, the Church as the Body of Christ will prevail against all attacks including Islamic fundamentalists. Meanwhile we shall pray for courage for endurance and solidarity.

Letter from the Bishops of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Recently the Church received the call of Pope Francis to convene an Extraordinary Synod (meeting of Catholic bishops) in Rome, planned for 5-19 October 2014, on the topic of: *Pastoral challenges of the family in the context of evangelisation.*

We welcome this rare and important occasion, in which all the bishops of the Church have been asked to seek input by as many of the faithful as possible, on pastoral challenges facing the family. With this in mind, we, as bishops in New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory, invite you to take some time for prayer and reflection, and to share your responses to the questions put to us by His Holiness. You will find below a list of particular pastoral challenges, and you do not need to have a response to each one, nor feel the need to give a specific pastoral answer for every challenge that sits before us in these difficult times for the family. Your honesty and good will are invaluable at a moment such as this.

It is important to realise that the Extraordinary Synod, like the Second Vatican Council, will be a pastoral rather than a doctrinally-focused gathering. We hope that this will help the Catholic and wider community to respond to the real-life challenges faced by families. Therefore the Catholic moral teaching on basic issues such as sexuality, marriage and family will remain in place. For example, a recent article in the *Osservatore Romano* (23 October 2013) by Archbishop Gerhard Müller, Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, "on the indissolubility of marriage and the debate concerning the civilly remarried and the sacraments" clearly

sets out the Church's teaching and was published with the approval of Pope Francis.

The Church, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, seeks your contribution to a conversation the Holy Father has invited us to enter, and we hope for a wealth of thoughtful and prayerful responses as we work to maintain Gospel truths, strengthen family life, and reach out and help all people caught up in difficult situations.

The Holy Family offers us a unique model of family life. What is particular to Jesus, Mary and Joseph, is not that they were immune to life's concerns. On the contrary, persecution and hardship dogged them. Yet Jesus Christ lived in the heart of their home, and we see in both Our Lady and St Joseph, people who remained faithful to God's Word.

May the work of this Synod help inform each of us and the Church in Australia how to respond more effectively to the pastoral issues faced by families.

Feasts of the Week

21 November – The Presentation of Blessed Virgin Mary. Memorial.

Mary's presentation was celebrated in Jerusalem in the sixth century. A church was built there in honor of this mystery. The Eastern Church was more interested in the feast, but it does appear in the West in the 11th century. Although the feast at times disappeared from the calendar, in the 16th century it became a feast of the universal Church.

As with Mary's birth, we read of Mary's presentation in the temple only in apocryphal literature. In what is recognized as an unhistorical account, the *Protoevangelium of James* tells us that Anna and Joachim offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was three years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was still childless.

Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception (December 8) and of the birth of Mary



(September 8). It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.

It is sometimes difficult for modern Westerners to appreciate a feast like this. The Eastern Church, however, was quite open to this feast and even somewhat insistent about celebrating it. Even though the feast has no basis in history, it stresses an important truth about Mary: From the beginning of her life, she was dedicated to God. She herself became a greater temple than any made by hands. God came to dwell in her in a marvelous manner and sanctified her for her unique role in God's saving work. At the same time, the magnificence of Mary enriches her children. They, too, are temples of God and sanctified in order that they might enjoy and share in God's saving work.

22 November – St Cecilia, virgin, martyr. Memorial.



In the fourth century appeared a Greek religious romance on the Loves of Cecilia and Valerian, written, like those of Chrysanthus and Daria, Julian and Basilissa, in glorification of the virginal life, and with the purpose of taking the place of the sensual romances of Daphnis and Chloe, Chereas and Callirhoe, etc., which were then popular. There may have been a foundation of fact on which the story was built up; but the Roman Calendar of the fourth century, and the Carthaginian Calendar of the fifth make no mention of Cecilia.

It is said, however, that there was a church dedicated to S. Cecilia in Rome in the fifth century, in which Pope Symmachus held a council in 500. But Symmachus held no council in that year. That held at Easter, 502, was in the "basilica Julii"; that on September 1, 505, was held in the "basilica Sessoriana"; that on October 23, 501, was in "porticu beati Petri

apostoli que appelatur Palmaria." The next synod, November 6, 502, met in the church of St. Peter; that in 533, "ante confessionem beati Petri"; and that in 503 also in thebasilica of S. Peter. Consequently, till better evidence is produced, we must conclude that S. Cecilia was not known or venerated in Rome till about the time when Pope Gelasius (496) introduced her name into his Sacramentary. In 821, however, there was an old church fallen into decay with thededication to S. Cecilia; but Pope Paschal I dreamed that the body of the saint lay in the cemetery of S. Celestas, along with that of her husband Valerian. He accordingly looked for them and found them, or, at all events, some bodies, as was probable, in the catacombs, which he was pleased to regard as those of Cecilia nd Valerian. And he translated these relicsto the church of S. Cecilia, and founded a monastery in their honor.
