Holy Family

Gina Reinhart's dispute in her business world attracts particular media attention, because it is more than just a business story; it is a dispute between different family members. Families are important for the society. The relationship between

the parents and the children is of particular interest in a family. It is the parents who influence the personal development of the children. That is the natural order God has created for us human beings. When it came to God's own Son baby Jesus, it was no different. Today we celebrate a feast that reminds of the humility of God who shared the lowliness of human existence.

Just like any human child, baby Jesus also needed parental protection of Joseph and Mary to survive and grow. His life was threatened like millions of children around the world today. Like the agonising parents in every age, Mary and Joseph also agonised over the safety of baby Jesus. God did not spare such an agony even for his own only Son. When there was persecution in the land of birth, the Holy Family migrated to Egypt for safety and returned home after the terrorising ruler died. Truly the Word became flesh and dwelt among us in our lowliness.

Jesus human nature was very much shaped by Joseph and Mary as they lived in Nazareth as an ordinary family. In times of peace as well as atrocities, nothing should interrupt the business of family – growing up and formation of children.

Families used to be the place where people learned their occupation, received medical attention, received faith formation, and cared for in their old age. Now the society has become more complex. We have schools and universities to educate and equip people for various specialised occupation. We have religious education in the schools. There is a big industry running to look after the aged. In addition to these specialisations and compartmentalisation, the influence of social media and technologies are pulling families apart. Yet when it comes to the fundamental beliefs and formation of the persons, nothing can substitute families. Therefore it is important to work on being a family.

One of my main tasks is to emphasise the importance of families, and parish as a wider family, in the faith formation of children. In the case of sacramental preparations, the schools do the teaching of the religious truths. But it is in your family and in the parish where faith is imparted and nurtured.

Few families are perfect. Yet families today, big or small, in struggle or pain, are all places where love can still be shared. It is families that can primarily help us understand the formative value of pain and rejection, when that occurs from the rest of the world. If God choose to have a family for the full human realisation of his only Son, there is a good reason for us to root ourselves in families in our growth towards the divine.






1 January: Mary the Mother of God

Like the Churches of the East, Rome wished to honour the Virgin Mother of God during the days after Christmas. As a result the *Marian Feast* made its appearance on January 1 in the seventh century

On New Year's Day, the octave day of Christmas, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Holy Mother of God. The divine and virginal motherhood of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a singular salvific event: for Our Lady it was the foretaste and cause of her extraordinary glory; for us it is a source of grace and salvation because "through her we have received the Author of life"

January 2: Saints Basil the Great and Gregory Nazianzen: Doctors of the Church



On January 2, the Roman Catholic Church honors the memory of two friends from an area of what is now Turkey that was called Cappadocia. These men began their friendship while away at school and later became bishops who were the backbone of CatholicOrthodoxy during a period of doctrinal struggle and confusion. Gregory presided over the 2nd ecumenical council, held at Constantinople, whose great achievement was the completion of the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed that the Catholic Church recites each Sunday and the definition of the divinity of the Holy Spirit. These Cappadocian Fathers, both Doctors of the Church, proved to be some of the greatest and most influential teachers of all time, honored by both East and West, Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholic.
