From your Pastor

A New Order

We are continuing with the Sermon on the Mountain of Jesus. Once again the call is to enter into the spirit of the Law rather than following the letter of the Law. In the Old Testament it was said 'eye for an eye and tooth for tooth'. There is a context to this Law. Fights between tribes and villages were very common before. Matters were not taken lightly if someone from one village hurt someone from another village. The temper would flare so much that the offended village would go and burn down the whole village of the opponent or kill as many as possible of the offending group. This kind of revenge became such a problem that Hammurabi, in 18th century BC established a new legal system, which was much more compassionate. He said not to destroy ALL the property and personnel of the enemy camp. If your enemy takes out an eye or a tooth of yours, you knock off just one tooth or one eye off your enemy and nothing more. Therefore in the context of the Laws which were established they were meant to take away the attitude of revenge and look for justice. Hammurabi revolutionised the justice system in 18th century BC by proposing the law of retribution. Jesus revolutionised the law of justice drastically where even retribution does not have any place. The only principle to follow is that of love – love that involves forgiveness and compassion. Though not very common, we still can find courageous people following this demanding call of Jesus. The following story is one of them.

Last December Pope Francis invited Samundar Singh from India to the Vatican. Samundar was a hired hit man who brutally stabbed a Catholic nun, Rani Maria, in a crowded bus in North India and flung her on the roadside to bleed to death. It happened on 25 February 1995. All because she was a tireless missionary



from Kerala (South India) who organised the poor villagers in Madyapradesh (North India) and empowered them to fight for their rights. This enraged some landlords and they hired Samundar Singh to kill Rani Maria. He stabbed her 54 times! He was subsequently arrested and sentenced to death, which was later commuted to life term (12 years). While serving his prison term, Samunar's wife divorced him and his oldest son died. This devastated him and he was contemplating revenge on the landlord who hired him, when he gets

out of prison. But he had a visit from Sister Selmi Paul, who greeted him calling "My brother" and embraced him. Sister Selmi is the blood sister of murdered Rani Maria. In fact the whole family of Rani Maria forgave Samundar and even received him at their house in Kerala. These acts of forgiveness transformed the convicted criminal. He eventually became a Catholic and has turned a missionary himself.

This unimaginable courage of Rani Maria and her family to live out their faith and love even the enemy is what brings about beauty of life, human and divine. The life of Rani Maria and her family are good examples of the new order Jesus has established. What we should ask ourselves is 'do I have the real courage to live out my faith and love even my enemies?'

In October of 2012, our family lives were shattered due to the return of my Breast Cancer, after being in remission for 20 years.

Even though I wasn't a practising catholic, I still had my faith and that all changed once I heard of my news.

My faith became a lot stronger, my attendance and prayers in church became a lot stronger, my saints and visits to St Mary Mackillop all became a part of my life.

At the end of May my Professor had requested I have a CT Bone Scan from head to toe to see how the medication was working, as in October 2012 they had found a few cancer cells in my rib cage, but the

outcome was GREAT the cancer had gone.

Then came the most amazing journey in our life as I and my daughter received the okay to travel overseas, and within a week we had left Australia Behind. We had visited some amazing churches over the word, in which we prayed in, and also had the opportunity to attend a Mass in Paris.

Lourdes was also an amazing experience for me; it was unexplainable tears of anxiousness and emotion. A Joy a shiver all over, attending the Mass and communion, the drinking of the holy water; the three days we were there I was very overwhelmed in being able to have had this experience.

Then In St Peter's Basilica in Rome I had this unbelievable experience, there was a section of the church where it was closed off by heavy black curtains, and there was a security guard asking the reason why you wanted to enter this section. I gave him my reason and entered.

When I entered into that section it was breath taking, it just left me memorised, I knelt and began praying, and after some time of praying I focused and prayed concerning my health. I asked for help with my cancer cells in my lungs and also with the rest of my health. As I finished praying for this I actually coughed a few times which was out of the ordinary, and I felt like that was a release of my illness, and it gave me Goosebumps all over my body.

On the 24.07.2013, the day after our return from Europe I had a CT lung scan booked to check on the prognosis of the cancer cells in my lungs, but I wasn't scared.

When I received my results we went up to see the Professor and I was still rather calm, when the Professor read the results he was very surprised as he couldn't believe his eyes, and Bianca was also amazed as the cancer cells were no longer there, my daughter Bianca was in tears and had to ask the Professor again to make sure he was right. I strongly believe that this had to do with the beautiful experience I had at St Peters Basilica in Rome.

I just wanted to share with everyone that our faith is the most amazing belief one could have in our daily life, regardless of which path we have been given in life, and with whatever challenges come our way.

I am so happy to have returned to the Lords house, and especially in receiving communion.

Ember days - Prayer & Penance

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has decided that the Australian Church should observe the first Fridays in Autumn & Spring (March & September) each year as special days of prayer & penance.

Ember Days might also be linked with Rogation Days (from the Latin *rogare,* to ask) which were eventually associated with intercession for a fruitful harvest. The choice of Fridays reminds us that they are days of penance, the Australian bishops conference recommends penitential practices such as prayer, self denial & helping others of Fridays. (CCL1249-12530)

On rogation & ember days the practice of the Church is to offer prayers to the Lord for the needs of all people, especially for the productivity of the earth and for human labour, and to give him public thanks. (GNLYC 45)

Ember days seek God's blessing of favourable weather & a fruitful harvest from the land, interceding in times of drought or flood & giving thanks in better times.

There is a strong impulse on these days towards the justice of God's kingdom, with attention given to those peoples who are devastated by famine & exploitation.

Ember days rightly focus on the environment, climate change, & our stewardship of the world's resources. Doing penance reminds us that sustainable use of our resources will cost us in our attitudes & lifestyle.




