From your Pastor

Our Human Dignity Is Not For Sale

Our hearts go up in prayer to God, for the people affected by a two year long drought in our own state and Queensland. One of the parishioners and some other friends of mine have passionately asked for the parish to pray for the farmers and for rain. Our Prime Minister has offered financial assistance to the affected farmers. But ultimately help will have to come from God. So the best thing we can do is to pray for them.

As good Christians we care about others. We are concerned about others.

As insecure human beings we worry about ourselves and our tomorrow. We fail to realise that our real security is not made up of insurance premiums and healthy bank balances. The twists and turns that make up each of our lives are mostly not predicted. Most of it must have surprises in it. Our plans and precautions can only assist to some extent. The ultimate key to life is beyond us. It is with God, and God alone. But if we define ourselves with what we have rather than what we are, any collapse of material comfort can destroy life and hope.

"Earning and spending are among the greatest pleasures given to man in the world, and it is difficult to say which one gives greater pleasure" (from the journal of a Florentine Banker, 1473). When we cannot make enough to spend we worry. The tendency is to equate status to salary. Therefore we work for salary.

Living in such a world, what can we do to keep the God given human dignity so that we will not be slaves to money. In 1981 late Pope John Paul II wrote an encyclical 'On Human Work' (Laborem Exercens). In it he argued for the subordination of work to man; the primacy of the worker over the instruments and conditioning that historically constitute the world of labour; the rights of the human person as the determining factor of all socio-economic, technological and productive processes, that must be recognized; and some elements that can help all people identify with Christ through their own work.

While we see shopping Malls taking the place of Cathedrals, let us take care that our human dignity is not for sale and our God is not a commodity. Let us find time to sit back and realise that our life means more than what we have and our undivided loyalty is to the giver of life.

Ash Wednesday

This week we start our Lent in preparation for Easter. Lent formally commences with Ash Wednesday observations. It is day to abstain from eating meat and fasting. The only other day we are obliged to fast and abstain from meat is Good Friday. The Mass schedule for Ash Wednesday is as follows

This week we introduce **Kath and Charles Kensey**.

Kath and Charles Kensey moved from Lakemba to the outback i.e. 67 Wyatt Ave Regents Park On 2 May, 1946. In those days Milk, bread and ice were delivered by horse and cart and a train line crossed Amy St. They had four children, 16 grand children and 8 great Grand Children. Their four children all attended St Peter Chanel Primary school.



Charlie was an Acolyte and part of original Direct Giving scheme for the Church and Kath was a special Minister a member of the Legion of Mary and a Justice of the Peace. Charlie made the candelabra and a number of other ornaments in the sanctuary here in our church today.

They both helped start up the Berala Credit Union in the 1950s. This was a community based Credit Union whose aim was to help residents and parishioners in this, the Berala / Regents Park community. Politics was much to the fore in those days and Charlie was a life member of the Labor party only one Sunday to attend Mass to hear our Parish Priest, Fr Donovan, extolling the virtues of the Liberal Party.

They both for many years ran Gadabout tours whereby they took friends and parishioners on tours to the USA, New Zealand and many parts of our own beautiful Australia. They did all the organisation of the tours, working out itineraries, collecting the money. One day after organising everyone else and their luggage onto a bus to the International Airport, on arrival at the airport, discovered that they had left their own luggage at home. They started Probus in Regents Park and were chairman and tour organiser for many years.

Charles died in 2011 aged 89, he and Kath were married for 68 years

Ember days - Prayer & Penance

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has decided that the Australian Church should observe the first Fridays in Autumn & Spring (March & September) each year as special days of prayer & penance.

Ember Days might also be linked with Rogation Days (from the Latin *rogare,* to ask) which were eventually associated with intercession for a fruitful harvest. The choice of Fridays reminds us that they are days of penance, the Australian bishops conference recommends penitential practices such as prayer, self denial & helping others of Fridays. (CCL1249-12530)

On rogation & ember days the practice of the Church is to offer prayers to the Lord for the needs of all people, especially for the productivity of the earth and for human labour, and to give him public thanks. (GNLYC 45)

Ember days seek God's blessing of favourable weather & a fruitful harvest from the land, interceding in times of drought or flood & giving thanks in better times.

There is a strong impulse on these days towards the justice of God's kingdom, with attention given to those peoples who are devastated by famine & exploitation.

Ember days rightly focus on the environment, climate change, & our stewardship of the world's resources. Doing penance reminds us that sustainable use of our resources will cost us in our attitudes & lifestyle.

LENTEN PENANCE

The Church's Canon Law reaffirms our obligation to do penance. The special times of penance are all Fridays throughout the year and the season of Lent. We recall that St. John the Baptist prepared for the coming of the Lord by "preaching a baptism of repentance". Christ began his ministry on earth with the exhortation to repent: "Repent and believe the Gospel" Mk 1:15.

Repentance means the rejection of sin. It implies conversion to, and reconciliation with God. Penance is the concrete expression of repentance. It takes the forms of prayer, self-denial, and works of charity. Each of these identifies us more closely with our Saviour. By penance we make satisfaction for our sins, and take real steps in the renewal of our lives. Penance is the proof of our repentance. Repentance and conversion are central, on-going features of Christian living. Penance has to be a constant, even daily, practice in our lives. In nominating special times of penance, the Church encourages and promotes in all of us the *habit* of penance.

Furthermore, observance of these special times by all Catholics throughout the universal Church emphasises what we call "the social dimension of sin". The sin of the individual member always in some measure infects the whole body. Therefore during Lent and on the Fridays of the year, we do penance, not only on our own account, but also in the name of the Church and of the world. We must take very seriously our penitential obligations and be sure to carry them out. The Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference has not restricted our penance to fast and abstinence in all cases, it has left room for our own responsible choice. Where we make the choice, we should carefully select the form of penance that we consider most appropriate for our own circumstances and growth in the Christian life.

DAYS OF PENANCE

- 1. Rules for Lent follow in (a), (b), and (c).
- 2. Abstinence from meat, and fasting, are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On all other Fridays of the year the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing <u>any one</u> of the following:
 - (a) prayer for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the rosary.
 - (b) self-denial for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country.
 - (c) helping others for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened.

All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain.

LENT LASTS FROM ASH WEDNESDAY (5TH MARCH) TO THE MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER EXCLUSIVE (17TH APRIL). ON GOOD FRIDAY AND, IF POSSIBLE, ALSO ON HOLY SATURDAY UNTIL THE EASTER VIGIL, THE EASTER FAST IS OBSERVED.

PASCHAL PRECEPT

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday, 5th March, and Trinity Sunday, 15th June, 2014 unless for a good reason it is done at another time during the year. All the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.
