From your Pastor

Jesus was Unlike Adam

We have started our preparation for Easter with a period of fasting, charity and penance. The Ash ceremony last Wednesday marked the formal commencement of Lenten preparation. During this Lent two out of a number of Catechumens are especially excited that they are being enrolled for admission into the Catholic Church. They are Kelli Rigney and Ching Ching Tam (Suzie). This Sunday they will be formally enrolled into Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults at St Mary's Cathedral with Bishop Brady (in the absence of the Cardinal). The Cathedral will be packed with hundreds of catechumens and their relatives and guests. Yes, it is an exciting time. To add to the excitement, we have 'The Catholic Guy Mission Event' happening in the middle of Lent. As we have started our preparation towards Easter, Gospel of today invites us to reflect on what Jesus did at the beginning of his mission of Preaching the Kingdom of God.

Jesus had a Retreat in the desert. During that time of fasting and prayer, Jesus was tempted by the evil spirit. The Temptation of Jesus and his response to them, as it is proclaimed in Matthew's Gospel is to be reflected on with the passage we read from the Book of Genesis. The First Reading speaks of Adam, the first Man who was placed in a paradise by God. He did not lack anything. But he succumbed to the temptation to become like God. His folly brought him a terrible fall from grace.

Adam is typical of ordinary human being. We should only humbly acknowledge our place in God's world and count God's blessings. But there is always a temptation in the human mind to play God. The more we try to play God, the more misery we bring to our human world. Jesus' retreat in the wilderness is an answer to Adam's fall.

Temptations are always an illusion of maturity. You have fallen into its trap the first time you played dirty tricks to get favours, or the first time you cheated on your dear one. Misguided or unwise curiosity, rather than evil intentions cause the first fall. But as soon as you realise your fallen-ness, take courage and strength from the Holy Spirit and turn back to God, before it becomes a sinful practice.

'Turn the stones to bread' was the first temptation. Jesus replied to the tempter, "Man does not live by bread alone". In a world driven by consumerism, to think of food, fast cars, and fashion clothing as secondary could be challenging. Yet controlling the temptation to indulge in consumerism will be a good feeling of freedom.

Jesus was tempted to jump from the temple top. We as humans are tempted to test God's power through acts of piety and devotion. Instead what is needed is a conversion of heart and a genuine God centred life. Jesus also warded off the temptation of power and authority when he said, "it is also written that you shall worship God alone". It contrasts with the human tendency to run after power and glory. When you do not get it, frustration sets in.

If Adam coveted Glory and ended up in misery, Jesus Christ embraced discipline and self-sacrifice which brought freedom from death and destruction.

Let us make this Lent a time of self-discipline to win Godly life.

This week we introduce Fatima Bolonia.

My story is not one of tragedy but one of faith and hope. In February 2012 I was diagnosed with colon cancer. The doctors were optimistic that it was contained within an area that could be operated and removed. And so in April, the doctors removed 75% of my intestines, confident that they had taken all traces of the golf ball size tumors growing inside my stomach. I spent my 63rd birthday in the wards of Canterbury Hospital with my beautiful granddaughters and family singing to me with party hats on. Soon after, I was sent home armed with a lot of information and plenty of hope that the invisible nasties left in my body would be successfully fought by chemotherapy. Starting in June, the next 6 months were to become a blur of hospital visits – the cancer unit at Westmead Hospital became my second home, friends were made, and sometimes sadly lost, all the while being watched over by a team of wonderful nurses and doctors. And then came my biggest test...

At 3am on the 8th of October, 4 months into my chemotherapy, my body shut down – I had a massive aneurysm that had ruptured at the base of my brain. What followed were events that I have only been told about, memories pieced together by family – a stalled



ambulance outside our home, where they had lost me but were able to revive me, a somber conversation with the neurosurgeon in Emergency who had to deliver the news that I might not survive the operation or the days following it, a long and anxious wait for my family and loved ones in the waiting room of the ICU for me to come out of surgery... By God's miraculous and healing hand, I did survive – I survived the operation and all its many and endless complications, I survived 2 ½ weeks in the ICU and another 4 in a rehabilitation hospital, I recovered from a paralysed left side of the body, I re-learnt how to talk, how to eat and how to walk. I survived – and was victorious. In my faithfulness to God (I had a rosary under my pillow from the moment I could communicate by blinking my eyes), God was faithful to me. God was working to completely restore my body and by December I was home to spend Christmas with my family.

Never once have I doubted God's love for me or his plan for my life. And so when I was told in October last year that they had suspected cancer cells near my kidney – a left over from the chemotherapy that had been interrupted – I again offered my body and my illness up to God. Although slightly disappointed, I didn't question why I had to cancel our long awaited trip back to the Philippines. But God later revealed why – if I had gone, I would have been there when Typhoon Haiyan struck but even more miraculously I would not have discovered two further lumps on my brain. With a piece of titanium in my skull where they had operated to remove one of the lumps, I can now say I am as tough as nails! I have recommenced chemotherapy but I am remaining positive and strong – with God by my side, how can I not be?

I know I have not travelled this journey on my own so I am thankful to you all for your prayers and love. They have performed more miracles than you can ever know. The road ahead of me is still long but whatever it may bring, I know that my story will never be one of tragedy – it will always be one of faith and hope. After all, no life is more secure than a life surrendered to God.

Project Compassion

Maristely's story

Maristely, 18, lives in a favela (slum) in São Paulo, Brazil with her family.

Dark and cramped, favelas are groups of irregular, self-constructed houses often built on land that no one wants to live on due to threats of floods, landslides, or their proximity to roads and train lines. Many locals face daily discrimination from the wider community.

When Maristely was growing up, her family's house, like many others, was made of cardboard and had no electricity, water or connected sewerage.

Caritas Australia's partner, the Movement for the Defence of Favela Residents (MDF), is changing lives across 40 favelas in São Paulo. MDF understands the difficulties of favela life such as dense population, limited space, a lack of available jobs, constant threat of eviction and widespread poverty.

Through MDF, Maristely's family, along with thousands of others, now has access to clean water, electricity and connected sewerage. They also have a certificate of home ownership which provides greater security and means they can no longer be evicted.

Across the favelas, up to 70 percent of families experience violence in the home, and there is a dominant gang culture. This culture of violence is closely linked to a lack of self-esteem. MDF attendees participate in sessions which address their identity, favela history, and issues around drugs, gangs, violence and unemployment.

The program promotes peace so young people can attain education and employment, rather than joining local gangs.

"Being a part of MDF has given me awareness of my dignity ... I know that to live in a favela is nothing to be ashamed of ... Because of my perseverance, I live in a better place and we are recognised for that,' said Maristely.


