### Ezekiel, Lazarus, and New Life

The Catholic Guy, Bruce Downes told a few stories of new life in the recent Parish Mission Event. They were stories of hopelessness at first which turned to be good news and a new beginning in life. But there are other stories which are more tragic, more hopeless. The disappearance of MH370 is one such case where we feel helpless. Our hearts and prayers go out to the grieving relatives and friends of the people who disappeared. Today's first reading is about a man with such an experience.

Ezekiel was of a Jewish priestly family and was deported to Babylon about 600 years before Christ. He married "the desire of his eyes" (Ez24:16). One of the saddest notes of his life was the death of his wife. Every day he received the revelation from God, yet his wife died in the hands of the armies who invaded Jerusalem. Ezekiel's grief for the death of his wife was to match the grief of God over his beloved people. Therefore God asked him not to grieve over his wife. He was to brace himself to face the tragedy that was to come upon Jerusalem as a consequence of its sins. Jerusalem was overrun by Babylonian invaders and the Israelites were taken to captivity into foreign land. They were feeling hopeless in the face of it all. In such a situation, God's promise of new life was revealed through Ezekiel. That is what we hear in the First reading of the Mass today. The prophet spoke in symbolic language. "I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people. And I shall put my spirit in you, and you will live" (Ez37:13). While it generated a hope for a new life by settling back in Israel, the primary message was that of new life that is received through the forgiveness of sin. The ultimate price of sin is death and the best of hope should be the victory over death. What Ezekiel revealed to the deported Israelites in Babylon was also a prophecy of the salvation plan to be realised in Jesus.

Jesus, as true God, has power over death and life. In today's Gospel we see Jesus raising Lazarus to life. The gospel says, he stayed two more days in the place where he was, when he heard that his friend Lazarus was dying. Then when he comes to Bethany, his friends Mary and Martha were grieving over the death of their brother Lazarus. Mary seemed to indicate that Jesus was insensitive to the pain of his friends when she said, "Lord if you had been here, my brother would not have died." People also echoed similar sentiments when they said, "he opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?" Isn't it typical of our human nature to blame God for his lack of response when times are hard and painful? In this situation the sisters and the people gathered there seemed to be more in the dark than Lazarus who was buried in a tomb. Therefore John the evangelist sees the resuscitation of Lazarus as a sign to the people at large. It is a sign that Jesus, as God, is the Lord of Life and Death. Jesus is the resurrection and life. Through raising Lazarus from the dead, Jesus gave hope and a new life to Martha, Mary and other people in Bethany who were in darkness and despair. By professing this Gospel, we too are to believe in Jesus as the resurrection and life. *Cont.....*

### **Project Compassion**

### Lorraine's story

Pintupi woman, Lorraine, grew up in Papunya, 300km west of Alice Springs in the Northern Territory. Six years ago, after being diagnosed with kidney failure, Lorraine, 39, learnt that she had to undergo a lifetime of weekly dialysis treatment.

Deeply connected to culture, her mob and their dreaming, she is now living in a hostel in Alice Springs to receive treatment and desperately misses home. "I have to sleep indoors all the time. Someone cooks our food and cleans our rooms. I have no family here. I stick to myself. I am homesick."

To keep her spirit alive, Lorraine visits The Purple House which was established in 2004 by Western Desert Nganampa Walytja Palyantjaku Tjutaku Aboriginal Corporation to support First Australian patients who have been dislocated from country and culture.

Caritas Australia is supporting a new income-generating social enterprise at the Centre – making and selling bush balms.

"My favourite balm is Irremenke Irremenke. It is a good bush medicine that our grandmothers used to make. It is good for pain and headaches. It is a cheeky plant, it is hard to find and hard to grow. I love the smell of the bush balm mix boiling up. It reminds me of home," said Lorraine.

This bush balm program offers people aged 23-75 who are chronically

unwell, a sense of purpose, comfort and wellbeing. It gives them the opportunity to pass on traditional knowledge and values, ensuring participants retain their connections with home.

Until the doctors say that Lorraine is palya (good) and she is able to receive local treatment, The Purple House and the bush balm program is her home away from home.
