

From your Pastor

## **Passion Sunday**

Today we process into the church waving blessed palms celebrating the solemn entry of Jesus through the Golden Gate into the holy city of Jerusalem. But it is followed by the long reading of the passion of the Lord, which is the central piece of today's liturgy. It is the story of Jesus sacrificing his life for the sins of humanity.

People often think of sin as personal matter between God and himself without any relevance to others. It may be seen as breaking God's arbitrary laws. But any sin has implications to the whole society. Sin is always the result of self-centred approach. It may manifest in the form of betrayal of others like Judas did, denial like Peter did, or distancing oneself, like Pilate, from the responsibility to be just and fair to others. Only a life of love willing to be spent for others without fear and selfishness is the remedy for the sin of humanity. Jesus showed it through his life. He did not shy away from the mob lead by Judas Iscariot, one of his own disciples, who came to capture him. He did not hesitate to speak the truth in front of the mighty Roman Governor Pilate. The brutalizing Roman soldiers did not deter him from his loving sacrifice.

Yes it is our sinfulness that caused the suffering and death of Jesus. One may argue that it was all predetermined by God. Therefore we cannot say that people like Judas Iscariot, Pilate, the Roman soldiers, Jewish leaders or us can be held responsible for the cross of Jesus. While God knows everything, he has not predetermined the destiny of anyone. All these characters in the Scripture and all of us have the freedom to choose otherwise. That is why we are responsible for our sins. We are responsible not only for the things we have done wrong, but also for the good we did not do. Otherwise Pilate would not have been guilty.

The Holy Week is a special time to turn back our hearts to God. It is a time to shift from self-centredness to God centeredness. It requires humility. It requires the attitude of Jesus who chose a donkey to a war horse to enter the city of Jerusalem. From our part we should seek the mercy of God to realise the fullness of our God-given life.

If we have love for God, we will be seeking the presence of God in our life always. Prayer basically is our presence to God's presence. If we have failed to be present to God, or God's people through the lack of justice, compassion, benevolence we need to seek God's forgiveness.

This week on Wednesday we shall observe Mercy Night at St Peter Chanel Church and use the opportunity to confess our sins. Through this sacrament we can prepare to celebrate the feast of Easter more meaningfully and fruitfully.

## **Project Compassion**

### Nirangini's story

Nirangini, 31, remembers her childhood fondly, growing up in a family of nine siblings during peacetime in Veravil, a small fishing village in Sri Lanka.

From 1983 to 2009 a civil war affected Sri Lanka. When the conflict impacted Veravil, the entire community was forced to leave. Nirangini, her 67-year-old mother and her son who was seven-years-old at the time were constantly on the move with no permanent home.

During those years, poverty and the trauma of constantly being on the move took a toll. There was little food or water and Nirangini's son became undernourished.

In December 2009, in the hope that a familiar environment would offer a safe setting for her son, Nirangini and her family moved back to her childhood village. In Veravil, a Caritas Sri Lanka program, supported by Caritas Australia, was assisting families to resettle.

In March 2012, the Caritas program supported Nirangini to build her own permanent home.

"We had survived a war and just managed to return to our home with virtually nothing. Now with the support of Caritas my family lives in a proper house. I am so relieved. The state of uncertainty we were living in is now over."

Thanks to a livelihood grant, Nirangini was able to start a home garden and small poultry business. These give her a good income and provide her family with nutritious food.

A permanent home and an income source are also beneficial as it means her son can attend the village

school and gain a good education.

"We are very thankful ... We now have the confidence to stand on our feet and look after ourselves."
