The Road to Emmaus

3rd Sunday of

Easter- Yr A,

4 May 2014

There are a number of people around us who are disillusioned about Church. But none of it could be as bad as that of Cleopas and his friend who were walking away from Jerusalem to Emmaus. These two people from Luke's Gospel were people of knowledge and hope. They had studied Scripture. They had expectations about Jesus as the expected Messiah. But the life of Jesus did not live up to their expectation. The terrible death of Jesus on the cross made them disillusioned. Though some women spoke of the empty tomb where Jesus was buried, it did not mean anything to them. Therefore they decided to distance themselves from all these story and happenings in Jerusalem. They are happy to retire to their own world and their own home in the village of Emmaus. It was like the lapsed Christians walking away from the church because they feel disappointed with the apparent failure of the church. The Church leaders may not have lived up to their expectation. Therefore they walk away from it. Many of such disillusioned people are well informed and learned. But they fail to see any point in hanging around the Church like the two men who did not find any reason to hang around Jerusalem. Cleopas and his friend were serious about their religious aspiration that they were discussing the Scripture on their way. But the Scripture did not make much sense to them, until Resurrected Christ explained it to them. Even then they did not have revelation of faith and fruits of it. They were still walking into darkness and night.

These two men do not have the profile of Peter, James, Thomas or any one of the eleven gather in the closed room. They were just ordinary people like you and me. Therefore the message of the Gospel can be seen as particularly relevant to you and me. When I was in Israel I tried to visit Emmaus, the place of one of my favourite Gospel passages. Soon I realised, there are a number of Emmaus around Jerusalem, it is difficult to say which one is referred to in the Gospel story. Then again it occurred to me that the lack of profile of the Biblical Emmaus is another indication that this whole passage is about ordinary people and their experience.

It is interesting to note that it is not the explanation of Jesus about Scripture but the hospitality offered by Cleopas and his friend which lead them back to faith. Jesus goes into their home accepting their invitation, and Breaks Bread with them. In other words Jesus celebrates Eucharist with them. At the Eucharist, they had the physical experience of Jesus through blessed bread. That awakened their spiritual understanding and faith.

We do not have the first-hand experience of seeing the nail marks or touching the side of Jesus like the Apostles. Our physical encounter with the risen Christ is when we eat the Blessed Bread in the Mass. Our participation in the celebration of Mass makes us part of the Church. Our hearts may burn with zeal listening to good commentaries on the Bible, like that of the men walking to Emmaus. But after all the Bible study we need to wait for our participation in Eucharist to actually meet Jesus physically. Once we have truly encountered Jesus, we will be passionate about Him like the two men. Then we too will be wanting to tell about this experience to everyone. We will walk back to the centre of action. The two men walked back to Jerusalem. It was like the lapsed Catholics walking back to Church.


