From your Pastor

Be filled with Holy Spirit

On Wednesday 28 May, 30 young people will be Confirmed and Anointed with Chrism by Bishop Terry Brady at St Peter Chanel Church. That means these 30 young people will be completing their initiation in the Body of Christ which was started at their baptism. The tradition of bishop laying hands on the baptised people invoking Holy Spirit is a tradition from the Apostolic times. In the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 8:14-17) we read, "When the Apostles heard that Samaria had accepted the Word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then Peter and John laid hands on them, and they received Holy Spirit." This is from today's first reading.

What happens when the baptised people are filled with Holy Spirit through the Laying of Hands by the bishop, that means Confirmed? We read in the Acts of the Apostles what happened in the early church when the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit. They got courage to preach the Good News of Christ's resurrection even in the face of adversities. Their preaching was so powerful that miracles were happening in the early communities. Such miracles are still happening. One such story I can share from my own life.

Palar parish in India where I became the parish priest for the first time had a lot of challenges. I was their first Parish Priest, I had to build up the parish in respects. The people were very hard working but financially poor. But they were not the hardest pastoral challenges I had. Majority of the people were cultivating cannabis as cash crop. Also the whole village was into illicit liquor distilling. A combination of these two had so many social and psychological issues that one would wonder what could be a pastoral response. The best thing I could do was to pray for them, which I did earnestly. Soon some people asked for group prayers at their homes with other neighbours and within two years of prayer the whole parish started to change. Most people took on other ways of making money than with cannabis and illicit distilleries, they were closed down voluntarily. The face of the parish changed in two years. I see that as a miracle.

We too can work miracles these days if we, as people filled with Holy Spirit through Confirmation, take up our baptismal call to various ministries seriously. We need to be more than passive attendees of the Holy Mass. Every parishioner should think seriously how their God given talents and time could be utilised in the ministry and mission of the Church. To assist the parishioners to participate in the mission of the Church more confidently, I will be organising a number of study programs in the parish from the middle of the year. The meeting room attached to the Jubilee Hall will be a convenient venue for these programs. As people who are filled with Holy Spirit let us all be partakers of the Mission of the Church. In gratitude to God, let us use our God given gifts of time and talent to find its way into the mission and ministry of the parish.


Feasts of the Week

26 May - St Philip Neri, priest. Memorial.

Philip Neri was a sign of contradiction, combining popularity with piety against the background of a corrupt Rome and a disinterested clergy, the whole post-Renaissance malaise.

At an early age, he abandoned the chance to become a businessman, moved to Rome from Florence and devoted his life and individuality to God. After three years of philosophy and theology studies, he gave up any thought of ordination. The next 13 years were spent in a vocation unusual at the time—that of a layperson actively engaged in prayer and the apostolate.

As the Council of Trent (1545-63) was reforming the Church on a doctrinal level, Philip's appealing personality was winning him friends from all levels



At the urging of his confessor, he was ordained a priest and soon became an outstanding confessor, gifted with the knack of piercing the pretenses and illusions of others, though always in a charitable manner and often with a joke. He arranged talks, discussions and prayers for his penitents in a room above the church. He sometimes led "excursions" to other churches, often with music and a picnic on the way.

Some of his followers became priests and lived together in community. This was the beginning of the Oratory, the religious institute he founded. A feature of their life was a daily afternoon service of four informal talks, with vernacular hymns and prayers. Giovanni Palestrina was one of Philip's followers, and composed music for the services.

The Oratory was finally approved after suffering through a period of accusations of being an assembly of heretics, where laypersons preached and sang vernacular hymns! Cont.....

(Cardinal Newman founded the first English-speaking house of the Oratory three centuries later.)

Philip's advice was sought by many of the prominent figures of his day. He is one of the influential figures of the Counter-Reformation, mainly for converting to personal holiness many of the influential people within the Church itself. His characteristic virtues were humility and gaiety.

31 May - Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Feast.

The feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the visit of the Mother of God, with the child Jesus in her womb, to her cousin Elizabeth, who was herself six months' pregnant with the forerunner of Christ, Saint John the Baptist. At the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel, in response to Mary's question "How shall this be done, because I know not man?" (Luke 1:34), had told her that "thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age; and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren: Because no word shall be impossible with God" (Luke 1:36-27). The evidence of Elizabeth's own near-miraculous conception had called forth Mary's *fiat*: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to thy word." It is thus appropriate that the very next action that Saint Luke the Evangelist records is the Blessed Virgin "making haste" to visit her cousin.
